

Rabbinic Reflection



We have just entered the month of Adar, a month that is given great prominence in the Talmud. The Talmud states that: *mi she'nikhnas Adar marbin b'simchah* (Ta'anit: 29a). That means: When one enters into the month of Adar, one should increase in

happiness. After the past few month's of listening to the political rhetoric, driving through flooding after rainstorms, and hearing about bomb threats at Jewish pre-schools, who couldn't use a little happiness?! With the 24-hour news cycle, TMZ and social media, we spend quite a bit of time dwelling on the bad, the argument, and the gossip. You don't believe me?!?! Just turn on your TV, your computer or your smart phone. The holiday of Purim—the reason that Adar is a joyful month—teaches us to look for the good in life. Purim is not a children's holiday, despite what you may have heard elsewhere. Purim is a holiday filled with worldly themes and important adult lessons. When we read the Megillah and celebrate its lessons, we become empowered by its words. On Saturday, March 11, we will boo Haman and the pure evil that he epitomizes. We will cheer Mordechai and Esther for their fearless rescue of the Jewish people. We will celebrate the joy of the triumph of good over evil—a lesson that is perhaps more relevant now than it has been in many decades. Certainly, there is misogyny, xenophobia and fear mongering in the Book of Esther, but we see that we can overcome them as we build a better world. Real world lessons for our times. In retelling the story of Queen Esther and company, we relive the miracle of Purim—that we survived despite the threat of annihilation. In recounting the defeat of Haman, we are reminded of the danger of leaving evil unchallenged. The Book of Esther is the only Book in the Tanach (Hebrew Bible) that does not mention God. God's face is hidden in the story (hence why we wear costumes), and we are compelled to focus on where else God may be hidden in our lives. Finally, the Talmudic dictate (increase happiness) reminds us to celebrate the simchas more than we dwell on the sadness. And of course, our inner child gets to play and be silly with our actual children! Happy Purim! Please join us (in costume) on March 11, for dinner at 6pm and Megillah reading at 7pm. Remember, dinner is free if you come in costume! And don't forget our fabulous Purim Carnival the next morning, March 12, with games, food, entertainment and more, you are bound to have a joyful Purim!

Presidential Perspectives



We are fortunate to worship in a lovely synagogue in the peaceful community of Redlands. It behooves us, however, to be aware of changes in the social and political climate across our country. There

against Jewish have been threats made Community Centers in 27 states (NPR, February 21, 2017). Sometime during the weekend of February 18-19th more than 100 headstones were vandalized at a Jewish cemetery in Missouri (WSJ, February 21, 2017). Three mosques have been set ablaze, two in Texas and one in Washington (USA Today, January 29, 2017). These events and others have led your temple leadership to take a closer look at our temple security. To this end, I listened in on a phone meeting sponsored by the Anti-Defamation League at which FBI agents weighed in on the proper response to events like Subsequently, we have contacted the Redlands Police Department and reviewed procedures in the event CEE receives a threat. We were encouraged to maintain close contact with local congregations of all faiths to stay current on happenings in our area. Our congregants Nancy Sidhu and Steve Becker have both represented us in the Redlands Area Interfaith Council, building bridges with many local houses of worship. We are also researching a system which will make entry into our building more secure for employees and congregants alike. In addition we are considering the addition of parking lot cameras to our facility. We enjoy a remarkably placid existence in Redlands, but we would be remiss if we did not recognize our changing national environment and take steps to ensure our safetv.

Please be aware of some upcoming activities in March. On Saturday March 4th, at 7:00 PM the annual CEE Variety Show will take place in our social hall. Come see members of our congregation display their diverse talent. Wednesday, March 8th, at 7:00 PM, the inaugural Rabbi Hillel Cohn Endowed lecture at Cal State University San Bernardino features Rabbi David Ellenson, Past President and Chancellor Emeritus of Hebrew Union College. Everyone likes chocolate, so plan to attend our Chocolate Seder

on March 26th at 7:00 PM. Enjoy traditional Seder foods with a delightful chocolate twist as we prepare to greet Passover in April. Finally, our Community Seder will take place April 11th from 6:00-9:00 PM. Mental Health Awareness



March 2017

As advocates for people with mental illness as well as for those who love them (that essentially means all of us), we each

receive lots of information in our email boxes about mental illness.

The title of a recent mental health presentation in Riverside deserves attention in this column:

"I am Not Sick, I Don't Need help!" Helping the Seriously Mentally Ill Seek Treatment

The program presented an opportunity to learn why many people with serious mental illness don't believe they need help or see obvious symptoms. It is not being stubborn or in denial, the most common reason is limited insight into his or her illness, and it can become a serious obstacle to helping someone.

Program participants learned about LEAP an acronym for Listen, Empathize, Agree, Partner. LEAP focuses on transforming relationships by gaining trust, and lowering anger and tension to develop genuine understanding and empathy. All are needed to make it possible to partner with a loved one and help them receive the help that they need.

Remember, wearing a lime green awareness ribbon is a simple way of saying I am willing to talk about mental illness in order to break the stigma that keeps many with mental illness from seeking help. The most significant fact to be shared is that at any time, one in four Americans is facing a mental illness challenge.


