Mental Health Awareness In Action: Our Mission, Our Progress



Mental Health First Aid

For emergencies, do you have a first aid kit in your home or your car? Many of us do. It seems sensible. How about one for mental

health emergencies? Can you even imagine what that might be? What would you put into that little box?

Actually, mental health first aid kits are in our minds. Maybe not *our* minds yet, but lots of Australians have them. Since 2001, they've been training their citizens in first aid for mental health crises. Now they say 2.1% of their population know how to respond to friends, relatives, and co-workers when help is needed. Some people in Maryland thought that was a great idea and wanted us Americans to have the training, too. Maryland, collaborating with the Aussies and some folks from Missouri's mental health department, developed a version for the U.S.

Nancy Sidhu went through the free eight-hour training in June, given by San Bernardino County's Department of Behavioral Health. She learned a lot and got to know a cute koala named ALGEE. When we find someone in clear mental distress, ALGEE helps us remember what to do:

- Assess the risk of suicide or harm
- Listen nonjudgmentally
- Give reassurance and information
- Encourage appropriate professional help
- Encourage self-help and other support strategies

Mental Health First Aid training included a video demonstrating in dramatic form what kinds of actions and attitudes are helpful and what are decidedly not. It included activities and other visuals, not to mention two wonderful trainers who lead the group through the two days.

Like Australia, let's make mental health first aid skills as common as physical first aid skills. As we educate our public to help, we'll be reducing the stigma of mental illness as well. Let's follow those Down Under and befriend ALGEE.

at the California Science Center Sunday - August 23, 2015 followed by a deli dinner at Canter's Deli with a teaching by Rabbi Jay Sherwood about the modern significance of the Dead Sea Scrolls

Nobody is quite sure why, but in 1947 young goat-herders wandered inside a cave, perhaps in search of a stray goat, shade from the sun, or even hidden treasure. Whatever the reason, they made a remarkable discovery. They found an assortment of clay jars, inside of which were leather scrolls, wrapped in linen. Over the next nine years, Bedouins and archaeologists searched the surrounding caves, eventually assembling the collection of documents that we know today as the Dead Sea Scrolls.

Come explore *Dead Sea Scrolls: The Exhibition* at the California Science Center, which features over 600 ancient artifacts on loan from the Israel Antiquities Authority, which offer a glimpse into the lifestyle and religion of ancient Israel, more than 2000 years ago.

Before entering the exhibit, we will soar high above the ancient city of Jerusalem as we view the National Geographic film *Jerusalem 3D*.

After being granted special permission in the region's strict no-fly zone, filmmakers were able to capture the first-ever large format aerial footage of the Old City and throughout the Holy Land. Through breathtaking aerial footage, eye-opening personal stories and remarkable historical perspective, *Jerusalem 3D* takes viewers inside the heart of the ancient city in ways never seen before.

Then join us for dinner at Canter's Deli. While we wait for our meal to be served, Rabbi Jay Sherwood will share some modern perspectives on these ancient scrolls.

New Names To Be Inscribed on

Wall of Perpetual Memorial

Our Wall of Perpetual Memorial is a most sacred place in our temple. It was part of the main hallway of our temple building in San Bernardino and is now



part of a beautiful Memorial Alcove in our new temple edifice.

Names are added to our Wall of Perpetual twice each year. The next dedication will take place as part of our Erev Shabbat service on Friday, September 11th. When a name is inscribed on the Wall of Perpetual Memorial it is read from the *bema* each year on the Shabbat closest to the *Yahrzeit* (the anniversary of death) and is included in the annual Book of Memory which is used at the four Yizkor/Memorial Services held during the year (Yom Kippur, Sh'mini Atzeret, the Conclusion of Pesach and Shavuot). Additionally, family members are notified annually of the impending *Yahrzeit* and provided with guidance on how they can appropriately mark the *Yahrzeit* of their loved one.

The Wall itself is made of exquisite marble and names are inscribed in gold leaf lettering.

The contribution for the inscription of a name on the Wall of Perpetual Memorial is \$650. for members of the congregation desiring to place the name of a loved one on the Wall. The contribution for non-members is \$1250.00. It is also possible to make pre-need arrangements for the placement of a name on the Wall after ones demise.
