Rabbinic Reflections



Cheshvan, the Month after the high holidays, is called *mar Cheshvan* in Hebrew. This means bitter Cheshvan, so titled because there are no special Jewish holidays this month. Yet we still gather as a Jewish community. We gather to heal the world, by donating funds for turkeys to feed those who can't afford a thanksgiving meal. We gather to celebrate Shabbat, renewing ourselves and our souls. We gather to learn Torah, to stretch our minds an d engage in studies and connect. Jewish community is lived in relationship with others.

I want to be so bold as to recommend we re-name Cheshvan, to Kesher Chesvan, which means the month of connection. In Judaism we study in partners, our Jewish study partners are called *chevruta*. In Judaism we also must have at least ten Jewish people present to read Torah, recite key prayers for mourning, and to engage in other vital prayers. This concept of minyan reminds us that Judaism is lived

in relationship with others. Those relationships are the key to our continuity and creating connection here at Emanu El.

Relationships are what keep people engaged and encourages them to be a part of our community, or even join as members. Judaism is a faith, religion, culture that is lived in relationship with others. On Rosh Hashanah I shared about creating deeper connections here in our community. I challenged each of you to get 8 friends together, create a small group, to do something that will help us build Jewish community. Together you can read books, study torah, talk about Jewish issues in the news, eat & make Jewish foods, talk about how you bring Judaism to your family. There are so many exciting new ways to express our Judaism. Each of you connects to Judaism in different and unique ways. Our goal is to help you re-engage and do it in a way that you find meaningful, innovative and renewing.

One of our longtime congregants told me that when their kids were small the rabbi put them together in a baby group. From that one simple act these families became linked and their children were raised in community with other Jewish children.

Our goal is to become the inclusive, diverse, welcoming synagogue that reflects the faces of our modern world. We need your help to become that community. In order to be able to achieve that we must practice welcoming. Together we can invite friends to join us and experience our re-invigorated community classes, services, and special offerings.

Know that a smile, a welcoming gesture or brief conversation with a newcomer is the easiest way to start creating community. We hope you will join us in our effort to create a community that truly supports it members, where each individual's presence and story matters. We will build this community together.

Together, b'yachad, we can create small groups of people that gather for like-minded Jewish interests. In these small groups we can deepen our relationships with others, and with our faith, culture and tradition. What small group do you long to create or to join? Let us know so that we can support and help you get started in this month of connection. This month is the time to put into action that one thing you've been longing to see at our temple. Don't forget we are here to help and brainstorm. Together we will start building the new face of Judaism.

On Kol Nidre they are carried ceremoniously through the sanctuary by our past presidents, their children and families. We generally read from the **Harris Torah** on Shabbat throughout the year. This year we chanted *B'resheet* from our **Centennial Torah** on Rosh Hashanah morning and the *Akeda* [Binding of Isaac]from the **Rich Torah** on Day II of Rosh Hashanah. On Yom Kippur morning, we chanted Nitzavim [Deuteronomy chapters 29 and 30] from the **Blais Torah** and on Yom Kippur afternoon, we read the 'Holiness Code' [Leviticus, chapter 19] from the **Phillipson Torah**. Our extraordinary and very precious **Sephardic Torah** resides like a Shabbat queen on high, keeping watch over all our other Torahs.

Celebrating the National holiday of Thanksgiving this month, we as a congregation certainly have much to be thankful for!! Happy Thanksgiving and may we find something to be grateful for every day.

Mental Health Awareness in Action Rosenberg, Bedlam

At the end of September, Heidi read an op-ed in the Sunday LA Times, and quickly alerted Nancy. She grabbed her paper and read it, too. The piece by psychiatrist Kenneth Paul Rosenberg hit both of us to the quick. Soon we were talking over coffee.

"My family's American tragedy" (9/29/19) told us nothing we didn't already know. But how compelling and clear and deeply personal. The author, a Manhattan psychiatrist, looking at the mental health situation in LA, had his own story – how his older sister lived an intolerable life with schizophrenia, and how she died early, and how he, his family, and our entire society share in the blame. And when he went looking for people who needed treatment he went looking in the LA County jail.

Jail? You can tell right off the bat that something is dreadfully wrong in our country when that's where you can find so many of our citizens with serious mental illness. If you're reading this, you may have known this already. But why do we feel so powerless to change this cruel reality?

Stigma silences us, as stigma and "shanda" ('disgrace' in Yiddish) did when Dr. Rosenberg was growing up and his sister was being tortured by "hallucinations and delusions," as he describes in his op-ed. But he's finished with being quiet and treating only those with less serious mental illness in his practice. Now he devotes himself to calling for compassionate and successful ways to help our family members, our neighbors, our fellow Americans. Those ways exist.


His new book came out during 'the days between,' October1st, shortly before our day of reckoning. It's called *Bedlam: An Intimate Journey into America's Mental Health Crisis*. In a video trailer about the book, there's a man on the streets of LA, who has no roof over his head, who chokes up as he says: "There ain't no help anywhere."

We need to change that. It's 5780 and it's time.
