June brings our three-fold annual harvest festival cycle to a close on the 5776 calendar. This month we celebrate the giving of the Torah at Mt. Sinai with the holiday of Shavuot.

The holiday is called "*Zman Matan HaTorah*" or the Time

of the Giving of the Torah. It is interestingly not called the Time of the Receiving of the Torah. That is because we receive the Torah each and every time we learn one of its lessons and live that lesson. A great place to learn and live those lessons is at Congregation Emanu El.

Often, summer is time that we see a decrease in attendance and participation in Shabbat services and other programs. School is out, family vacations are in, and the heat makes us a little more lethargic. While I hope that you will enjoy your vacations and your air conditioning, I also hope that you will spend some time with us at Congregation Emanu El this summer.

This summer, I would also like for all of you to know about a few of my summer projects. Firstly, I will be convening a new Rabbi's advisory long-range planning committee. There will be three sub-committees: finance & administration; vouth, education & adult education; and membership & community building. I expect that this group of advisors will help create a vision that will bring us into the future. The finance & strongly administration committee will work with me to explore solutions for our financial issues. The education committee will work with me as we begin a re-envisioning of our school and youth programs, as creating new programs for adults. The final group will look at strengthening our community by investigating areas of improvement in the serves that we provide to our members.

As part of the re-envisioning of our school, I have taken on the task of returning to school to study the latest and greatest in the world of Jewish education. To this end, this summer I will begin studying in the Executive Master of Arts in Jewish Education Program at Hebrew Union College. I am confident that the lessons of this program will lead to tremendous growth in our educational programs.

This is in part, a follow-up to last month's Mental Health Awareness Month, but also an opportunity for anyone remembering loved ones, as well to offer blessings to those of us who may physically ill or weak OR seeking spiritual and communal support as we are caring for aging or ailing parents.

We all experience loss, grief and pain on so many different levels and inevitably at different times in our lives. This will be a more creative Shabbat morning service that will incorporate traditional and contemporary music, psalms, original poetry and readings and allow participants to share brief personal stories in the context of the service. The Torah portion could not be more appropriate for that Shabbat. In *Be'ha'a lot'cha*, Miriam is stricken with leprosy and Moses prays in Numbers 12:13 - El na r'fa na la - "please God, heal her!" There will be a handout of texts and music as a supplement to the service.

Presidential Perspectives



Thursday, May 19, marked the annual meeting of Congregation Emanu El. Attendance was about 50 people representing approximately 25 member units. Given that we currently number about 210 member units the vast majority of you did not attend so I will

catch you up on the highlights of the meeting.

The most notable aspect of Rabbi Sherwood's report was his activity, as a representative of our congregation, in Redlands and the wider community. He has been the external face of Congregation Emanu El and in my estimation we have benefited from his interactions with the civic and interfaith organizations of our communities.

I called attention to our revitalized Seniors Group, thanking Gloria Cutler, Barry Lowenstein and Rabbi Hillel Cohn for their efforts in reestablishing this program. Our seniors were being neglected and this project brings front and center an important demographic of our congregation.

The congregation received a gift of \$15,000 (yes, you read that correctly) from Sisterhood. But wait, there's more. The gift shop, run by Sisterhood, gave us \$5,000 from the proceeds of their operation. I encourage all of you to thank the members of our Sisterhood. They bring spirituality to our congregation and they are focused on Tikkun Olam.

While we are talking dollars and cents, the Scrip committee, Cheryl Sukenik, Julie Strain and Carol Wizer presented us with a check from the Scrip account of \$6,000. Year over year, our use of scrip has increased but we are still woefully underachieving. If our members used scrip only to buy their groceries we would get a check for \$15,000 next year. That, my friends, would make an entire mortgage payment.

After months of research and discussion, the Board of Directors passed a resolution permitting access to the contents of the Harris Trust. Here to fore used exclusively for the upkeep of the building, the money contained therein may now be used to pay our mortgage debt should we be unable to do so with the Mortgage Reduction Fund. As our treasurer Stuart Sweet pointed out, this is not a solution to our problem, merely a mechanism to buy us time to develop a plan.

Greg Weissman and Karen Levine were the recipients of the annual President's Award for their unflagging efforts in programming and fundraising in the past year. From Comedy Night to An Evening with Ed Asner, from The Top Chef fundraiser to the Rabbi Cohn tribute dinner, we were entertained a high level throughout the year. Also from our fundraising committee, comes a reimagining of the Simcha Wall from the "E" St. synagogue. On the west wall of the sanctuary will bloom our new Simcha Tree. The branches will initially be populated with leaves representing the original Simcha Wall donors. The tree will serve as an ongoing fund raiser as we purchase leaves to commemorate the joyous moments of our lives. We are preserving our memories past, present and future.

Next year it would be a treat to see 100 congregants representing 50 member units in attendance. Although all members are welcome anytime at board meetings, the annual meeting is an opportunity to make your voice heard. Come and enjoy the BBQ sponsored by the Board of Directors and participate in the governance of your synagogue

Treasurer's Report



Friends,

For those of you unable to come to our congregational meeting in May, I offer a brief recap.

Expenses far outpaced income in April, which is normal for this time of year.

We ended the month with a \$28,000 deficit. However, cash on hand will allow us to make it through the summer without dipping into our line of credit.

For the 2016 fiscal year as a whole, I project an operating surplus of \$77,000 due to our having received \$134,000 as the final installment payment from the estate of Burt and Sally Brin. We are all thankful to the Brin family without whose generosity we would not have made it through the year. They are an example to us all.

The budget for the coming fiscal year has not been finalized but is expected to include a small increase in dues income (this does not necessarily mean dues are going up) as well as increased spending on the School for Jewish Living. Labor expenses are being adjusted but as this is a human resources matter, I can't comment further. On the whole, we expect to run a deficit of \$74,000 in fiscal 2017 due to mortgage expenses and lowered expectations for fundraising. This is the perfect time to chair a large fundraiser so please contact me or any board member if you are interested.

The Executive Committee has been authorized by the Board to use money from the Melville Harris Trust for mortgage reduction when the need arises and this should keep us solvent until the end of calendar year 2019.

As you know, I remain dedicated to our congregation and will be moving into the role of Second Vice President. I am happy to continue talking with every congregant about any issue, but your treasurer Marv Reiter will be a better resource for financial questions.

Mental Health Awareness June 2016

Is anything more tragic than a vibrant young person whose despair is so great that he or she takes his or her own life? We can see the splendid future in front of her or him, but for a period of time, pain blinds him or her. Our hearts break for all the family and friends.

Imagine how wonderful if one person can see the signs leading up to such a tragedy and can stop it. Each of us has the potential to make the difference between life and death for those around us.

We learned how to make that critical difference at Citrus Valley High School in Redlands in May. "Let's Talk About It," a program about suicide awareness, was offered to our communities by the Redlands Unified School District. It included a totally amazing room full of resources, a talk by Dr. Daniel Reidenberg, a national expert on suicide prevention and mental health, and finally a discussion by two panels. A panel of local adult experts encompassed incredible wisdom and experience, and included not only counselors but also the Redlands Police Chief and the Pastor of the Congregational church in town who had been involved in the aftermath of a rash of teen suicides in a town in New Jersey. Sitting on the other panel were Redlands high schoolers who help other young people in times of mental health crisis. The wisdom and experience on that panel rivaled the adults'.

So, how could you someday make the absolute difference for someone of any age?

- Pay attention to prolonged depression get help even if no suicide is contemplated
- Pay attention to any talk about dying, being better off dead, terrible emotional pain, great guilt, hopelessness
- Pay attention to sudden changes in behavior, such as sleep patterns, worrying strange behavior, giving away things important to the person, activities that indicate a plan to kill him/herself
- Talk to the person, listen non-judgmentally. Ask directly: Have you had thoughts of suicide? Don't shy away from the word.
- If the answer is yes, be calm and strong, get help, help the person get help
- Stay with the person, see him or her through the crisis, and let him or her know you will be there
- Keep your mind and heart open

- Give all the love and friendship you can
- If suicidal action is imminent, call 911

And as a congregation, we also can make the difference. Let's be open and welcoming. As Dr. Reidenberg said, connections are all important, connections to family, faith communities, friends. Let's engage, listen and talk to everyone important to us, and let's make everyone important to us. Let's support and love them.


