Just in case for some this evokes a feeling of *deja vu* that prompts a "It sounds like I've heard that before..." reaction, let me simply say that I never dreamt that I would be back again writing a monthly "Rabbinic Reflection" for our bulletin

and saying once again that "this is my final..."

At the end of this month, I will conclude the year of voluntary service as the rabbi of our congregation that I offered to provide as the congregation embarked on its search for its next rabbinic leader. It has been a year filled with many satisfactions as well as some inevitable frustrations. I am most pleased that the congregation has chosen Rabbi Jay Sherwood to serve as our rabbi. Rabbi Sherwood has come to be known by us through his exemplary work as our Director of Education for the past year. He has invigorated our School for Jewish Living program, energized our monthly "Shabbat Alive" celebrations, and has shown himself to be extraordinarily talented, creative and dedicated to serve Congregation Emanu El and the Jewish People.

I have often been asked as this year is coming to an end what I plan on doing in my new "retirement." As most know, I retired in 2001 after serving as rabbi of Congregation Emanu El for 38 years and was honored with the title of "Rabbi Emeritus." I will go back to that title on July 1st, but I think I can safely predict that I will continue to be an example of what it means to be a "failed retiree." While I will not be involved in the ongoing operation and activities of our congregation I will, energy and health permitting, continue my rabbinic work with the Sun City Jewish Congregation in Palm Desert that I have been serving on a part-time basis for the past few years and will continue to serve on numerous boards and committees of the greater San Bernardino and Southern California areas that mean a great deal to me. Additionally, I will continue to serve the national rabbinic community, especially through the work I do for the National Association of Retired Reform Rabbis, and I will continue to lend my support to a number of other national and international organizations and causes. Being a "failed retiree" is not some mark of shame as far as I am concerned. I feel very blessed to have the energy and ability to continue to serve my community and my Jewish People in whatever ways I can.

There is a wonderful custom of Jewish life that when we complete the study of each book of the Torah we proclaim *Chazak chazak v'nitchazek,* "Be strong, be strong and may we be strengthened." As I complete this year of service I ask for your prayers that I be blessed with strength in the days and years to come so that I can be a "failed retiree" and that we all be strengthened to make the future of our congregation secure and abundantly rewarding.

Confirmation Class Presents Gift to the Temple



Our confirmands and their families have presented a wonderful gift to the temple in honor of their recent confirmation. They have made possible the reframing of a major piece of art that has been a prized possession of the temple since the 1950's when it was first presented. The work of art is the "Alphabet of

Creation" by the eminent 20th century artist Ben Shahn (1898-1969). Shahn based his work on a study that is part of the Zohar, a Jewish mystical work. Many of Shahn's works contained Jewish themes, and his calligraphy frequently used the Hebrew alphabet as in the Alphabet of Creation.

In suggesting that the Confirmation Class of 2015-5775 might have this piece of art reframed so that it could be hung near the entrance to our sanctuary, Rabbi Cohn related the classic Jewish story of a father who was accompanied to the synagogue by his young child. As the congregation praved, the child told his father that he was unable to pray because he was not yet able to read the words of the prayer book. The father asked the son if he knew the Hebrew alphabet and the child said "yes." Then just recite the letters of the alphabet and God will manage to put them together into meaningful words of prayer. Rabbi Cohn explained, "Especially to our youngest children I hope that they, too, will just recite the letters of the alphabet and trust that God will turn those letters into words of prayer."

Thanks to the confirmands and their families for this fine gift to our temple.

Mental Health Awareness In Action: An Update



So what were two nice Jewish gals doing mixing it up at the Christian Counseling Service? And then bringing along а handsome Jewish guy for second а rendez-vous? Why,

teaching them about Judaism and what Mental Health Awareness In Action is doing in our congregational community. Naturally. And all this with the hope of inspiring our Redlands area churches to join us in the task of reducing the stigma of mental illness. Maybe it's time to bring you up to speed on some efforts Heidi Nimmo and Nancy Sidhu have been engaged in the past months.

On April 1 we met with staff of the Christian Counseling Service and community members and talked about what Congregation Emanu El's social action group has been doing since early 2014. We described the Jewish context of our work and our understanding of our responsibilities to fellow humans who are struggling. We had been invited by the Chair of their board of directors with whom we had talked in the fall at the University of Redlands' conference on spirituality and mental health. And on April 21st, we were invited back, accompanied by Jeff Spears, for a short presentation to their board where Heidi handed out green awareness ribbons.

The enthusiasm of their responses is heartening because stigma will only dissolve when all of us, in our different and overlapping communities, combine our increased understanding and changing attitudes to create a new world for people living with mental illness and their families. And at the Redlands Mayor's Prayer Breakfast on May 7th, Nancy chatted with the leader of the Christian Counseling Service who was wearing one of Heidi's ribbons. Well, actually, the ribbon is part of a project of Each Mind Matters, California's mental health movement.

The State of California, the University of Redlands, the Redlands Christian Counseling Service, Congregation Emanu El – we're all working together for *tikkun olam*, the repairing of the world.

A description of the various funds follows to help guide you in determining where you want your contribution to go:
