This month we get to celebrate Passover in our very new synagogue. (Of course, every coming festival for the next year, right through Chanukah, will be a first in our new

synagogue) Yet, Passover is very special, because it brings us all together, it marks our becoming a people, and it is the most observed of all the Jewish festivals.

Dear Friends,

Thus, this year, when we mark Pesach in our new building, we will be completing an exodus, somewhat in reverse of our ancient forebears whose first Passover was the start of their exodus. Jewish life has these continual twists of time and fate. We suffer the decimation of the Shoa and a bittersweet liberation in 1945, only to establish the State of Israel three years later, in 1948.

Moving into our new building is our opportunity not only to enjoy a magnificent edifice and the work of our sweat and sacrifice, but to discover new ways to experience Jewish life, through those profound moments. Let's not only worry about keeping the walls clean—let's look to find ways to renew our Jewishness in these walls. Passover is coming!

The Passover Question: Why is this night different from all other nights?



The new month of Nissan is almost upon us. Springtime. Renewal. Rebirth. The Song of Songs... We celebrate our spiritual new year – Rosh Hashanah - in the month of Tishrei, the

seventh month in our Jewish calendar, but the actual cycle of months begin with Nissan. This is the season in which we recall the story of our freedom from slavery, our bondage in Egypt. The questions in the Haggadah may seem to need dusting off during our pre-Pesach cleaning yet they are always new. Just as we turn and re-roll the Torah, looking at the same stories and commentaries from different angles every year, so too are the Four Questions opportunities to look closely at ourselves and examine why we react in certain ways to various situations we may find ourselves in. What is our inner child really thinking or believing in a particular moment? Is it anger, complacency, ignorance or are we willing to open our eyes and minds to new ways of thinking? How much are we still slaves to our own stubborn hearts?

I pray that this Season of Freedom –this *Z'man Cheruteinu* - be one of joy and personal liberation for all of us. From our house to yours.
