## **Presidential Perspectives**



Fellow Congregants,

In my January Bulletin article, I wrote about an ambitious and very exciting opportunity which has come to Congregation Emanu El. The following are some further details about The Boruchin Project that, in my opinion, will be a real benefit for our Temple.

For well over two years, long-time congregant, Paul Shimoff, has worked to secure funding from the Jewish National Fund (JNF) to improve the northern portion of our Temple property. I joined Paul in this effort about a year and a half ago, shortly after I became Temple President. The Boruchin Project is part of a redirection of funds

from the Estate of John and Dora Boruchin who were long-time residents of the Inland Empire and life-long supporters of Israel. The Boruchins endowed \$200,000,000 of their Estate to JNF, the largest single donation ever received by JNF. Paul was the Boruchins' attorney and assisted JNF in its receipt of the Estate's assets. JNF has now, generously, pledged \$1,500,000 to benefit Congregation Emanu El in order to create an environment which will educate and provide scholarships to promote the "Israeli" experience. The Boruchin Project will include a Israeli-themed biblical garden and outdoor amphitheater. These improvements will be used to draw visitors to Congregation Emanu El to learn more about The "Jewish state". In addition, it will allow us room to create a wonderful outdoor environment for our Congregation to worship and celebrate.

The Boruchin Project funds will be allocated as follows:

- (1) \$500,000 will be used for construction and maintenance of the biblical garden and amphitheater.
- (2) \$1,000,000 will be placed into a JNF managed investment fund. Annually, Congregation Emanu El will be entitled to receive the income from the fund not to exceed a certain percentage of the fund's value. A portion of those monies will be used to promote JNF sponsored scholarships. Students will apply for these scholarships that will provide them travel to Israel and the opportunity to attend the Alexander Muss High School during their visit. Another portion of those funds will be used to bring a well-recognized speaker to educate our community about Israel.

The above mentioned funds are earmarked by JNF <u>solely</u> for construction and maintenance of the biblical garden, amphitheater, scholarships and an annual speaker to promote Israel. The Boruchin Project funds <u>cannot</u> be used in any other form by Congregation Emanu El.

It's important to understand The Boruchin Project allocation has been structured so that there will be no adverse financial impact to Congregation Emanu El.

Temple finances continue to remain tight. As a result, I encourage each of you to remain steadfast in your support of our Temple through membership dues as well as other avenues of donation and support.

We are now beginning to assemble various Committees and Task Forces to oversee the project. I believe The Boruchin Project will be a tremendous asset for our Temple by creating an educationally charged environment that will fill our Synagogue with knowledge, passion and energy. I envision The Boruchin Project and Congregation Emanu El, will become an exciting destination location for both Jews and our greater Inland Empire community.

There's an excitement and energy building at our Temple. I hope you will continue to embrace this renewal of spirit and passion to make Congregation Emanu El a priority in your and your family's lives.

### Treasurer's Report



Shalom!

Our Temple needs your help now more than ever. While our congregation home is filled with spirituality, warmth and community, we are experiencing significant financial stress. This month, I have included a six month income and expense summary for your review.

A quick analysis of our income:

- The dues pledged for this fiscal year are approximately \$202,000. This is \$107,637 less than what we budgeted.
- We have not been successful in renting out our social hall therefore, the income from temple usage fees is down \$3,000.
- No major fund-raising events have been held in the first 6 months. There are currently no events in the planning stages, therefore our fundraising line item is down \$30,000.
- Other income is shown as a loss of \$5,200 due to the decrease in the value of our investments. A quick analysis of our expenses:
- Building maintenance expenses have exceeded our budget. Re-pavement of the parking lot, maintenance and repairs to kitchen equipment, maintenance and repairs to the air conditioner/furnace equipment, and an increase in

the cost of maintaining our grounds have all contributed to these expenses. The addition of a security system at a cost of \$8,000 have been offset by \$4,700 with the remainder of the funds will need to be paid from operation income.

• While our staff and Board of Directors have been careful to spend within the approved budget unexpected expenses have occurred and might be expected within the next six months.

We need your support now.

**Please** pay your pledged dues. Consider sending in additional dues to help decrease the deficit.

**Please** send in donations to offset the cost of the security system.

**Please** send donations to be used for operating purposes.

**Please** consider renting the social hall for an event.

**Please** consider volunteering to chair a fundraising event this Spring to raise money for our Congregation.

Without your additional financial support, we will need to borrow monies from our Line of Credit to pay our obligations. This will increase our interest expense and our debt.

Please help in any way you can and enable us to maintain the vibrant, caring, spiritual community that we have.

### **Mental Health Awareness in Action**

So, what if you had the answer to a big problem – not how to perfect the world – just how to lessen suffering in your tiny part of society? Would you do it? You'd have to calculate how expensive it might be – could you afford it? And if you could, would you do it then? What if it meant going against decades of accepted culture and beliefs?

Would you do something completely new and risky? Someone at the Carolina Panthers Pro Football Team must have asked himself those questions, and the answer came out "yes." And rather quietly, the Panthers hired a therapist with experience with depression, brought her on staff last fall, and introduced her to the football players. She's the first in-house mental health therapist in the National Football League ever. She's around, she's available to chat about anything, and if a player needs some help with emotions, she's there for them.

Probably we don't need to tell you how truly new this is. Football has a super masculine tough image, and mental health problems have a big stigma associated with them. But someone – we don't know who – decided the well-being of the individual players, as well as of the team, was worth taking a chance. And now psychologist Tish Guerin is providing a way to ease distress and suffering.

Stigma is on its way out. As Ms. Guerin says: "It's OK not to be OK."






