Rabbinic Reflections



As the Hebrew calendar month of Tishrei comes to a close, I find myself reflecting on the busy month, filled with joy from the wonderful celebrations contained within its dates, yet a bit worn out and overwhelmed by the whole experience. I feel this way every vear. I believe that the Jewish calendar was set up to elicit this

feeling from us.

The holidays of *Tishrei* come up so quickly, one right after the other, so that we usually have little time to reflect upon the holiday that just passed before that the next one is upon us. In some respects, it is like enjoying a multi-course meal with scrumptious flavors, but sometimes the waiter brings the next course too soon. I wish that I had a little more time to savor the essence of each course. *Rosh* Hashanah celebrates another year since creation, bringing with it the sweetness reflected in apples and honey. Tzom Gedaliah-a little known observance remembering the Babylonian era assassination of the Jewish mayor of Jerusalem-adds a bittersweet flavor to the mix. Yom *Kippur*, with its ceremonies that celebrate the purification of the soul, refreshes the palate. Sukkot, the fall Harvest Festival, brings the zest of the first fruits into the mix, dining al fresco in the Sukkah for a change of scenery. Shmini Atzeret with its prayer for rain reinvigorates the fields that produce the grains that are essential to the agricultural lifecycle that yields the bounty of our feast. And finally, there is *Simchat Torah*, rejoicing in the spice of Torah that completes this banquet of Tishrei.

As would be expected after such a rich buffet, sometimes we need to sit back and loosen our belts. This is the month of Cheshvan.

There is something very satisfying in this delightful exhaustion. While we would love to enjoy the feast again, and we will next year, we also want a little down time. I am grateful for the month of Cheshvan to do just that. In the Talmud, Cheshvan is called Marcheshvan-"Bitter Cheshvan"-since it is the only month that contains no holiday. Perhaps Cheshvan should not be so bitter. How wonderful it is to have time for reflection. We are blessed with the wisdom of our tradition that gives us a month of quiet reflection after a month of intense celebration. So much of the meaning in our lives is gained in contemplative reflection. In this month of Cheshvan, I wish all of you a time of quiet reflection, where you can contemplate those things in your life that do not often bring about intense celebration, but need our attention nonetheless. As the season of planting seeds for the new year comes to a close, may we relax and enjoy the fruits of our labors.

A Sikele a Klevne - poem by **Avrom Reisen**

A little sukkah, with simple boards, I barely put together - I covered the roof with a little skhakh and sit in the sukkah and think...With a great cry and a bitter yell, my wife comes inside. 'Listen my husband –

those winds will soon blow the sukkah down – what will happen then?!' 'Don't be a fool, don't have any grief or worry about the wind...No matter how many winds will roar, no matter how many generations will come the sukkah will always remain standing.'

Cantorial Comments

This is an abridged form of one of my favorite Yiddish holiday songs that in simple terms, gives us the essence of what the sukkah is about. Together, we have entered a new Jewish calendar year - 5776 - with joy and reflection, praying for renewed blessings of health, happiness and contentment for those we love and those who are dear to us. We prayed for our prayers to be answered before the heavenly gates - sha'arei hashamayim - close at Neilah yet... there is still time during the days of Sukkot - even before Simchat Torah - to make amends! If I have hurt or upset anyone in any way, I hope you will forgive me; the ultimate form of *Tshuvah* is panim el panim – face to face – if we have not succeeded in righting 'wrongs' we may have done. The poet, Avrom Reisen, reminds us with this song, that despite the fragility of life, and the harsh winds that may challenge us on our path, there will always be a divine shelter of peace *hapores sukkat shalom aleinu* watching over us.

It was a privilege to have so many able Torah readers this year – thank you: Michelle Anctil, Renee Kress, Les Kushner, Mary Lynn Slough, Nicole Smith, Leslie Soltz and Neil Spears for their beautiful and well-prepared Torah readings. How grateful we are to our Volunteer Choir members who added so much to the richness and beauty of our services: Michelle Anctil, Grace Harris, Sheri Maltzman, Mary Lynn Stough, Barb Smith, Lisa Wise-Wolk, Chel Zipperstein, Les Kushner, George Petite and Kevin Posalski. We appreciate the many hours you gave in preparing for the High Holy Days!Finally, I want to express to my colleague and friend, Jerry Ripley, my gratitude for his unending [34 years and counting] dedication and devotion to Congregation Emanu El and the preservation of its music especially at this time of year - for the hours, days and weeks of rehearsals that produced the deeply solemn and majestically triumphant music so essential to the integrity of our Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur services. And to you, dear members of Congregation Emanu El,

I am pleased [and amazed!] to be entering my seventh year with you. I pray that it will be for each of you, a year rich in blessings of health, joy and laughter and peace.

Presidential Perspectives

My Dear Friends,

The entire Congregation is invited to a Town Hall meeting at the temple, Sunday, October 25, at 2:00 PM. We will discuss the status of the Mortgage Reduction Fund, the current financial state of the temple, and our ability to service our debt

going forward. Your leadership is anxious to hear what you have to say in this regard. We also solicit your ideas about revenue generation and membership growth. Make no mistake, our situation is dire and your input is absolutely necessary. Please make plans to attend.

In an effort to create a significant and dependable revenue stream, our First Vice President Cheryl Sukenik and board member at large Mike Kress have undertaken to expand the depth and breadth of our scrip program. There will be scrip available at all temple events and a larger inventory will be kept on hand for your convenience. One quick example: If each of our 209 member units buys a \$250.00 Stater Brothers card each month, the result over a year's time is \$37,620 for our congregation. Or as I think of it 2.7 mortgage payments. We have the tools in hand to address part of our problem immediately

On September 10th the resurgent Senior Group of Congregation Emanu El met at the temple. More than 50 seniors attended, some from our congregation, from Congregation Etz Hadar, and from as far away as Banning. Magician Mike Bailardo provided an excellent program, but the real magic is the job Gloria Cutler, Barry Lowenstein and Rabbi Cohn have done to reestablish this vibrant group as an active force at our temple. Please join me in thanking them and contact the temple office to inquire about the next senior event; a trip to the Skirball Museum on October 14.

As I write this the day before Kol Nidre, I hope you are experiencing reflective and spiritually fulfilling High Holy Days. The temple staff, clergy, Sisterhood and leadership puts in many hours of preparation for these special days. Make sure and say thanks when you chat with them in the days to come.

Treasurer's Report



Friends,

It is my pleasure to report on our congregation's financial health for the month of August 2015. While July is usually the worst month for income, August provides some much-needed relief from financial *tsuris* as many of our congregants choose to pay their entire dues

commitments up front.

In the days prior to the end of August, roughly one-third of the congregation's annual income generally flows in, and we are exactly on track this month, with income of \$139,000. This offsets monthly expenses of \$25,000 to give us a much-needed cushion. I would like to thank those incredibly generous families who voluntarily paid their full commitments and even made voluntary increases to help us meet our financial burden in the months to come.

Unfortunately I cannot be as optimistic about the mortgage reduction fund. In August we received approximately \$24,000 toward meeting our goal of \$234,000, meaning that approximately 10% of those contributions arrived this past month. While I am very grateful to those generous families, I was expecting the mortgage reduction fund to follow the same pattern as dues, meaning that by this point we should have received over \$54,000. This casts serious doubt on our ability to service our debt beyond the first of the year if contributions do not increase.

Your leaders are pursuing every possible option for bringing in extra cash in the coming months, but our plans are taking more time than expected. The most crucial need right now is for short-term capital to give us time to put our plans into place, and that is why I challenge each and every congregant to help us reach our goal of keeping the congregation financially healthy while providing all the services our families deserve.

As our President has said, there will be a congregational meeting this month and I sincerely, deeply hope that you will make the time to attend. It may well be the most important meeting in our history and will certainly set us on the path we follow for the next five years and beyond.

Of course, I remain committed to managing our accounts and reporting our financial health and welfare to you, the congregational family I willingly serve. I hope each and every one of you knows that you can seek me out with questions and concerns. Now is the time for great courage and great accomplishment, and I hope that I, along with the rest of your leaders, can do you proud.

Dear Congregants:


I am forming a Social Action Committee through Sisterhood and the Congregation to involve us in more of the needs of our community. To begin the


