Rabbinic Reflection



This month, as we sit around our Seder tables, we will read the story of Pesach from the Hagaddah. This relatively short book holds a profound understanding of the Jewish experience. On the one hand, we read from the Hagaddah about our experience in slavery, stating:

"עֲבָדִים הָיִינוּ לְפָרֹעַ בְּמִצְרַיִם"

"We were slaves to Pharaoh in Egypt,"
and we also recite,

"בְּכָל-דּוֹר וְדּוֹר חַיֵּב אָדָם לִרְאוֹת אֶת-עַצְמוֹ,

"כֹּאֵלוּ הוּא יָצָא מִמִּצְרַיִם"

"In every generation, every person
should themselves as if s/he came out of Egypt."
On the other hand we read:

"כָּל דָּכְפִין יִתִּי וְיָכּוֹל",

"May all who are hungry come and eat,"
just before we read,

"כָּל דָּצִיף יִתִּי וְיִפְסָח",

"May all who are needy
come and celebrate this Passover festival."

These two sets of phrases seem to be in conflict with each other. One set urges us to think like one who is in bondage, while the other urges us to think like someone who can provide for those in need. What a contrast! We are commanded to see ourselves as both the oppressed who are in need and the liberated who are able to help--and all during the same pre-dinner rituals. Throughout the millennia of our existence, we Jews have been both, the needy and the provider.

This Pesach, as we gather around our Seder tables and enjoy our freedom and our collective blessings, let us not forget that we were once the oppressed, the ones without blessings. In today's world, we must be the ones to fight for those who are still enslaved, for those who are still refugees.

We were once strangers in another's land. Therefore we are commanded, no less than 36 times, to be kind to the stranger. Martin Luther King, Jr. once said to a group of rabbis, "All too often I have seen religious leaders stand amid the social injustices that pervade our society, mouthing pious irrelevancies and sanctimonious trivialities. All too often the religious community has been a taillight instead of a headlight." Just as we are told in the book of Isaiah, may we be a light unto the nations this Pesach.

Cantorial Comments



*My beloved spoke, and said
unto me:*

*Rise up my love, my fair one,
and come away*

*For lo, the winter is past –
the rain is over and gone.*

Shir ha Shirim 2:10-12

Happy New Year! No, this is not an April Fool's Joke. But we *are* in the new Hebrew month of *Nisan* [which began at the end of March] and it is the very first month in the sequence of the Jewish calendar. *Nisan* signals the coming of spring and of course, the beautiful Festival of Passover, at which time we also read from *Shir ha Shirim* - the Song of Songs. Added to this month of joy is the opportunity to celebrate the wonderful Congregation Emanu El tradition of members re-consecrating their wedding vows. The month of *Nisan* concludes with the solemn observance of *Yom Hashoah*, which must continue as a beacon for all time - not only of sacred remembrance but also as a warning not to be silent in the midst of hate, suppression and inequality.

Passover is one of the three pilgrimage [*Shalosh Regalim*] or agricultural festivals along with Shavuot and Sukkot, when the ancient Israelites living in the Kingdom of Judah would make a pilgrimage to the Temple in Jerusalem as commanded by the Torah. It was there that they participated in festivities and ritual worship in conjunction with the *kohanim* [priests] at the Temple. After the destruction of the Temple those days were no longer celebrated as a pilgrimage unless they lived near Jerusalem. They remain today as major observances in connection with our biblical and theological history. Special nusach, liturgy and cantillation of the scrolls are reserved for these days. They are also the three official times of the year, in addition to Yom Kippur, when *Yizkor* [memorial services] is observed. While we keep our loved ones in our hearts on a constant, daily basis, these communal times of mourning provide additional comfort and support as we journey throughout the year.

Presidential Perspectives



Since the revelation on February 26 that Rabbi Sherwood will be leaving in June, several critical projects have been put in motion. First, with endorsement of our Board of Directors, a search has begun for an Interim Rabbi to serve from July 1, 2017 to June 30, 2018. It is the recommendation of the Joint Commission on Rabbinic Placement of the Reform movement that congregations undergoing rabbinical transition can benefit from the engagement of an interim rabbi. The Joint Commission is composed of the congregational (Union for Reform Judaism), rabbinic (Central Conference of American Rabbis (CCAR)) and the educational (Hebrew Union College-Jewish Institute of Religion) arms of the Reform movement. Our application was posted on March 10 and we have already received several applications. The Rabbinical Search Committee, chaired by Greg Weissman, will convene on March 29 and candidate interviews will begin soon after.

With equal concern for the quality of our School for Jewish living in mind, we have begun a search for a part-time Director of Education and Programming. This job is posted on the “Jewish Jobs” website and we have begun to see responses. The standing SJL committee will be involved in evaluating the applicants for this position.

Finally, we will undertake a search for a permanent or “settled” rabbi, to use the jargon of the CCAR. This will be a process involving the entire congregation. There will be a visioning process to determine our congregation’s future direction and a series of town hall meetings so all that wish to can participate. We will have assistance from our Interim Rabbi as that rabbinic cadre is given specific training in guiding a congregation through the process of rabbinic recruitment.

Please keep the following April activities in mind. Congregation Emanu El’s Community Seder will take place Tuesday, April 11th, from 6:00-9:00 PM. I would like to thank the CEE Sisterhood for the enormous amount of planning and work that is required to execute this event. Our annual Marriage Re-consecration will take place during Shabbat services on April 14th. Finally, on Sunday, April 23 from 7:00-8:30, we will observe Yom HaShoah, Holocaust Remembrance Day.

The weekend of June 2 - 4, 2017, will be Rabbi Sherwood’s last Shabbat at Congregation Emanu El. On June 2, the Friday evening service will serve as a night of transition. We will install the new Temple

and Sisterhood boards, honor our SJL students and teachers, and say goodbye to Rabbi Sherwood. The Rabbi will lead Shabbat morning services on Saturday, June 3. Then, on Sunday June 4, Rabbi Sherwood will celebrate a wonderful year of learning with our SJL students and their families at the end-of-the-year school barbeque. We hope that you will join us for this weekend of transition.

Mental Health Awareness

April 2017



Remember ALGEE from Mental Health First Aid? ALGEE, the Australian koala who gives us guidance in a mental health crisis. If a relative or friend seems to be having an especially hard time coping with life, it may be wise to pay attention to ALGEE.

- A – Assess for risk of suicide or harm
- L – Listen nonjudgmentally
- G – Give reassurance and information
- E – Encourage appropriate professional help
- E – Encourage self-help and other support strategies

A couple of months ago we talked about assessing for the possibility of suicide or harm, and listening with an open and accepting heart in order to lend support to the person you care about. We also mentioned some of the county government resources that aim to help people get help. Let's look at the two E's.

Encouraging professional help for someone who hasn't quite admitted that he or she has a problem demands sensitivity and tact from us, but not more than we are capable of. We know the reluctance to get help is usually a reaction to the stigma of mental illness.

And here at Congregation Emanu El we have been trying hard to help our community become accepting and forthright. We are all Jews, or are becoming Jews, or are strongly connected to the Jewish people in one way or another, and yet we are all our individual selves, all different. We look different, we think differently, we approach the world differently. And we are all here together – we're one community. Our message is: You are welcome here. And we support you in being you.

And when it seems clear to you that your friend, family member, needs more help than we can responsibly give – then our openness, our forthrightness makes it easy to say: Have you thought of seeing a professional? Our true acceptance of him or her can also help us to not be deterred by a reactive refusal. Gentle persistence may be what's needed. And always, support. Reassurance. Patience. Love.

But who knows us the best? We do (sort of). And so it is with your relative or friend. What does she or he say makes them feel better and is also healthy? (No, not drugs or alcohol or wild sex, etc.) Self-help and developing insight into what is truly good for one can start someone on the path toward health and wholeness.

You can be a person who helps someone you love take the first step in the path of recovery. Or a person who sees a stranger in crisis and responds with heart and knowledge. Just remember ALGEE, your friend.
