





## **Rabbinic Reflections**



While Purim doesn't come until the very first week in March, it is never too soon to start getting ready to celebrate this very special holiday. This year we will be renewing a long-standing tradition at our congregation - the Purim Mishuggas. Yes, *mishuggas* is

just what the word means - craziness. Or some like to say frivolity. Or, silliness. It is a night of fun and your rabbi and cantor and some others will try to make it a fun-filled celebration. You can be part of the celebration in a few ways. First, come and see what crazy antics we have come up with. Second, wear a costume - any old costume. It need not be of one of the characters of the Purim story. People of every age should come in costume. One is never too old to have fun. You may even want to come in a costume related to the theme we have chosen for this year's Purim Mishuggas: Purim in Disneyland.

A number of years ago an anonymous author wrote something called "What Purim Can Do For Us." Here is what it can do:

"Purim can remind us that, like Mordecai, we should not worship any person.

"Purim can help us recall that being Jewish means to be merry and not sad.

"Purim can shake us loose from selfishness, for if we take this gift-giving holiday seriously we will give generously of our possessions and ourselves to good causes.

"Purim can send us to our Bible to discover (or rediscover) what interesting literature it contains.

"Purim can make us understand the Jewish conception of beauty. The Talmud says that the chief factor in Esther's charm was her simplicity.

"Purim can remind us that concealment of Jewish identity does not absolve us from the general destiny of the Jewish People.

"Purim can help us measure ourselves against Esther, She was ready to die for ideals; are we ready to live by them?"

I look forward to seeing you at our Purim observances. We all need to spend some time having some real fun and indulging in true *Mishuggas*.

## From our Director of Education



This month, School for Jewish Living families can sign-up their 3rd - 9th grade children for a weekend at Jewish camp - the Birthright Shabbaton Experience. The camp will take place on the weekend of March 20-22, 2015, at Camp Mountain

Chai, in Angelus Oaks, CA. Nearly 200 students from synagogues and Jewish day schools from Glendale to Redlands will attend. I will be the rabbi-in-residence for the weekend. This is a "do not miss" experience. Why should we send our kids to Jewish camps? Because camp works!

Jewish camping experiences--both weekend retreats and summer programs--build Jewish identity. We have the research to prove it. The Foundation for Jewish Camp has produced one of the latest surveys, and the results reconfirm what we already know. The Foundation reports. "Bv examining cross-tabulating the results of 26 existing Jewish community population surveys, we compared the attitudes and behaviors of adults who had attended Jewish camp as children with those who did not. Survey responses covered 13 different areas of adult behavior attitude. including synagogue or membership, observance of holidays, donating to Jewish charities, and connection to Israel. Camp attendance increases the likelihood of adult participation and identification in every one of these areas." The survey showed that adults who attended Jewish camps as a child were 21% more likely to feel that being Jewish is very important; 26% more likely to be members of a synagogue; 45% more likely to attend synagogue at least once a month; and 55% more likely to feel very emotionally attached to Israel

The Shabbaton experience is a great step in building Jewish identity. In the next couple of months, representatives of several Jewish summer camps will visit our School for Jewish Living. I encourage every parent to consider investing in their children's future Jewish identity by sending your child to camp. Start with our Shabbaton in March.

It comes down to this:

• Pen to fill out camp application: \$1

• Shabbaton fee: \$200

• Your child's Jewish identity: priceless!

They and their best friend (Les) volunteer together at the Loma Linda VA Hospital. Join with us at our February 26th meeting of Mental Health Awareness In Action to hear their story. (If you know anyone who can translate dog speech, please bring him or her along.)

Last month we heard about Our Place, the Redlands clubhouse, where people diagnosed with mental illness go to hang out, learn skills for living and thinking, enjoy the company and support of other people, and where we may volunteer to teach a skill or art. There are many ways we can improve the lives of people living with mental problems. Each of us wearing the lime green ribbons of Each Mind Matters has had the experience of engaging people in conversation about mental illness, often encouraging people to get help when they or their relatives need it.

Others have volunteered to talk to our group at the temple, sharing their personal experiences about what mental illness is really like in our society. All of us are reducing the stigma by our actions and our attitudes. When we care for every person with respect, when we open our minds and hearts, we change the world in which we all live. ## Contributions to Rabbi Norman F. Fedheym Memorial Lecture Fund Being Sought

Rabbi Norman F. Feldheym was the leader of our congregation from 1937-1971 and our Rabbi Emeritus from 1971 until his death in 1985. In addition to serving our congregation with such distinction, he was acknolwedged as one of the most sgnificant religious and community leaders of the Inland Empire. An indication of the high esteem in which he was held was the naming of the San Bernardino central library in his honor. Additionally, our congregation honored him with the naming of the Rabbi Norman F. Feldheym Religious Education Center at our former campus in San Bernardino.

At the time of Rabbi Feldheym's death in 1985 members and friends of his and our congregation were eager to memorialize him in a most fitting manner and thus funds contributed in his memory were used to create the Rabbi Norman F. Feldheym Memorial Lecture Fund in order to bring programs on subjects that were especially dear to Rabbi Feldheym to our congegation and our wider community annually at the time of his Yahrzeit. Each year since 1986 outstanding programs have been presented in his memory through the interest gained from the

Ruth Weisberg is an internationally renowned artist and art historian. She is Professor of Fine Arts at University of Southern California. She served as Dean

of the USC Roski School and currently directs the USC Initiative for Israeli Arts and Humanities.

She has received numerous honors including the Foundation for Jewish Culture's 50th Anniversary Cultural Achievement Award in 2011, the Art Leadership Award of the National Council of Art Administrators, the Women's Caucus for Art Lifetime Achievement Award in 2009, Doctor of Humane Letters honoris causa from Hebrew Union College in 2001 and the College Art Association Distinguished Teaching of Art Award in 1999.

## Congregation Adopts New Policies Concerning Prayers for the Sick (Mi Sheberach)

The "Mi Sheberach" prayer included at our Shabbat festival and holiday services is recited on behalf of those who are ill. Along with numerous other congregations throughout the country, we have a lengthy list of individuals whose names are read at each service including many who are no longer suffering from major illness. We want to make that portion of our service when the Mi Sheberach prayer is recited more meaningful for all.

Therefore, emulating practices adopted in other congregations, our Board of Directors has adopted the following policy to guide us beginning on March 1, 2015:

"When the Temple clergy or office staff is asked to include a name on the Mi Sheberach "list" the name will remain on the list for TWO months, after which it will be automatically removed. Of course, a name can be removed any time during that two-month period if it is felt that the prayers are no longer needed. (should someone on the list die that name would be removed immediately). Names may remain on the list for an additional two months upon request by the person who originally requested that the name be included.

"If someone is chronically ill, the clergy or office staff will note that and the name will remain on the list until otherwise notified.

"In order to protect the privacy of all, it is urged that the inclusion of a name on the Mi Sheberachg list be requested by the ill person him/herself or his/her next of kin."

In introducing the Mi Sheberach prayer at our services, Rabbi Cohn customarily prefaces it by saying that it is a time to think of those "who might be in need of healing of body or spirit, as well as those who might be in need of calm and tranquility as they experience times of mental anguish, as well as those who might be in need of the gentle, final "kiss of peace."

If you wish your name or the name of a loved one of close friend to be included on the list beginning March 1st, please notify Rabbi Cohn, Cantor Bern-Vogel or the temple office staff prior to March 1st and indicate whether the person to be included is suffering from a chronic illness.
