

Rabbinic Reflection



The month of Kislev has arrived, and with it comes the onset of winter. Kislev also brings us the season of miracles—the season of Hanukkah. Hanukkah reminds us that we should pay attention to the miracles in our lives. With the busy

lives that we all lead, it is easy to overlook these miracles. That is why the rabbis of old added the *Nisim B'chol Yom* section of the morning service. Traditionally, we recite these fifteen one-line blessings each morning, giving thanks for "everyday miracles" (indeed, that is the translation of "*nisim b'chol yom*").

Hanukkah reminds us to give thanks for extraordinary miracles. So what is the miracle of Hanukkah? Some say that the miracle is that a ragtag army of Jew zealots, outnumbered more than 100 to 1, defeated a more heavily armed Greek Assyrian army in an epic war. They then rededicated the ancient Temple by lighting the menorah. This is the story that we read in the First and Second Book of Maccabees, both part of the Apocryphal collection of biblical era books. Some say that the miracle was that a small container of oil used to light the menorah only contained enough oil for one day, yet it lasted for eight days. This is the legend as told in the Babylonian Talmud (but not in the Jerusalem Talmud), written 800 years after the event. While both stories give meaning to the holiday, neither one tells of the real miracle of Hanukkah. No, the miracle of Hanukkah is not that the oil lasted eight days. No, the miracle of Hanukkah is not that our ancestors won a war of religious freedom.

The miracle—the real miracle of Hanukkah—is that every year, we light the menorah. We extend the holy light that was kindled by our ancestors in ancient times, and we continue it to this day. As Hanukkah approaches, may we not only kindle the light of the menorah, but may we also kindle the light of justice, the light of righteousness, and the light of love. As we kindle the lights to experience the miracle in our time, may that holy light extend to all who seek justice, righteousness and love. Happy Hanukkah! **Cantorial Comments**

In this darkest month of our calendar year, we have the opportunity to celebrate one of our most joyful, albeit minor holidays. As we kindle the Hanukkiah – our Hanukkah menorah – the lights remind us 'mi vimaleil' (who can retell) those days long ago when, as the story goes, a small group led by Judah Maccabee, miraculously overcame the forces that tried to corrupt and profane our Holy Temple and destroy our way of way of life and values we hold so dear. Tragically, this theme is familiar to this very day; while in some ways, we have achieved great levels of understanding and tolerance, the cancerous forces of hate, greed and violence, misery and poverty continue to upset the balance of our precious planet. The lights of Hanukkah – the Feast of Dedication reminds us to look, even for the smallest miracles and wonders on a daily basis, if we only open our eyes and hearts to our surroundings. I'm sure we all struggle with the commercialized usage of 'giving' during this season, but I hope we can reframe it in our own lives – to be, according to Isaiah, 'a Light unto the Nations' – to emu'light' charity and goodness and compassion to those around us – to those we know and especially, to those we don't know. During Kislev (half of December) Hanukkah melodies and games will fill our homes and sanctuary with brightness almost equal to the Hanukkah lights. We hope that you will be joining us for our services and celebrations, with young and old singing songs that retell our history, evoke laughter, fun and nostalgia. With our *Shammas* (the candle that sits above all the rest) we light a new candle every night, until the *Hanukkiah* is complete with eight lights according to Hillel (that's Hillel of c. 110 BCE!) May this Hanukkah illuminate all our joys and blessings, with each new candle increasing in holiness and renewed prayers for peace and healing of our world.

Treasurer's Report



There is good news to report: income of \$70,000 in the month of October was only slightly below our budget, and careful management of our expenses meant that we spent 25% less than we budgeted, for a surplus of over \$39,000. I'm thrilled to say that November also looks good as we

received a long-awaited check from the Brin estate for the full amount owed to us.

However, I'm reminded of a story I read when I was a child, and you've probably heard the same one: There was once a squirrel and a crow. When fall came and there were seeds and nuts everywhere, the squirrel worried and worked hard to store food while the crow danced and played, thinking that the plentiful food around him would last forever. The crow teased the squirrel for not enjoying the pleasant days around him. When winter came, the prudent squirrel lived well on stored nuts while the crow, sour and hungry, was forced to flee in the hopes of finding food elsewhere.

Right now, it's very tempting to look at our bank account and think we have all the money in the world, but we want to be squirrels and not crows. In the last month, we've made cuts that will let us keep a balanced budget throughout 2016, and we'll be able to save our money for when we need it. In making these cuts, we did our best to preserve the things that really make us one big family: our clergy, our school, and our location. We also tried to choose cuts that could easily be undone if we should have a financial windfall in the future.

There's a way to help the congregation without spending an extra cent: BUY SCRIP. If every congregational family used temple scrip cards to pay for groceries and gas, the profit would be enough for two mortgage payments. There's another way to be supportive: go to smile.amazon.com and shop there. Choose Congregation Emanu El as your supporting organization and 1% of your purchase will go to the temple automatically. If you have any questions about scrip, contact Cheryl Sukenik or call the temple office.

The times are tough, the challenges are great, but the odds are in our favor. This is the time where you can choose to preserve Judaism in the San Bernardino area. Don't you think we owe it to our future?

Mental Health Awareness



It is heartening to know that we at CEE are not alone in our congregational efforts to dissolve the stigma of mental illness. Congregation Rodef Sholom, a reform congregation in San Rafael has launched its

own program to destignatize mental illness. In her sermon, the rabbi of the congregation shared the following story.

A man tells his doctor that he is depressed because he feels life is cruel, and he feels isolated in a threatening world.

The prescription that the doctor gives him is to watch the performance of a famous clown named the Great Carlini who happened to be in town that night. "That should pick you up," the doctor says.

Bursting into tears the patient replies, "But doctor, I am the Great Carlini."

The doctor in the story clearly does not hear the man in his deep distress. The trusted doctor obviously is not enlightened to the realities of deep depression. Along with many others, he does not realize that telling a man to laugh himself out of it is not helpful. In fact, it trivializes his patient's suffering.

How much more hopeless the man in the story feels when he receives no validation from the doctor in whom he confides his deep pain.

Even those who make their livelihood by making us laugh, such as Robin Williams, are sometimes stricken with feelings of depression desperate enough to result in suicide.

As we continue our efforts here at Congregation Emanu El to dissolve the stigma of metal illness, we do so acknowledging that the rate of suicide continues to climb. Let us comfort them with our knowledge that there is no shame in mental illness. Eliminating the shame leads to the possibility of receiving needed help.

Book Club December 9, 2015 *The Yiddish Policeman's Union*

The Yiddish Policemen's Union is a 2007 novel by American author Michael Chabon. The novel is a detective story set in an alternative history version of the present day, based on the premise that during World War II, a temporary settlement for Jewish refugees was established in Sitka, Alaska, in 1941, and that the fledgling State of Israel was destroyed in 1948. The novel is set in Sitka, which it depicts as a large, Yiddish-speaking metropolis.

The Yiddish Policemen's Union won a number of science fiction awards. At once a gripping whodunit, a love story, and an exploration of the mysteries of exile and redemption, *The Yiddish Policemen's Union* is a novel only Michael Chabon could have written.


Preparations are already underway to make the 2016 Mahj games the biggest and best AND most fun ever!

Hanukkah Blessings

Candles are added to the *hanukkiyah* (menorah) from right to left but are kindled from left to right. The newest candle is lit first. (On the Shabbat of Hanukkah, kindle the Hanukkah lights first and then the Shabbat candles.)

Light the *shamash* (the helper candle) first, using it to kindle the rest of the Hanukkah lights. As you do, say or sing:

Baruch atah, Adonai Eloheinu, Melech haolam, asher kid'shanu b'mitzvotav v'tsivanu l'hadlik ner shel Hanukkah.

Blessed are You, Adonai our God, Sovereign of all, who hallows us with mitzvot, commanding us to kindle the Hanukkah lights.
