



Rabbinic Reflection



The month of Elul is the season of reflection. This month on the Hebrew calendar is a time to review the year that has passed and prepare for the New Year. It is a time during which we engage in the age old process of *cheshbon hanefesh*, an accounting of

the soul. This tradition teaches that we look inward, contemplating the good and the not so good of our year gone by, and making vows to ourselves for the year to come. One of the classic texts that we read during Yom Kippur, the Book of Jonah, also reflects upon this idea. For many years until his death last year, famed actor Leonard Nimoy read the Book of Jonah at Temple Israel of Hollywood each Yom Kippur. In his reflections on *cheshbon hanefesh*, he offered these words of poetic inspiration:

I am not immortal. Whatever I put off for later May never be. Whoever doesn't know now That I love them May never know. I have killed time. I have squandered it. I have lost days...weeks... As a man of unlimited wealth Might drop coins on the street And never look back. I know now, that there will be an end, A limit. But there is time Valuable and precious time To walk. talk, breathe. Time to touch. taste. care. To warm the child Who is cold and lonely. There is time to love I promise myself... I will. I am I am ready I am ready to give I am ready to give and to receive I am ready to give and to receive love

May his words inspire you as the month of *cheshbon hanefesh* begins.

Cantorial Comments



We have arrived once again. Through tragedy and celebration, passing and birth. Another year. Another opportunity to reflect, to lament, to contemplate. Not that we don't have the opportunity to do this each and every day of the year,

but how many of us really take the time, to spend a full day or two in prayer, worship, song, contemplation? Of course there are other ways to do this – bike riding, swimming, jogging, reading, writing poetry, golfing – but the main difference is that when we come to the synagogue to worship at the High Holy Days, in particular, we are part of a community.

It is incumbent upon us not only to share joy and rejoice in the New Year together, but also to join as a community in pleading to God for forgiveness. For the sins of our world, the sins against God and for the personal sins in words or deeds we have uttered against our teachers, our students, our friends, our parents, our partners. Even in our very deep, personal prayers, we know we are not completely alone.

Music is a key part of our High Holy Days – with a few simple notes – the High Holy Day mode [nusach] heralds the familiar melody Shanah Tovah Tikateivu helping us recall Rosh Hashanahs past and reminding us of the spiritual journey we have ahead of us. The additional prayers and liturgy which Zochreinu [Remember us] Unetanetokef [both added to the HHD Amida] Sh'ma Koleinu [Hear our Voice] Hineni [Here I am} Avinu Malkeinu [O God, our Ruler] Sim Shalom, Tavo l'fanecha, Ashamnu [We have sinned] and Kol Nidre [a release of vows which has become the name of an entire service preceding Yom Kippur] to mention only a few, are reason enough to spend time in the synagogue for a few hours one or two days a year and perhaps for once, not look at the clock. Don't worry, none of us want to spend the entire day [except on Yom Kippur] in the synagogue; but we hope you will join us with open hearts and minds as we prepare for a communal journey of our souls. Beginning with the 'overture' to the High Holy Days on the evening of Selichot, we look forward to seeing you and your families and friends as we

enter the holy gates of 5777.

Shanah Tovah Tikateivu – Ira and Sam join me in wishing you a Happy, Healthy and a Sweet New Year.

POSTPARTUM DEPRESSION

Here's the most wonderful event in a woman's life – a new baby! So why does she feel weepy and irritable? Why is she plagued by such sadness? This is a happy time – isn't it?

And she doesn't tell anyone and tries to hide her mood swings and restlessness. Something is terribly wrong with her, so she thinks.

But she's in good company. Most women have these "baby blues." They usually go away after a couple of weeks and after a while her worry and guilt begin to fade.

Or, it gets worse and develops into full-scale postpartum depression, anxiety, or psychosis. And then it needs to be recognized and treated. Mom and baby shouldn't have to suffer needlessly.

Finally, we're wising up a bit. Starting just this spring, national depression screening guidelines include new mothers.

Want to learn more? Go to the National Institute of Mental Health's website and find their facts on postpartum depression. Or if you'd like something closer to home, check out the Inland Empire Perinatal Mental Health Collaborative. They have open meetings in Riverside and in San Bernardino during the year, as well as a good website. And they're offering an all-day conference, "Culture, Faith, and their Impact on Parental Mental Health" at Loma Linda University October 27th. Look for more on that in the coming weeks.

And, yes, there's an app. If you've experienced postpartum depression or psychosis you can join a study to develop effective treatments. Get the PPD Act app for iPhone and Android.

New babies are enough to handle. Women shouldn't have to cope alone with their wild hormone changes. And let's get rid of the stigma. Let's not also douse them with needless shame.




