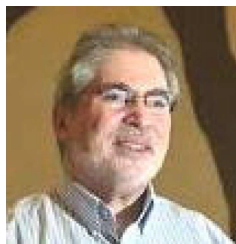

Rabbinic Reflections

The Search for Spirituality: Religious Life for the Modern Seeker



A young man wanted to meditate. He decided to go to a monastery. The rule at this spiritual center was that a person could only say two words a day. The rest of the time was spent in silence.

At the end of the first day the seeker came to the teacher. He said, "Food bad!"

The next day he returned to his guide and said, "Bed hard!"

The third day the seeker came to the meeting with his bag packed. He said, "I quit!"

The master said, "You've done nothing but complain since you got here!"

The story represents the quest of many people today for spirituality and meaning in life. Rabbi Lawrence Kushner was one of the early leaders to talk about spirituality and faith for modern Jews. He explored the classical texts of Jewish mysticism to create a new vocabulary of faith.

The story of Jacob's ladder provides a paradigm for religious life. Jacob was traveling and stopped to sleep for the night. He had a dream of angels going up and coming down from heaven. God promises Jacob that he and his descendants will be a blessing for humanity. Jacob wakes up and says, "How filled with awe is this place, and I did not know it!" This story offers several insights about spirituality.

Mindfulness. Like Jacob's sudden awakening, all spirituality traditions begin with the practice of learning to pay attention, to be mindful, of ourselves, our relationships with others, and our place in the world. As an example, there is a Buddhist meditation practice where a person sits and concentrates on breathing. The idea is to learn to fully pay attention to only one thing. This develops the habit of mindfulness that can be expanded to all of life.

The Divine. In the story, Jacob realized that God was with him all of the time, he only needed to open his eyes to become aware of the Divine presence in the world. Rabbi Kushner asks the question, "When do I feel close to God?" not "Do I believe in God?" I have been moved when I have asked people this question. I recall a father saying he felt close to God when he watched his daughter being born. A woman in her 50's spoke of sitting with her mother and holding her hand in the hospital, and a teenage boy told of seeing the funnel cloud of a tornado.

The Call to Justice. Moses first experienced God at the Burning Bush. He did not just rejoice in his freedom, but was called to save the Jewish people from Egyptian slavery. When a person feels close to God, their soul becomes open and they want to do acts of kindness to help others.

I have been engaged in the world of Jewish spirituality for the last 15 years. I have studied classical texts of Jewish mystics, practiced Jewish meditation, and learned about the confluence between yoga and Judaism. Jewish spirituality is a lens through which we live our lives with compassion. We learn to appreciate the presence of the Divine in the world, our shared bond with all life, and feel called to bring peace to the world.

This month I will be offering a two evening workshops entitled *Worship with Joy: The Mystery, Majesty and Ecstasy of Prayer*. The program will show how the hidden structure of the service relates to the most important events in our lives. We will talk about the different experiences we have of prayer and the way prayer renews our souls.

I hope you will join me.

Cantorial Comments



A month of spiritual and social justice opportunities...

The current Hebrew month, Cheshvan or Marcheshvan is often referred to as 'the bitter month' because it is devoid of any Jewish holidays – but after the intensity of the sacred month of Tishrei [Selichot, Rosh Hashanah,

Yom Kippur, Sukkot, Simchat Torah] Cantors and Rabbis usually consider it a welcome respite!

Nevertheless, there are some significant observances this month that you won't want to miss. You may remember that we celebrated Rosh Chodesh Elul with an exhilaratingly theatrical evening in August, pledging our part in the Reform Movement's Brit Olam Covenant – to participate in and heighten social justice awareness of the current plight of so many of our brothers and sisters in this country. Along with hundreds of Reform congregations throughout the country, we will be observing the Reform Immigration Shabbat on November 10th. In the Hashkiveinu, often known to us as our bedtime prayer, the prayer for peace, we sing *Ufros aleinu sukkat shlomecha*, 'spread over us Your sukkah of peace'. As we can glean from our Jewish teachings, we must always remember that no shelter is truly complete until every shelter is complete. The sukkah reminds us that rather than stay enclosed and shut away from the world, we must look outward at the world beyond our own lives. Seventy-nine years ago, on the 10th of November, Jews in Germany woke up to the flames of Kristallnacht that ravaged homes, stores and synagogues. And the world still seems to be in a slumber... Please be a part of the wake-up call!

Shabbat morning November 11th is our next Healing Service. We hope you will attend and be part of our healing community in worship, song and meditation. And on the following day, Sunday, November 12th, at 4pm, this year's Redlands Area Interfaith Council (R.A.I.C.) Thanksgiving Service will be held at First Congregational Church, [northwest corner of Olive and Cajon.] It will feature an Interfaith Choir consisting of singers from a number of area congregations including Congregation Emanu El!

I look forward to leading the first Melava Malka 'accompanying the queen' event on Saturday, November 18th – Rosh Chodesh Kislev - sponsored by our Sisterhood. In a short two-hour gathering, we will honor the Sabbath Queen, with Havdalah on the patio, special foods, text study, singing and dancing, accompanying Shabbat Ha-Malka, as she departs until next Shabbat.

Finally, if you are interested in participating in Cantillation classes, please contact me if you are interested. All levels welcome.

Presidential Perspectives



For Jews the world over, this time of year finds us reflective of our recent High Holy Days; the struggles of the past year and the promise for the year to come. For me this is always a time to reflect on the transgressions of yesteryear as well as my many blessings.

During my Kol Nidre appeal speech on Erev of Rosh Hashanah I made a passionate plea for our congregation to "Reprioritize" the importance of Temple in their everyday life. I asked that by making this personal commitment it will ensure that the future of Congregation Emanu El will never be compromised by casualness or indifference. These are important times for our congregation as we continue to see a constriction in the number and engagement of congregants. However, I continue to see the dedication of our core membership everyday. The various committees made up of members, and the steadfast commitment of our lay leadership, gives me hope for the future.

I set a goal of \$30,000. for our Kol Nidre pledge drive. And while at this point we have fallen just short of that goal, I'm please to say that through your generosity we have raised a total of \$27,982.00, making this the most successful Kol Nidre appeal in recent memory. Again, another clear sign that our members care and are committed at their core to our beloved Temple.

Work continues on the search for our next settled rabbi. We have already completed the first round of Skype interviews with potential candidates, some of whom you will soon get to meet in person. Many thanks to our Rabbinic Search Task Force, and it's chair Justin Swant, for their diligent work.

On a personal note, I'm sorry to say that I will be taking what I hope will be a brief leave of absence as your temple president. On May 3, 2017 I was diagnosed with a rare blood cancer (MDS) which requires me to undergo a Stem Cell Transplant. Doctors at City of Hope are now preparing me for this procedure which can take anywhere from six months to a year to fully recover from. In the meantime, Vice President Stuart Sweet will be assuming the day to day duties of President, in my absence. I thank Stuart for his continued commitment to our congregation and trust that he will enjoy the same encouragement and support from our members as I have. As I am able, I plan to continue advising Justin Swant to help steer our Rabbinic Search Task Force.

It's been said that when you have your health you have everything. I'm learning quickly how true that is. I wish for each of you a new year filled with good health and the strength to make each and every day full of hope and promise.

Thank you for your support and commitment to Congregation Emanu El.

Maybe you're living with depression and want to ask for understanding and support. Or maybe you want to help someone else and let them know you're there for them.

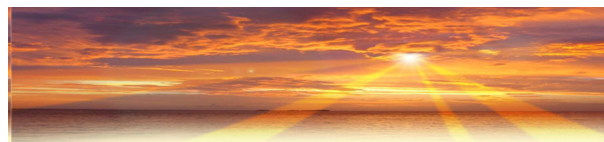
Either way, it starts with a conversation.

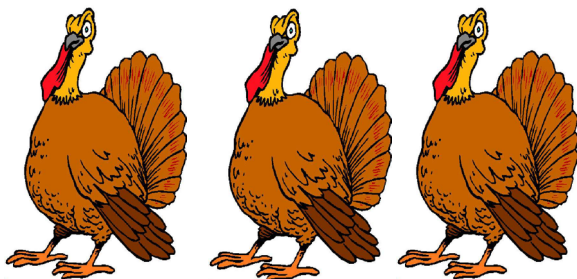

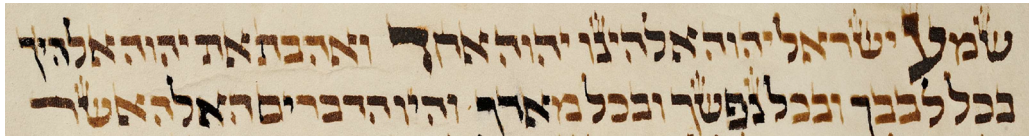

The Art, Traditions and History of Torah Scrolls

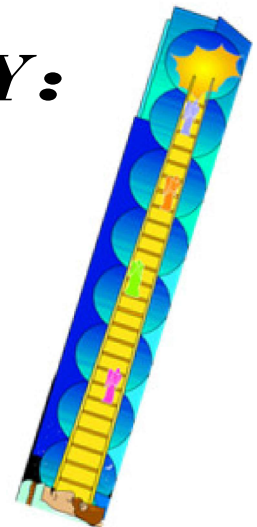

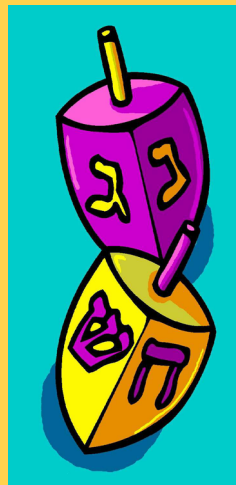

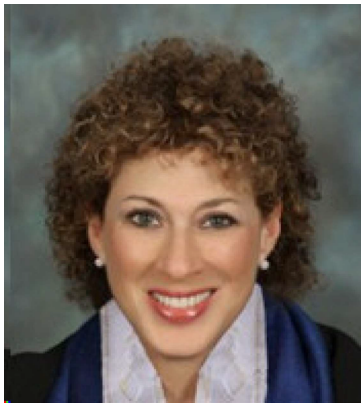
