

Rabbinic Reflection



As those who are regular Friday night Shabbat attendees well know, I do not often speak of politics from the bima, nor do I usually discuss politics in the Bulletin. There are times, however, where this becomes a necessity. We are now living in those times. This past week, the newly inaugurated

President, on International Holocaust Remembrance Day no less, issued an order that shut the US borders to all refugees for 120 days, and banned entry for all nationals of seven specific Muslim majority nations for at least 90 days, pending further policy review. He also indicated in interviews that refugees of one religion would be prioritized over refugees of other religions. This order is not only unconstitutional, but flies in the face of Jewish values, and indeed, human decency. I call upon President Trump to rescind the order immediately. I am joined in this call by every single American rabbinical seminary, every single national denominational organization, and every single national rabbinical organization, without exception (that includes Reform, Conservative, Orthodox, Reconstructionist, Trans-Denominational and Renewal). We are joined by a nearly unanimous chorus of Jewish organizations and leaders. Our Jewish tradition teaches that we are to take care of the stranger. The Torah commands this of us 36 times--repeating the lesson more that an other commandment in Torah. In Leviticus 19:34 we read, "The strangers who reside with you shall be to you as your citizens; you shall love each one as yourself, for you were strangers in the land of Egypt." Exodus 22:21 states, "And you shall not wrong a stranger, neither shall you oppress them; for you were strangers in the land of Egypt." We have an obligation as Jews and as human beings to uphold this principle. The last time the US had such restrictions on refugees, the Jews aboard the World War II era ship SS St. Louis returned to war-torn Europe, where at least a quarter of the over 900 denizens died in the Nazi concentration camps. Our cry of "never again" is not just a Jewish cry. It must be the cry of a humanity that will not accept the racism and xenophobia that inform this misguided policy directive. A policy that denigrates the humanity of others will not make the world a safer place. It just makes the world an angrier place, and anger does not give rise to safety. We are better than this!

Presidential Perspectives



One of the primary responsibilities of congregational leadership is effective communication with members of the congregation. This involves primary communication and clarification of disinformation should it become necessary. This month

I discuss the process by which we deal with rabbinical contracts.

Rabbi Sherwood's contract ends June 30, 2017 what are the steps necessary to renew this contract. As basic as it seems, the first step is a question. I recently sat with Rabbi Sherwood and asked him if he wanted to pursue another contract with Congregation Emanu El (CEE) to which he responded, "Yes." That response set in motion the following events. The Executive Committee in its designated role as the temple's personnel committee, as set forth in the CEE bylaws, was convened (01/12/17) to determine if another contract should be offered to Rabbi Sherwood. The majority vote of the personnel committee was in the affirmative, to extend a new contract at the conclusion of the current contract. At the general board meeting held January 19, 2017, the entire board was made aware of and asked to endorse the decision of the personnel The Board of Directors unanimously committee. endorsed the proposal. The next action in the process is the creation of a new contract by the personnel committee. This will be submitted to Rabbi Sherwood for his review and through an iterative process during which both parties consider each other's proposals, a final contract document will be produced. document is then presented to the entire Board of Directors of CEE, as prescribed by the temple bylaws, for its approval. The power to accept or deny the contract is vested in and will be determined by the entire CEE Board of Directors. The contract process, as I have described above, will be carried out with the utmost transparency and I encourage all congregants to contact me or members of the Executive committee with questions pertaining thereto. Your input is encouraged and always appreciated!

Please be aware of these upcoming events at the temple. On February 12th our 2017 Cantor's Concert will take place at 4:00 PM. The theme is "My Favorite Things" and Cantor Bern-Vogel and friends will entertain us with an afternoon of religious and secular music. Call the temple office for tickets. I look forward to seeing you there.

Mental Health Awareness



February 2017

At the temple last September, about 30 Emanu El congregants, relatives, and friends attended a 2 day course on Mental Health First Aid, taught and paid for

by the County of San Bernardino Department of Behavioral Health.

Around that time, in this column, we mentioned a koala named ALGEE. ALGEE came from Australia because that's where the concept of Mental Health First Aid was developed and implemented throughout the society. Some Americans liked the idea and made it America-friendly, and now it's finding its way throughout own society.

We'd like to get you acquainted with ALGEE. ALGEE guides us in taking care of someone with a mental health crisis. Let's take him step by step:

- A Assess for risk of suicide or harm
- L Listen nonjudgmentally
- G Give reassurance and information
- E Encourage appropriate professional help
- E Encourage self-help and other support strategies

Without being professional ourselves, we can approach a difficult situation in a careful way – asking simple, direct questions, for example, to assess risk. 'How have you been feeling?' 'What have you been thinking about?' And if signs indicate suicide or other self-harm, ask clearly – 'Have you been thinking about harming yourself?'

One thing ALGEE requests of us is that we stay calm and strong, gentle and accepting. Anyone in a crisis needs someone to lean on and trust. We can be that person. We can listen with an open heart.

You likely know someone, a family member or friend, who lives with mental illness. It's not too hard to find some resources so that if an occasion arises, you could provide a telephone number or even a place to go for urgent help. For example, there are Community Crisis Response Teams in San Bernardino County that provide assistance in the field and follow-up services. There are also walk-in clinics in our valley, on the High Desert, and in the Morongo Basin. And there's the 2-1-1 phone number for a whole host of referrals for food, housing, employment, health care and counseling. You can even check it out at www.211.org.

In coming months, we'll get to know ALGEE even better. It's good to know we can be prepared.






