Rabbinic Reflection



I write to you from New York City, were I am spending two weeks studying with a cohort of Jewish educators, re-envisioning the philosophies and realities of Jewish education in the 21st century.

Between classroom lectures, chevrutah study and project

preparation, we have had the opportunity to experience some of the best of New York. The most important experience of the week happened this past Friday night, June 24.

This month is Pride month in New York City, and this past Friday night, our group attended Pride Shabbat at Congregation Beit Simchat Torah, the world's largest LGBTQ synagogue. Pride Shabbat at CBST, as the congregation is sometimes called, is like a second High Holy Days. There were over 600 people in attendance. Greetings of Happy Pride, Chag Same'eich, and Shabbat Shalom were mixed together. Jewish Festival customs were observed, such the recitation of Hallel and a special Al Hanissim prayer modeled after the ones written for Chanukkah and Purim.

After the shootings at the gay night club in Orlando, this Shabbat was both a celebration and a moment of remembrance. Senior Rabbi Sharon Kleinbaum pointed out the 49 rainbow flags, one for each victim of the Orlando shooting, that surrounded the balcony of the Masonic Hall, rented for the night since the synagogue building is not large enough to hold this overflowing festival crowd. Congressman Jerry Nadler and Lambda Legal CEO Rachel Tiven spoke about the importance of action, not just prayer, and the service was a true celebration of inclusion and love. The music was stirring and the atmosphere was electrifying. At the same time, the aftermath of the hate crime perpetrated in Orlando hung in the air.

I was honored and proud to stand on the bema at the end of the service with more than 20 of my rabbinic colleagues who were in attendance that Shabbat, supporting a call for LGBTQ civil rights and protections, as well as a call for Congress to common sense gun laws.

Along with the traditional Shabbat prayers, the service included the song "Over the Rainbow." While it was written for the 1939 movie "The Wizard of Oz," on this night, in this setting, on this Festival of Pride, the song's words rang out as liturgy: "Somewhere, over the rainbow, skies are blue, and those dreams that you dare to dream really do come true!"

Cantorial Comments



Summer is a time for rejuvenation for all of us – especially clergy since there are no major Jewish holidays or festivals to speak of! The only thing looming in the summer months is Tisha b'Av [this year on August 14]. The 9th

of Av is, traditionally, the most mournful day in the Jewish calendar, commemorating the anniversaries of a number of disasters in Jewish history, primarily the destruction of both the First and Second Temples in Jerusalem. Curiously, other tragedies have occurred and continue to occur on this very date, including the expulsion from England in 1290 CE; the edict of the expulsion from Spain in 1492; the date Germany declared war on Russia, effectively catapulting the First World War into motion, and many pivotal disasters during the Holocaust and beyond.

If there were ONLY one day a year when we needed to mourn... dayenu! But life just isn't that way and so, mingled with our joys and celebrations, are losses of loved ones, pain and illness, emotional instability and grief. Too often in recent years, there have been more and more times of collective grief because of mass killings and terrorist acts. The decision to have a Healing Service on June 25, as a follow-up to our Mental Health Awareness Month in May, was even more poignant in in the aftermath of the massacres in Orlando, Florida at the beginning of June.

I want to thank everyone who participated in this first Healing Service – from the Aliyot in the Torah service by our members three of those who spoke in May's Mental Health Awareness Month: Stephen Lehmann, Paul Zipperstein and Jeff Spears; Haftarah chanter: Les Kushner; Readers or submitters of original poetry and prose: Nancy Sidhu, Heidi Nimmo, Susan Damron, Dr. Phil Gold and to our courageous and inspirational speakers, Leone Hyman and Barb Smith. The Healing Service pamphlet includes songs, prayers and prose and can be used for any occasion of healing.

I feel it was very important to be able to get this off the ground and I hope that it may provide – perhaps a couple of times a year – an additional sacred space of comfort, community and support for all of us.

A few people have showed interest in the Mental Health First Aid training being offered by the San Bernardino County Department of Behavioral Health. 
