Rabbinic Reflections

The year 2015 has come to close, ending with



signs of both sadness and joy. Early in December, tragedy struck in our own backyard. Terrorists killed 14 people and injured nearly two dozen more at the Inland Regional Center in San Bernardino. Hours later, law enforcement officials discovered an arsenal that was stockpiled by those terrorists here in Redlands,

only minutes from our congregation. This tragic event has shaken our sense of safety and security in our own homes. We begin to walk with a little more caution, but also with a little more fear. We weep with our neighbors at the senseless killing perpetrated in the name of religion. Our community has come together to raise money in support the victims, pray in memory of those killed, and ask for healing for those who were injured. The interfaith religious leaders of our community have come together for prayer vigils, press releases, and media interviews. But we must not stop at mere words. We must demand that the leadership of our country takes action to address both of the problems that were at the root of the violence that shook our community—international terrorism and the epidemic of gun violence in America. As individuals, we must do our part as well. The most important thing that we can do is to live our lives—we cannot walk around scared because of this event and other events like it—for if we do, the terrorists win. And we will not let them win!

Instead of focusing on sadness and terror, we will celebrate our joys. December also brought great joy, with the celebration of the miracle of *Chanukkah* and our inaugural *Shabbaton* weekend. I write these words having just returned from an inspiring weekend at Camp Mountain Chai in Angeleus Oaks, with a group of Congregation Emanu El members who were the *chalutzim* (pioneers) of this new Shabbaton program. Snow was on the ground when we arrived and more fell as we gathered in front of the fireplace on Saturday night. We began Friday evening with a traditional Shabbat dinner followed by Kabbalat Shabbat services. Saturday was filled with morning prayers, Torah study, archery, sledding, family game night and much more. There was great joy in disconnecting from the tether of electronics and the 24-hour news cycle, and just breathing in Shabbat, enjoying the beautiful scenery and sharing each other's company. Next year we will return with more friends to share the experience.

Life is filled with joys and sorrows. As we begin the year 2016, may we continue to support each other in times of sorrow, and may we continue to celebrate the joys. And may the joys far outnumber the sorrows! Amen!

Presidential Perspectives



As we enjoy the holiday season, we are all trying to process the acts of violence that have taken place in San Bernardino and Redlands. I find it almost impossible to comprehend the scope of the crimes, the impact on the families of the victims and the effects, both immediate and long term, felt by our communities. These unspeakable acts have made it

apparent that a review of Congregation Emanu El's emergency response procedures is in order. We have taken the matter(s) under consideration at the December board meeting. Our congregation is fortunate to have as a member Phil Holder, a member of an area police force, who will guide us in these discussions and serve as a liaison to the Redlands Police Department. We are resolved to begin 2016 with a heightened awareness of the dangers that surround us and a firm plan to respond to emergencies, be they naturally occurring or man-made.

In the days that followed the shooting, our clergy Rabbis Sherwood and Cohn and Cantor Jennifer Bern-Vogel, participated in a community prayer vigil at Our Lady of the Rosary in San Bernardino, helping the surrounding communities cope with and heal from the violence. In addition, Rabbi Sherwood was a part of the community prayer vigil at the Islamic Center in Redlands and Rabbi Cohn spoke at the Mayor's prayer vigil in San Bernardino. Due to the proximity of our congregation to the events, Rabbi Sherwood became an early conduit of information to the press in Israel, conducting many interviews by phone and appearing on talk radio as well. For all that they did in the cause of dealing with the crisis and healing our communities, I commend and thank them.

The Board of directors considered the "brainstorming" list at the December meeting and has determined which activities will be most successful. We are grateful for the enthusiastic attendance and participation.

My friends,

The month of November brought mostly good news to your treasurer's desk. Income of \$55,000 exceeded expenses of \$37,000 due mostly to collections of the annual Kol Nidre pledge and the outstanding work done by Karen

Levine and her committee in organizing the first ever "Top Chef' competition. Not only that, the temple received a long-awaited check for over \$132,000 from the estate of Burt and Sally Brin. This donation funnels into our capital campaign to be used to help pay expenses throughout the coming year.

Unfortunately, we're still behind our goals for the year in all critical areas: dues, mortgage reduction and SJL tuition. At this rate we'll burn through all of our reserves by the end of the fiscal year and potentially run a deficit in fiscal 2017. So, while it's nice to have a little breathing room, we can't take our eyes off our goal of financial independence. There are so many opportunities to help keep our congregation alive and healthy... please consider donating to one of our many charitable funds, attending our fundraisers and buying temple scrip.

I would like to thank everyone who has volunteered to work in the temple office to help with the many tasks that need to be done on a daily basis. Unfortunately, we were not able to retain our Administrative Assistant and now rely 100% on volunteers to help Judy. If you would like to volunteer, please contact the temple office. 


