Rabbinic Reflection



Finally, the summer heat wave came to end part way through November and Southern California's other season - "not summer" as I like to call it - has begun. And since I have mentioned miracles, this is the beginning of the season of miracles, lasting from the

miracle of Hanukkah in Kislev/Tevet (usually December) to the miracle of Purim in Adar (usually in March). We enter the season with the lighting of the Hanukkah Menorah, or as some prefer to call it, the Hanukkiah. In his commentary on the Talmudic discussion of the Hanukkah candles, the great 11th century sage Rashi explains that the purpose of displaying a menorah is to publicize the miracle. Of course, this leads to the question: "What miracle are we publicizing?"

Of course, the popular legend of the flask containing enough oil for one day yet lasting for eight days is the story told for the holiday, but this is only a symbolic custom that should help us focus on the "real" miracle. Join me on Tuesdays, December 6 and 13 for an adult education class on what that "real" story is, and why its message is still important today, not only for Jews, but for all people! For those who cannot make it, the short version of the "real" story is that a small group of guerrilla fighters defeated a much larger army in the first recorded war for religious freedom.

Rabbi Yehudah Aryeh Leib Alter, also known as the Sfas Emes, was one of the great kabbalistic sages of the 19th century. He led the Ger sect of chasidim, and was a great scholar of the human condition. He taught that, "during Chanukah the same spiritual lights that were created by the miracle are once again available to every Jewish soul. However, in order experience and share this unique light, we need to detach ourselves from the natural order of things, and thereby ready ourselves to receive that which emanates from above the natural order." The spiritual lights that we receive are meant to inspire us to become modern day Maccabees - to fight for what is right, despite the appearance that the odds are against us. To be a light unto the nations, we must first be a light unto ourselves. Hanukkah comes to remind us of this challenge.

Chag Urim Same'ach! Happy Festival of Lights!

Cantorial Comments



'Not by might nor by power, but by My spirit …' Zechariah 4:6

How exciting! After all the calendar shifts and odd correlations due to the leap year over the past few months, the new Hebrew month of Kislev actually begins on the

first of December! It's not such a big deal really, but... it does make it a bit easier to follow – at least for this month. And... I suppose it is also fun and a bit of a phenomenon this year, that Erev Hanukkah – 24th of Kislev is also Christmas Eve – December 24th!

'Convenient', wouldn't you say? Certainly, for school vacations etc. it makes it easier. But what do we really mean – makes it easier? Unfortunately, as most of us know, Hanukkah, a wonderful, albeit minor holiday, has been significantly blown out of proportion due to the commercialized society we live in while the shopping industry has long claimed Christmas as the pinnacle of their advertising frenzy.

And yet, far be it for me to downplay any excuse Apart from diverse and indulgent for celebration! foods, there is music and different customs that bring us together. Hanukkah is not only about 'I had a little dreydl' but celebrates a variety of melodies and nusach from around the world, including songs in Ladino and Yiddish. As for customs, we now add 'sufganiot' or jelly doughnuts, a Sephardic Israeli custom, to our traditional Ashkenazic fare of latkes. Did you know that the Jews of India light their menorahs with wicks that have been dipped in coconut oil rather than candles? It's a different way of honoring the miracle of oil. I recently learned that among Yemenite Jews, the seventh night of Hanukkah is set aside as a women's holiday! That night commemorates Hannah, sometimes spelled Channah, whose story is told in the Book of Maccabees. According to the text, Hannah and her seven sons defied the Syrian Greeks who ruled Jerusalem at the time, and she and her sons were killed for refusing to give up their beliefs.

While wishing one another a Chag Urim Sameach – Happy Hannukkah; and during this winter season and Festival of Lights, let us not forget to include those who may be alone at this time of year, as well as show sensitivity to those who may be in mourning, for whom holidays may illicit sad memories, or evoke depression, loneliness, despair... May this season shed light, miracles and renewal to every body, mind and spirit.

Presidential Perspectives



I am writing to you this month from a place of concern. In the weeks and months leading up to the recent presidential election, we as a nation experienced a great deal of polarization. The rhetoric of both sides exacerbated the situation, but

the words of our president-elect were especially damaging. I grant you that politics today is a "take no prisoners" affair, but dating back to the Kennedy/Nixon contest, I have seen nothing approximating this behavior. In his campaign Trump disparaged African Americans, Latinos, Muslims, women and the LGBTQ community, in no particular order. Sadly, this kind of vitriolic barrage cannot easily be disavowed or retracted.

In the wake of the election, we are starting to witness disturbing events nationwide. We see the emboldening of white supremacists, the alt-Right, the KKK and neo Nazi groups. Assaults on Muslims including attackers ripping hijabs from women's heads have been reported. Churches and buildings are being defaced with swastikas and anti-immigrant epithets. Children in primary school are being taunted about deportation because they possess Hispanic surnames.

In every facet of Jewish life I have experienced, from Sunday school to my temple youth group to Congregation Emanu El, there has always been a call to social action. Now, I believe we, as individuals and as a congregation, must speak out. When our government pursues policies contrary to our beliefs, we must speak out. When our government is composed of and endorsed by those espousing hate, we must speak out. When we observe behavior around us that inflicts harm on these minorities, we must speak out. Silence is taken as assent and this is not a time to stand mute.

I can only hope that as the transition of presidential power occurs, the new president will call upon Americans to cease these behaviors and unite as one tolerant and accepting country. I am sure that it is only coincidence that Donald Trump became president-elect on the 78th anniversary of Kristallnacht, but that does not excuse us from vigilance for the sake of those threatened in our community(s). We must be available to communicate with the affected groups and support them in these trying times. I will leave you with the oft quoted words of Martin Niemöller who wrote:

First they came for the Socialists, and I did not speak out— Because I was not a Socialist. Then they came for the Trade Unionists, and I did not speak out— Because I was not a Trade Unionist. Then they came for the Jews, and I did not speak out— Because I was not a Jew. Then they came for me—and there was no one left to speak for me.

Treasurer's Report



Dear fellow Congregants,

Rabbi Sherwood has on a number of occasions, in my presence, announced that the Hebrew month of Heshvan, which began on November 2, 2016, is the only month of the Hebrew lunar calendar that iday or festival

does not include a holiday or festival.

Let me suggest that we elect to celebrate that on the 6th of Heshvan we funded the new loan with Pacific Premier Bank that reflects our financial obligation for Congregation Emanu El's building and land at 1495 Ford Street, Redlands, California is down to \$1,500,000. Further, we have been able to reduce the monthly cost of the loan from \$14,121.07 per month to \$5,312.50 per month. This represents a cash flow savings of \$8,808.57 per month. This savings will occur from November 2016 to November 2018, for a savings of over \$210,000.00

At that time, our payments will increase to \$8,126.07 per month until November 2023 at which time the remaining note balance will have to be refinanced unless it has been totally paid off. That level of payment reflects a savings of \$5,995 per month or a savings of almost \$72,000 per year. All payments received as Capital Campaign contributions as well as Mortgage Reduction Fund contributions during that time will be applied directly to the principal balance of the mortgage.

Subject to our budget analysis for the 2017-2018 Fiscal Year, at this time we anticipate there will be no MRF asked of our members after June 30, 2017. We MAY, however, consider some assessment for building repairs, replacement and renovations, as our building is entering into its fifth year and prudent financial management would suggest beginning to set aside funds for that purpose.

Not wanting to end this letter on a down note, let us remember Heshvan 5777 as a month to celebrate a holiday. The advent of a new mortgage that fits into our budget for the future as well as providing assurance that we will likely be here for the next 50 years?

Mental Health Awareness



December 2016

On a warm sunny day in late October, people from all around our region headed to the campus of Loma Linda University for the 7th annual conference of the Inland

Empire Perinatal Mental Health Collaborative, an organization housed at the Wylie Center in Riverside. The wonderful people of the collaborative work to help mothers and their families cope with challenges thrown up by pregnancy and childbirth. This latest all-day event dealt with The Impact of Culture and Faith on Parental Mental Health.

Speaking to all of us were a UCLA psychiatrist specializing in motherhood and mental health, a social worker from the Arrowhead Regional Medical Center, a professor from the University of Illinois-Urbana, as well as a panel of clergy and lay people representing the diversity of our religious landscape. Rabbi Sherwood represented the Jewish community.

Particular attention was paid to special cultural issues among African American and Latina women. Does the term 'historical trauma' mean something to you? How about 'Marianismo' and 'co-madreismo'? We were given important insights into cultural/religious influences many of us might not normally take into consideration when thinking about how women cope and how men react to a new baby.

Some of the issues that stood out were:

Are needed mental health medications dangerous for the baby in the womb or when nursing?

How do the cultural ideas about motherhood effect how women cope with the reality of having a baby?

How do people of different cultural backgrounds get the support they need?

What effect does the experience of immigration have on new mothers?

In what ways do religions help and harm?

You notice these are all questions, and as you might guess, they have complicated answers. We hope in the coming months to probe into them and others when we get leaders of the Inland Empire Perinatal Mental Health Collaborative to come and talk to us at Congregation Emanu El.

Meanwhile, it's December and Chanukah. May you and all your days be full of light.

Hanukkah Blessings

Candles are added to the *hanukkiyah* (menorah) from right to left but are kindled from left to right. The newest candle is lit first. (On the Shabbat of Hanukkah, kindle the Hanukkah lights first and then the Shabbat candles.)

Light the *shamash* (the helper candle) first, using it to kindle the rest of the Hanukkah lights. As you do, say or sing:

ַבָּרוּדְ אַתָּה יְיָ אֱלֹהֵינוּ מֶלֶדְ הָעוֹלָם, אֲשֶׁר קִדְּשָׁנוּ בְּמִצְוֹתָיו, וְצִוְנוּ לְהַדְלִיק וֵר שֶׁל חֲגָכָּה.

Baruch atah, Adonai Eloheinu, Melech haolam, asher kid'shanu b'mitzvotav v'tsivanu l'hadlik ner shel Hanukkah.

Blessed are You, Adonai our God, Sovereign of all, who hallows us with mitzvot, commanding us to kindle the Hanukkah lights.
