Rabbinic Reflections



The beginning of the new year is always an important turning point. The old tradition of making new year's resolutions still persists and along with it comes the inevitable failure to keep many of those resolutions. as the old saying goes, "The road to hell is paved with good intentions." Nevertheless, it is good for us to take a little time

to think about what we can do to improve our lives - physically, emotionally, and spiritually.

For our congregation, this is an especially significant juncture. My commitment to return to serve as your rabbi for one year as the search for a new rabbi proceeds is at its mid-way point. There were numerous things that I hoped would be accomplished during this transitional year. Some of them have been accomplished, and it is good to note them. The reevaluation of our educational program and the bringing on to our staff a trained Jewish educator, Rabbi Jay Sherwood, has resulted in a new spirit and a greatly improved School for Jewish Living program. Fortunately, the search for a competent administrator resulted in our being able to bring Judy Filsinger back to manage our entire temple operation including its office, finances and facilities. She brings to that position her manifold skills and, above all, her warm and caring heart. Attendance at our services has, for the most part, improved. New individuals and families have become members and a number of former members have returned to be part of our congregational family. We have strengthened our bonds with the wider community in a number of ways. Our "public face" has been expanded through our use of the "social media." Even the monthly bulletin has been reformatted and according to many is much easier to read and far more informative.

The remaining six months will give the entire congregation many other opportunities for involvement and will, hopefully, be a time of continued growth in every area. Of course there will be holidays to be celebrated, times of joy or sorrow to be shared, new programs to be created and much more. I am committed to doing whatever is necessary to strengthen our congregation so that when our new rabbi is selected and comes to be part of our community he or she will find a congregation and community that is vibrant, progressive, and enthusiastic.

I especially look forward to this remaining half year as a time to continue working closely and cooperatively with Cantor Bern-Vogel, Jerry Ripley (our organist and choir director), Judy Filsinger, Nicole Smith (our administrative secretary), Jessica Aceves (our youth group advisor) as well as the very dedicated leaders of our congregation and our Sisterhood.

There are many challenges that lie ahead but knowing Congregation Emanu El as I do I have no doubt that together we will meet them. May 2015 bring each of us great blessing!

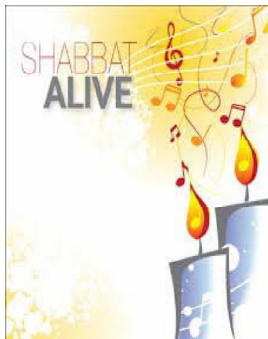
went by quickly and was an interesting year in the life of our congregation.

"Shabbat Alive" to Return on Friday, February 6th

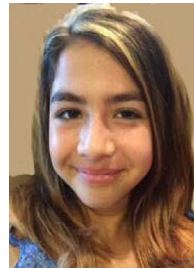

From the Educator's Desk



At the end of the month of January, we will celebrate *Shabbat Shirah*, the Sabbath of Music. It is so named because on that particular Shabbat, as we read the story of the Israelites crossing the Sea of Reeds, we recount the "Song of the Sea" that was sung as an ode to freedom by our ancestors. Of course, this is one of the most famous moments in the Exodus story, and we remember it in song.

Cognitive scientist David Rubin writes in his classic book *Memory in Oral Traditions*, "Oral traditions depend on human memory for their preservation. If a tradition is to survive, it must be stored in one person's memory and be passed on to another person who is also capable of storing and retelling it. All this must occur over many generations . . . Oral traditions must, therefore, have developed forms of organization and strategies to decrease the changes that human memory imposes on the more casual transmission of verbal material." This is why we chant from the Torah. This is why we sing our prayers. This is why we teach Hebrew, t'fillah and holidays using music.

Recent studies have shown what we have known for a long time--that music is a great tool for language learning. The medical journal *Memory & Cognition* recently published a study about music and foreign language acquisition. When random groups of adults were taught Hungarian using either speaking, rhythmic speaking, or singing, the participants in the singing group showed far superior overall performance when tested on their newly acquired language skills. This new study confirms what we have known for years.

In the halls of our rabbinical *yeshivot*, we sing-song our way through the Talmud. In our Shabbat morning service, we sing our way through the stories of the Torah. In our School for Jewish Living classrooms, we learn to chant our Hebrew prayers. This month, we celebrate the music that connects us to the language of our people.

to Deliver
Rabbi Norman F. Feldheim Lecture
on "Jewish Art in the Modern Era"
on February 17th**



Ruth Weisberg, internationally renowned artist and art historian, will deliver the 29th annual Rabbi Norman F. Feldheim Memorial Lecture on Tuesday, February 17th at 7:30 pm at our temple. She will speak on "Jewish Art in the Modern Era", highlighting 19th and 20th century themes and artists.

When the annual Rabbi Norman F. Feldheim lectureship was established upon his death the intent was to especially bring outstanding scholars and community leaders to our community to speak about areas that were of special interest to Rabbi Feldheim. One of his major interests was art.

Ruth Weisberg serves as Professor of Fine Arts at USC. She served as the Dean at the USC Roski School and is currently the Director of the USC Initiative for Israeli Arts and Humanities. She has received numerous honors. Among her many notable accomplishments is that she served as Visiting Artist at the American Academy in Rome 2011, 1995, 1994, and 1992. She has had over 80 solo and 190 group exhibitions, including a recent major exhibition at the Norton Simon Museum, Pasadena and a retrospective, at the Skirball Museum, Los Angeles as well as a solo exhibition at the Huntington in San Marino.

She did the art work for The Open Door, the Passover Haggadah published by the reform movement in 2002.
