Rabbinic Reflections

Beginnings

Dear Members of Congregation Emanu El,

It is an honor for me to join you this year.

Congregation Emanu El is an outstanding synagogue. The history of the temple is inspiring. I admire the values of the temple: community, dedication to social justice, and commitment to Jewish life. I am looking forward to working with synagogue staff Rabbi Cohn, Cantor

Bern-Vogel, Judy Filsinger, Jerry Ripley, and Jillian Snyder

This is a time of transition at Congregation Emanu El. I met with many congregants during my visits. I am looking forward to working with each member of the synagogue to learn about your ideals and begin to bring to life the congregation's vision for the future.

I bring to Congregation Emanu El insights from working as an interim rabbi with congregations in Nebraska, Texas, North Carolina, Georgia, Massachusetts, Maryland, New York, New Jersey, Illinois, Connecticut, and Wisconsin and experience as a rabbi for eighteen years at North Shore Synagogue, in Syosset, New York. The interim rabbi helps a congregation in three main areas.

The Interim as Synagogue Rabbi. First and foremost, I will serve as your rabbi. I am available to provide pastoral care, will lead services, teach classes for adults and School for Jewish Living students, and help represent the synagogue in the community.

I appreciate the challenge of working with an unfamiliar rabbi for Bar and Bat Mitzvah, weddings, times of illness, and funerals. I will work with you to make each life cycle event personal and meaningful. \On a personal level, my family belongs to the synagogue where I grew-up, in Washington, DC. I always strive to provide members of the synagogue I serve the same care I look for my own family to receive.

At times there have been difficulties in synagogues with which I have worked. I am here to help everyone regardless of their position on any issue. Please let me know how I can assist you.

Affirmation of Synagogue Traditions. A key question for the interim rabbi is: "What are important traditions of the synagogue that should be affirmed?" The interim rabbi helps a congregation articulate its ideals. My goal as interim rabbi will be to provide consistency and maintain the traditions of the congregation.

As a note, please work with me as I learn the traditions of the synagogue. I speak with synagogue leaders to learn the traditions of a

congregation. Differences in the way I teach a class or lead a service may come from my personal strengths, inadvertent changes, or innovations that have been explored with synagogue groups. I view things as, "Works in progress," and look for your thoughts and guidance.

Visions for the Future. The year with an interim rabbi also provides synagogues that wish a time to explore new ideas for programs, innovations for worship, and experiences of Jewish learning. Synagogue growth is a process which should be sensitive and inclusive. I am available for you as a resource for personal questions about Jewish life and, as the synagogue would like, for growing from contemporary developments in the Reform movement and Jewish world.

I look forward to meeting members of the synagogue. Please call me if I can be of help to you, you have a family member with a special need, or if you know of a congregant who I should contact. Pastoral care is my highest priority.

The Torah offers a wonderful insight for Jewish life. It says, "Serve the Eternal with joy; come before the One with rejoicing." May we have this joy as we affirm the traditions of Congregation Emanu El, celebrate life, and shape dreams for the future.

Dr. Susan Damron Named Secretary of Temple Board of Directors



At its first meeting of the new temple administrative year Dr. Susan Damron was elected to the position of Secretary after having been nominated for that position by the newly installed temple president, Greg Weissman.

Susan was born and raised in Morristown, New Jersey. After completing a Bachelor's Degree at the University of Oregon, she attended graduate school at Colorado State University and earned a Ph.D. in Psychology. Her research interests included social skills training and communication styles in small group interactions. In 1978, she came to the newly-opened Loma Linda Veterans Medical Center, where she worked as a licensed psychologist for 28 years. Her specialties included stress management, communication skills training, and workplace coping skills. After retiring from the VA, Susan facilitated a multi-faith women's group exploring aging and helped women design events to mark life transitions.

Susan and Richard Taylor became members of Congregation Emanu El in 2015. An active member of Sisterhood, Susan served as co-Vice President of Membership in 2016-17 and is currently Sisterhood Vice President of Programs.

As secretary of the congregation, Susan is a member of both the Board of Directors and the Executive Committee. We are certain that she will bring her leadership skills as well as her love of Judaism and support of the Board of Directors.

Jillian Snyder Named Director of Education & Youth

Jillian Snyder has been named Director of Education & Youth of Congregation Emanu El and is beginning her duties on July 1, 2017. Along with directing our School for Jewish Living and youth programs, Ms. Snyder will also be working with Rabbi Crystal and Cantor Bern-Vogel in developing Shabbat family and holiday services and special holiday observances for pre-schoolers.

We look forward to the innovative programs that Ms. Snyder will create for our congregation.

Mental Health Awareness

The long, hot days of summer take us to the beach, out in the evenings for barbeques, splashing around in the pool, and drinking cooling tall glasses of ice tea. We slow down a bit, adjust to the kids out of school, relax our muscles. Maybe we read stories and have long conversations with friends, the kind that delve deep into our lives and hearts.

In May we told some stories that came from deeply felt lives. We've put them up on the Congregation Emanu El website and urge you to take a look. You may have heard them during the Erev Shabbat services and want to have a further look with more time to think about them. Or you missed them entirely and might like to see how those stories went. It's easy. Go to emanuelsb.org, choose Tikkun Olam from the dropdown menu, then "mental health".

For example, the prince said: "The experience I have had is that once you start talking about it, you realize that actually you're part of quite a big club." It took him a long time to start talking about it, a long time to even think honestly about it. And then his life changed for the better. Take a look at the trajectory of his young life, how much he went through, and how he learned to improve his life and those of others.

For example, one of us said: "I knew intimately the pain of stigma, but didn't know when we founded the program if I had the strength to share my personal story of mental illness. Obviously, I do have that strength and I am so much healthier and happier for it." What is that story and how is it continuing to unfold? Look for it also on the website.

And in one more example, one of us said: "So the effect of someone playing a lyre and that of a comforting dog may not be that different." What's that about? Check out Mental Health Awareness In Action on our website.

Do you have any stories you could share? Talking to each other about the truth of our lives gives us strength and promotes health. Remember that song - "People who need people are the luckiest people in the world"?
