Rabbinic Reflections



Summer is here and so are the barbecues, long lazy afternoons, and tons of sunshine. I writing this from a beautiful beach while I am vacationing with my family. This year I intentionally chose a stunningly beautiful spot that forced us to spend time outdoors

exploring, enjoying nature and each other, and as far as possible from our technology. I am so grateful for the time spent with my partner and children and the time in nature. Abraham Joshua Heschel teaches that God can be experienced through radical amazement. He writes "Our goal should be to live life in radical amazement.get up in the morning and look at the world in a way that takes nothing for granted. Everything is phenomenal; everything is incredible; never treat life casually. To be spiritual is to be amazed."

As I awoke in Hawaii to the sound of a rushing waterfall and peeked outside on my patio I was grateful for the peace that rushing water soothed me with. When I snorkeled in the turquoise waters with my children looking for tropical fish, I paused regularly to thank God for those moments. Sometimes we must step out of our everyday lives, find new landscapes and topography to remind us how much there is to be amazed by. This summer I am amazed by our oceans and their magical creatures. I am amazed by the incredible creations God placed in our oceans and the peaceful existence they seem to lead down there under the depths of the waves.

But we don't have to go far to find this radical amazement. No need to travel on a plane or even in a car, this work can be done right outside where you sit as you read this. It merely takes a mindful moment in nature for us to feel the power of the world around us. Whether you are traveling far, or staying near, I invite you to find a few moments of "radical amazement." This summer I want to remind you to create the time to unplug, and plug into God and our natural world. Go outside, look up at the stars and marvel at the vast universe we are placed upon. Or go on a hike at a local forest, where you can listen as the wind speaks to you rushing through the trees. We don't take enough time to pause today. But often it is in those moments of pause we can hear God's voice.

Our first **NEW MUSIC SHABBAT** last month reaped very interesting results!

NEW MUSIC & ANNE FRANK

We have all heard the classic Jewish joke that when you have five Jews in a room, you're going to have ten opinions. This was no exception! To clarify for those

not in attendance, everyone received an individual voting ballot with the opportunity to anonymously voice their feedback about each new piece on a scale from 1-5.

Not surprisingly, one of the new pieces which was loved by some got the lowest rating by others. In my early seminary training in New York at Hebrew Union College, we were advised that as much as we might desire, we will never be able please everyone at the same time. An impossibility – especially in a synagogue setting! We know that a particular *V'shamru* setting may be just what one person might need that particular night whereas for another, it just doesn't hit the mark. Our moods and emotional needs vary from one week to the next at the onset of Shabbat -That is the challenging and exciting mission of choosing service music. You may even discover that a melody for *Mi Chamocha* you didn't care for upon first hearing, may suddenly appeal to you the next time!

On another note, you may have read that last month [June 12] would have been the 90th birthday of **Anne Frank**, z.l. In this season of travel and discovery opportunities, it seems appropriate to share some fascinating information with you, should you not yet be aware of it. **The Museum of Tolerance in L.A.** includes a permanent exhibit of Anne Frank and her family. There you will learn that Anne and her older sister, Margot, had two American pen pals before they were deported. I found it extraordinary to learn that

their pen pals, Betty and Juanita Wagner, also two sisters, were farm girls from Danville. Iowa. There is now a beautiful museum dedicated to the pen pals with historic artifacts and detailed synopses from 1938-1945 of their parallel lives in Europe and the United States. One of the most stunning facts for us is that the Wagner sisters later lived and died in Redlands! Sadly, who knew??!

Mental Health Awareness in Action Big Green Ribbons

May was a big lime green month at Congregation Emanu El. The message to end the stigma of mental illness was heard loud and clear as we marked national Mental Health Awareness Month for the sixth consecutive year.

Congregants and guests picked up over one hundred lapel-size lime green ribbons to wear and encourage conversations. Many of us attended an evening program about stigma and suicide among teens. We spoke from the bimah at May's Friday Erev services. And for the first time, we put out Big Lime Green Ribbons to write on. Here are the messages people wrote from their hearts:

EACH MIND MATTERS KNOW THE SIGNS OF SUICIDE WE CARE! YOU ARE NOT ALONE! SELF-DIAGNOSIS IS VALID. PROFESSIONAL DIAGNOSIS IS A PRIVLEGE. FIND SOMEBODY WHO WILL LISTEN TO YOU! TALK—SUPPORT—LOVE REACH OUT! HELP IS AVAILABLE! YOU ARE LOVED! TALK! SHARE! END STIGMA BEST WISHES from Jerry and Rebecca REMEMBER THAT YOU ARE NOT ALONE
