Rabbinic Reflection



November is the month of Thanksgiving, and this year that takes on a double meaning. The lunar and solar calendars have aligned in such a way that the High Holy Days appeared later on the solar calendar than most years. So it is in this not so common year that we say

thank you to all those whose participation brought beauty and spirituality to our High Holy Days and Sukkot services.

The Rabbis of the Talmud explain that we are to say 100 blessings each and every day (Tractate Menachot 43b). That provides us with 100 opportunities each and every day to give thanks. Rabbi Abraham Joshua Heschel famoulsy taught that "Our goal should be to live life in radical amazement, to look at the world in a way that takes nothing for granted. Everything is phenomenal, everything is incredible, to be spiritual is to be constantly amazed."

The Talmudic requirement for 100 daily blessings is our mandate to say thank you to God for each moment of radical amazement. The origins of Thanksgiving are steeped in this very idea. In 1621, when the early colonists celebrated the first Thanksgiving, they recalled the Fall harvest festival of Sukkot as accounted in the Torah, and sat in radical amazement at the new found life that they and begun in a new land. To combine the Jewish and American ideals of Thanksgiving, at your Thanksgiving dinner this year, you might offer some traditional words of gratitude from our Jewish tradition:

Psalm 100 A Psalm of Thanksgiving. Shout to Adonai, all the earth. Serve Adonai with gladness; Come into God's presence with singing. Know that Adonai is God; It is God who made us, And we belong to God; We are God's people, And the sheep of God's pasture. Enter God's gates with thanksgiving, And into God's courtyards with praise; Give thanks to God, and bless God's name. For Adonai is good; God's mercy endures forever: And God's faithfulness is for all generations.

Treasurer's Report



Dear fellow Congregants, I hope all of you had an enjoyable Rosh Hashanah and an easy fast on Yom Kippur.

I am pleased to advise that we have secured a new loan on our building. We hope to close this loan within

the next 30 days. The Board of Directors of Congregation Emanuel has determined that it is in the best financial interest of the Congregation to apply certain endowment funds toward the reduction of the current mortgage. As you are likely aware, the return on investments held in our funds, in today's economy, is at a very low rate. While our current mortgage rate was reasonable (4.99%), with the considerable payment, we were able to negotiate that down to 4.25%. Further, we asked Pacific Premier Bank to allow us to pay interest only for the next two years. The effect of this will enable us to accumulate back some of the funds from the endowments.

Overall, we anticipate that we will reduce our cash outflow approximately \$8,800 per month for the next 24 months and for the 60 months following, about \$6,000 per month. This will enable us to develop our programs and hopefully grow our membership.

We currently are operating our Congregation within our budget and hope to make our Synagogue more attractive to members and increase our service to our congregants.

Mental Health Awareness

November 2016 THANK YOU!



Thirty people filled up tables in Congregation Emanu El's social hall to learn with two trainers from San Bernardino County's

Department of Behavioral Health in September. Victoria Hall and Joanne Mitchell shared with us their expertise and their caring attitudes on two Sundays. A great THANK YOU to all who chose to spend their time and energy to learn how to cope with a mental health crisis. And a delicious thank you to all of you who provided snacks during the 8 hours we spent together.

And please remember ALGEE, that cute and cuddly koala. (This is a secret message to all who attended the course. But if you'd like to know ALGEE, I'm sure the participants would be happy to introduce you.)

The goal of all the trainings going on around the country is to instruct as many people as possible to recognize and handle a crisis. As of this bulletin's deadline, a bill is making its way through the US Congress to provide \$15 million to encourage Mental Health First Aid training of all our teachers, first responders and veterans. Late September the bill passed the House of Representatives.

Around the nation, we now have about 700,000 people trained by 10,500 trainers – and this is before any federal help. Imagine every teacher knowing what to do in a mental health crisis, and every police, sheriff, fire fighter, and veteran.

And with every step forward we're diminishing the stigma. Thank you for being part of this societal change.

Also last month, Congregation Emanu El and Mental Health Awareness In Action won the annual service award from the Christian Counseling Service here in Redlands. Our president, Craig Beasley, our past president, Paul Zipperstein, our youth advisor, Jessica Campbell and our husbands Dip and Jeff joined both of us at the award dinner. We also gave the dinner talk to people from around the area, explaining what we've been doing at Emanu El for the past couple of years. We hope to inspire others to do something similar, helping to bring understanding and empathy to everyone in their communities.

And with every step forward, we're diminishing stigma.

Last month, Rabbi Sherwood participated in a panel on The Impact of Culture and Faith on Parental Mental Health at Loma Linda University, organized by the Inland Empire Perinatal Mental Health Collaborative. More details next month. And we'll be offering an evening at the temple to discuss postpartum depression and anxiety with someone from the Collaborative in the coming months.

Also, in the coming months, we will need your help to continue our work here at the temple. Don't hesitate to volunteer.

Enjoy a cornucopia of love as well as good food this Thanksgiving.




