Rabbinic Reflections



This has been a heartbreaking month in our community. Our hearts go out to all those who have lost dear loved ones this month. Between the Islamophobia which caused one to murder 50 people in New Zealand, and the profound loss of Cherrie & Ron Lubey, as well as Henry Castro in our own Emanu El family, we mourn with broken hearts. While these losses will be felt and mourned for a long time, we also can find comfort in their memories and in Jewish tradition. Our beloved Ron & Cherrie and Enrique (Henry) each loved Jewish tradition with all their heart and soul. I encourage all of us to lean on Jewish ritual and scripture in these trying times to help lift us and connect us as we mourn. Judaism reminds us to love and community reminds us that we are not alone through the challenging times.

Psalm 126 has kept me strong through this painful time. We chant with this Psalm, “those who sow in tears will reap in joy.” We cry for our losses, and we are lifted by fellowship, love and memories. This text reminds me of the deep love and joy that they each brought to their Judaism. Whether it was having an Aliyah at a Torah service on Saturday morning or singing loudly on a Friday night, when we gather as a community and express joy in being Jewish, we honor their memory and strengthen our bonds as Congregation Emanu El.

Passover is quickly approaching, one of our four Jewish new years on our calendar. It creates an opportunity to start again, clean our homes and spirits, and express gratitude for the freedom to practice our Jewish faith. The super bloom has painted our mountains with orange, and the sun shines brightly today. With gratitude and thanksgiving, I lift up my eyes, to look at our green and orange San Bernardino hills and am comforted. May the coming of Passover, the cleaning of hametz from our homes, and the spring blooms help us all to start again. May we find comfort and peace in knowing that we will honor their blessed memory as we cry tears for these deep losses, hold one another up and celebrate a new beginning. Those who sow in tears will reap in Joy.

Presidential Perspectives



Early morning on March 18, Temple member Cherrie Lubey lost her battle with cancer. Twelve years ago, doctors gave her five years to live. Clearly, she beat the odds; then just a few weeks ago she got sick, really sick. And just eight days later, Cherrie's husband, Ron Lubey, also died - from a weak

and broken heart. Their passing shook us to the core.

Bulletin articles aren't normally the place where a Temple President might eulogize any particular congregant. But Cherrie and Ron Lubey weren't your normal congregants. Cherrie spent her entire life at Congregation Emanu El. As Cherrie Gilbert, Norman F. Feldheym was her childhood Rabbi. When Cherrie and Ron married, Hillel Cohn became their Rabbi, as well as a devoted friend. Cherrie met Ron in 1962 when he was stationed at Norton Air Force Base. They married shortly after and were planning to renew their 55 year wedding vows this coming Passover.

Cherrie was born and confirmed here. She and Ron were married here, and every one of their children and grandchildren enjoyed *simchas* and sorrows within the confines of this Synagogue. Indeed, Cherrie and Ron were special congregants that embodied what it means to be dedicated and committed to their Temple and its community.

Cherrie served as both Temple and Sisterhood President and sat on the Board of Directors longer than any member in recent memory. In between being a lawyer, Ron would often sing or chant Torah from the Bema. Their Jewish roots ran deep.

To say Cherrie had a big personality is like saying the great mime Marcel Marceau didn't talk much. Cherrie was outspoken, opinionated yet full of abundant love and deep compassion for those around her. Always by her side, Ron marveled in Cherrie's ability to connect and be a part of any and every moment.

They raised two children, Stacy and Marc. When Marc died, there was strength and resiliency in the midst of unspeakable grief. Cherrie and Ron lived a full life, one filled with purpose, fun and adventure with family and friends whom they adored and cherished.

Cherrie could fill a room with energy, laughter and above all, love. And she was one of the few who could recall those long lost Temple members and the colorful stories during what can only be described as the "Golden Age" of Congregation Emanu El. Much of our Temple's glorious history died along with Cherrie.

I will always remember the love, kindness and inclusiveness that Cherrie and Ron, had for me and my family. I will miss their spirit, and the way Cherrie could light up a room. I will miss her seemingly rough edges that disguised a sweet and gentle soul who adored

and truly cared for those around her. Cherrie and Ron loved being Jewish and that love has made this Temple and our community better off.

Thank you, Cherrie and Ron for filling our Congregation with passion and personality. And above all, thank you for the indelible mark you imprinted on all of our lives.

Treasurer's Report



Shalom!

Your Board of Directors and your Treasurer have been working hard over the last several months!

The Board approved a \$50,000 Unsecured Line of Credit to be opened with Alta Pacific Bank if our cash flow should become too low to meet our cash needs.

Typically, May and June are the months when the Temple collects the least amount of dues revenue and additional donations from congregants. The Board wanted to be prepared to meet our cash needs and thus researched our options.

I have been working with Marv Reiter, Judy Filsinger and the Executive Board in developing the 2019/2020 budget that the congregation will approve at the May meeting. The Board of Directors will do everything possible not to have a significant increase in dues. If an increase is necessary, we will do our best to keep it at or below 3%. In addition, we would like to replace the Mortgage Retirement Fund charge with a Building Fund Fee. Each congregant would pay a percentage fee based on their dues commitment with no member family paying more than \$600 dollars a year. Our maintenance costs are increasing as our Temple ages. The Board would like to collect funds to cover annual repairs and maintenance as well as having the excess funds available for future repairs. The Mortgage Retirement commitment will be voluntary. The line item will remain on your monthly statement with no dollar commitment. A gentle reminder that we still need to pay down the mortgage – if you can help out each month it would be greatly appreciated.

If you should have any questions regarding the financial position of your congregation, please contact me and I will be glad to discuss it with you.
