Rabbinic Reflection



May is Mental Health Awareness month at Congregation Emanu El. Throughout the month, we will seek to raise our consciousness as we work to end the stigma of mental illness. Each Friday night, the evening's sermon will focus on mental health related

issues, and we will feature a member of our congregation sharing some personal thoughts on the importance of awareness.

Jewish tradition has long recognized the importance of having a healthy body as well as a healthy mind. Our morning liturgy contains blessings giving thanks for our bodies, our souls and our minds. We recognize that to be a healthy individual, we must maintain the health of all three of these elements that make us the complete person that we are. When we ignore any one of these three aspects of self, complete health eludes us. Nevertheless, while discussions of physical and spiritual health are commonplace in today's society, somehow mental health has acquired a stigma that has rendered the topic off limits in polite conversation. Judaism teaches the exact opposite. The traditional Mi She'beirach prayer for healing, which we say together publicly, asks God to heal not only our bodies, but our souls/minds as well. This prayer, however, cannot be our only public acknowledgement of the importance of mental health. We cannot let healing for those who suffer from mental illness be confined because of the stigma that surrounds the conversation.

An inspiration to act can be found in the rituals of Sukkot. We are commanded to bring together the *etrog* with the branches of three plants to create the *lulav*. In discussing the *lulav*, *chazal* (the the rabbis of old) state that if any of the species are excluded, the *lulav* is unfit for use. They then explain in *Midrash Vayikra Rabba* 30:12, that this is really a metaphor for humanity, teaching that, "No human is expendable. If one is slighted or excluded, the whole of society is unfit." May this lesson inspire us to work toward ending the stigma of mental illness.

As you walk into Congregation Emanu El this month, please take a green ribbon from the basket just inside the front door. This ribbon signifies mental health awareness and the commitment to end the stigma associated with mental illness. Please join us in this important task.

Dear friends,

If you have been reading my articles you have an idea of what the next few months will bring. As expected, income of \$24,000 (mostly from dues payments) came nowhere close to covering

our expenses of \$46,000, leaving us with a roughly \$22,000 deficit for the month. Among the challenges this month were repairs to the sanctuary lighting and doors, plus repairs to our sound system and other physical plant maintenance. It's clear we're past the "honeymoon period" for our new building and we will need to continue to invest in our home as it needs repairs.

I hope you'll join me and the rest of the Board of Directors for our annual meeting. This is your chance to really catch up with all of the changes in our congregation, to learn what is ahead of us and celebrate our accomplishments. This is more than just a requirement, it's our pleasure to host the congregation in an open forum where you can be heard. Of course, every board meeting is open to any and all comers, but it's sadly a rare occurrence to see our congregants at a board meeting. Our annual meeting gives you a chance to really see how the leadership works. I would especially hope that all our new members from the previous 12 months join us. I have enjoyed welcoming each and every one of you to the Emanu El family and I hope we all grow together into a much larger family.

I am completing the second year of my tenure as your treasurer at the end of June and it has been my pleasure to shepherd the congregation's financials and help strengthen us for the future. However, I could not possibly do it alone. I would like to take the rest of this article to thank my partners in this enterprise, without whom I would have been lost from day one.

I started as treasurer on the day that Rabbi Douglas Kohn left us, and days before our beloved former administrator Roberta Darrow left for the job of her dreams. I would have had no idea how to even start without the tireless patience and effort of Mike Kress. Mike, our former treasurer, former President, and recipient of the Rabbi Norman F. Feldheym award for his tireless service, was patient and generous with his guidance and I remain in his debt, as we all do.

It was my pleasure to welcome Judy Filsinger as our temple administrator on her very

first day. All of us know Judy by her quick smile, her gentle demeanor and constant good spirits but not everyone knows of her decades of bookkeeping experience including a stint at Congregation Emanu El in the 1980s. Judy makes my job easy by doing all the hard work herself, and I am extremely grateful for all of her efforts.

Finally, I would like to thank Marv Reiter for all his advice. Marv has spent a career as a certified public accountant and the knowledge that he brings to the table has been invaluable. I have only known Marv a short time but I feel like I've already learned so much from him. I'm very lucky to have someone so generous with his time at my side.

As we all look forward to the future, we all must rely on each other, trust each other, and believe in the shared vision of a bright and vibrant Jewish community in the San Bernardino area. That vision must include responsible stewardship of our finances, a tradition I've been proud to carry on for the past two years. I thank you for the opportunity to have done so.



We Survived... At Last I Speak

Leon Malmed, Author



We observe the eve of Holocaust Memorial Day with a candle lighting, memorial prayers and a guest speaker: Leon Malmed.

Leon Malmed was born in 1937 in Compiègne, France. Mr. Malmed will share the story of how he and his sister Rachel escaped from the Holocaust in Occupied France. When Leon and Rachel's parents were deported and killed at Auschwitz-Birkenau, their downstairs neighbors, Henri and Suzanne Ribouleau, gave the children a home and family and sheltered them through subsequent roundups, threats, air raids, and the war's privations. His story of survival is an inspiring one. We are honored to share his story with our community as we remember both the victims and the heroes of the Shoah.
