Mental Health Awareness in Action

FIRST PERSON

Public messages to heighten societal awareness of mental illness were nowhere to be found three decades ago when I awoke on the locked mental wing of a local hospital.

Today mental illness education and the stories of real people who live with mental illness appear frequently in popular media. Surprisingly education can also be found in the greeting card aisle at CVS. Nestled among the cards are free pamphlets identifying five ways anyone can be a source of help and hope to someone living with mental illness.

Times were different when a diagnosis of bipolar disorder quickly followed my 1991 hospital admission. Then and for years leading up to that time nobody spoke intelligently or comfortably about mental illness. Overcome with shame families generally hid the diagnosis of mental illness, and sometimes hid their family member as well.

Fortunately for me things were different. I was lucky to have the love of a devoted spouse who quickly learned from professionals what I needed to do to get better. Jeff assured me that serious mental illness is not 100% curable, but is eminently treatable. Sharing what he learned gave me hope. A few folks close to us followed Jeff's lead, learning about mental illness and thus overcoming their fear. They actually doubled up on their love of Jeff, our young children and needy me.

Love saved me/us. Love makes all the difference.

Sadly, in spite of the contributions of popular media and our CEE program Mental Health Awareness In Action (MHAIA) today many mentally ill people remain unloved and at worst closeted.

Psychotherapy, stress reduction, abstaining from substance abuse, healthy living and taking prescribed medications improve chances for recovery from severe mental illness. But, recovery is hard going and management is a day-to-day endeavor. Feeling loved makes wellness possible.

Let's all LOVE! Love will end stigma. Without stigma those afflicted and their loved ones may reach out and get needed help.

With **love** mental health can be maintained.

With **love** hope can prevail.

With **love** there is life! L'chaim
