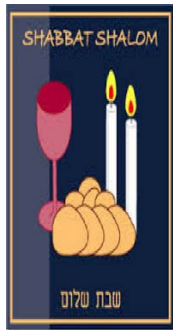

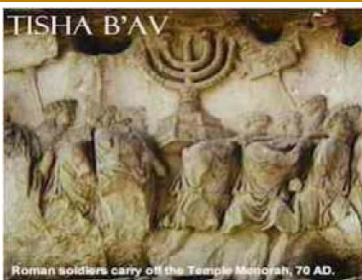

TISHA B'AV

Tisha B'Av commemorates the destruction of the First Temple in 586BCE by the Babylonian Empire and the destruction of the Second Temple in 70CE by the Roman Empire, as well as other destructions that have occurred during the history of the Jewish people. In observance of the holiday, we read from the Book of Lamentations, sing songs of consolation and learn lessons from the history of our people. Please join us for this solemn, yet inspiring holiday.

Rabbinic Reflection



"And so with the sunshine and the great bursts of leaves growing on the trees, just as things grow in fast movies, I had that familiar conviction that life was beginning over again with the summer." -- observed by famed author F. Scott Fitzgerald, in the classic novel The Great

Gatsby.

Indeed, summer has become for us a season of renewal. It is the season that our Jewish summer camps are in full activity, enriching the lives of Jewish youth across the country. It is the season that sees family vacations and a windfall for the travel industry, giving so many a well deserved break from their daily grind. It is the season that observes the solemnity of *Tisha B'Av*. It is the season that make preparations for the High Holy Days, laying the groundwork for the work of t'shuvah that the holidays require of us.

Study after study has shown that one of the most effective tools for developing Jewish identity is attending a Jewish summer camp. Since my first experience as a camper in the early 1970's, I have rarely missed a summer at camp. As a camper, staff member or a Rabbi-in-Residence, Jewish summer camp has recharged my Jewish batteries. Camp not only provides a strong sense of community, but also serves as a source of inspiration, since our camps are an incubator for most of the innovations of both the Reform and Conservative movements in America. Rabbis, cantors and educators spend time at camp each summer to absorb this inspiration and bring it home to their congregations.

Before we enter the season of the High Holy Days, much preparation is required. Certainly, there are the administrative tasks that must be completed by the temple office, the musical rehearsals of our volunteer choir, the service organization and preparation of the clergy. Before much of this is completed, we begin the spiritual path of preparation. There are numerous rabbinic opinions that say that the spiritual preparation for the High Holy Days begins with the holiday of *Tisha B'Av*. *Tisha B'Av* commemorates the destruction of the two Temples in Jerusalem. The rabbis of old, sometimes called *chazal*, taught that before we can purify our souls on Yom Kippur, we must understand the depths of destruction, thus we must observe the fast day of *Tish B'Av*.

May this summer be a season of renewal for all of us!

Contemplating August

And Nat King Cole sang in 1963, **'Ah, those 'lazy-hazy-crazy days' of summer...'**

'Hazy'? In Southern California, for sure...at least in the mornings...'Lazy'? I hope for some, yet it seems these days that school starts earlier, vacation time for most ends in August, and with more and more of us working from home, it's hard to be truly 'lazy'. 'Crazy'? Well, I would have to agree with that in lieu of the many horrific tragedies that have occurred in America and around the world this summer. On a personal note, my family has had a pretty tough summer dealing with loss and managing the pain and advanced care of our elderly parents.

Yet, it is part of who we are as Jews – part of our history, part of our liturgy, ingrained in our DNA to go on, to look ahead with hope and trust that life goes on and that joyful moments will come again. We are in the Hebrew month of *Av*. *Rosh Chodesh Av* begins on August 5th. The ninth of *Av* – *Tisha b'Av* is considered the most mournful day in our Jewish calendar and the time that we traditionally read from '*Eicha*' – the Book of Lamentations. At times this has seemed to me to be a summer of lamentation, but even in *Eicha* there are uplifting verses – verses of hope, support, and renewal, as in:

Chapter 3, verse 21 "Yet this I take to heart, and therefore I still hope." And...

Chapter 3 verse 57 "You draw near on the day that I call, telling me not to be afraid."

And although our High Holy Day season is still a couple of months away, we begin to prepare and look inward...Chapter 5, verse 21: *Hashiveinu Adonai elecha...v'nashuva...*"Bring us back G-d, and we will return. Renew our days as of old..."

May this month be one of blessings of strength and hope for all of us.

Treasurer's Report



Fellow Congregants,

We are at the beginning of our new fiscal year, and I would like to share some facts about our financial results for the Fiscal Year 2015-16 that ended on June 30, 2016.

Our Operating Income, the funds generated by Dues, Fees, Programs, High Holy Days Pledges, General Donations and Other Miscellaneous Income generated \$479,928.

The Operating Expenses, consisting of Salaries, Building Upkeep, Utilities and Insurance, Administrative Costs, the School for Jewish Living, Other Programs and Miscellaneous Expenses were \$427,092.

We were left with \$52,836 with which to pay for the debt on our building. Through the generosity of many of our fellow congregants we received \$90,801 toward our annual mortgage payments totaling \$169,453. The shortfall was made up in part from funds carried over from the prior year as well as a bequest made in prior years from the Estate of Burt and Sally Brin.

It does not take a financial genius to determine we cannot continue on this course. Your Board of Directors is well into the process of determining an alternative to the very high mortgage payments we are experiencing. By utilizing this strategy, we hope to reduce our cash outflow approximately \$7,500 per month.

This will not eliminate our cash problems; it will allow us a few years to work on further reducing our Mortgage obligation. We hope to share the results of our next steps with you during the next few months. In the meantime, we hope we can count on all of you to reach a little deeper as you have this past year to help us reach our goals.

Thank you for your continuing confidence and support.

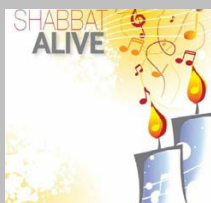

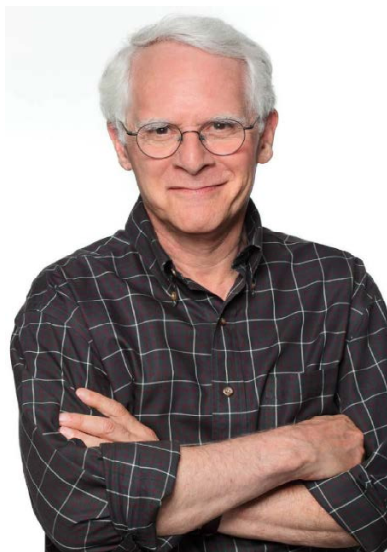

MENTAL HEALTH FIRST AID

How we love Chapter 8! Chapter 8 is the last chapter in the book, *Mental Health First Aid USA*, created by the Maryland and Missouri Departments of Mental Health and the National Council for Behavioral Health. That chapter is the one to consult if you ever come across a situation involving mental illness and you don't know what to do. It calms you down, and just provides you, simply and clearly, with information that can help you and the person before you who's going through a hard time.

Was a child you know involved in a traumatic event? Chapter 8 can help you do the best in the dangerous situation and afterwards. Is a friend having a panic attack – Chapter 8 tells you what the signs are and how to help. Is a family member secretly hurting themselves – how can you tell, what can you do?

Chapter 8 doesn't deal with every single mental health situation, but there are 7 whole chapters before it, each one full of insight and information. And it all can come off the page with Mental Health First Aid training being offered at the temple in September. The course is 8 hours, and we're planning on holding it on 2 Sunday afternoons. If you'd like to learn more, or you're ready to sign up, contact Nancy Sidhu, dnsidhu@msn.com, or 909-335-1944. The San Bernardino County Department of Behavioral Health will give the training at no charge to us. And you'll walk away with the whole wonderful book.

The idea is for Americans to have confidence and a sense of what to do in a crisis or when you feel something is going wrong. Let's be the community we all need.

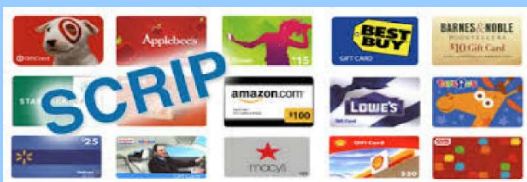
