The Income and Expenses for Congregation Emanu El from August 1, 2019 till December 31, 2019 are presented on this page. This is a mid-year statement. Below I have explained several of the variances:

• Dues – not all congregants pay on a monthly basis. Some congregants have paid in full and

some congregants have made no payments to date. You cannot analyze if we are on target to capture all dues pledged without consulting a receivable statement. The Finance Committee will be reviewing the receivable statement and making phone calls in the next month or so. If you owe on your dues – save us a phone call and send a check to cover your dues pledge to the Temple!

- Since we have not had any significant fund raisers to date our budget reflects the deficit of this line item.
- None of our expense line items need to be addressed or explained. We are on target to meet the amount budgeted for the year or to come in under budget.

Our amazing Temple Administrator Judy Filsinger has mailed out the Annual Contribution Statements to all congregants who made donations, paid dues, or monetarily supported any programs at Congregation Emanu El during 2019. #### Dear SJL Families,

On Tu B'shvat, Jews all over the world celebrate "New year of the trees." This holiday we are thankful to the trees and nature in general. We are grateful for the food, shade and oxygen they provide us with.

The meaning of the Name is TU = w, the value of the two letters in Hebrew is 15, meaning the  $15^{th}$  day of the month of SHVAT.

Some of the Tu B'shvat traditions include, having a Tu B'shvat seder, in which we say blessing on the 7 species that represent the land of Israel: wheat, barley, grapes, figs, pomegranates, olives and dates. There are also blessings and drinking 4 cups of red and white wine, or grape juice, illustrating the shifting of seasons.

Tu B'shvat reminds us to care for our earth. Some steps we can take in order to give back to our planet include: Reduce waste by buying products that use less packaging, use the reverse side of paper as scrap paper or for art projects, learn about your community's most up-to-date regulations on recycling and consider the slightly more advanced step of starting to compost.

This year Tu B'Shvat falls on Monday February 10th. We will be celebrating in SJL on the 9th. This year, go out, spend more time in the nature, being outside is good for the body and soul. Maybe take the family on a hike or visit a local farm or garden. You can plan, with family and friends, to "adopt" an area and pledge to clean it. Sometimes that can make a big difference. **Mental Health Awareness in Action** 

The British Broadcasting Corporation is truly dedicated to bringing the issue of mental health to everyone's ears. It's their way of helping to end the societal stigma of mental illness. And being the BBC, they do a super job of it. And sometimes we feel a little envious of our friends across the Atlantic.

For example, they did a recent story on a non-profit in Britain called "Minds @ Work." That group is aiming to make our workplaces more "life-enhancing" by ending the stigma and by teaching skills for caring for all the humans at work. Minds @ Work describe themselves as "a community of learners." They're always on the lookout for new ways of helping.

They provide free events, open to workers and management, on various topics such as the ones from last year (2019):

- Why the Menopause is Everyone's Business
- Me and my Smartphone Protecting Mental Health in our Hyperconnected Lives
- The Future of Work The Humans are Coming
- Let's talk about Suicide
- And their annual event This is My Story

They also call themselves "a movement," and a "connector, curator, convener, collaborator and a catalyst for the difficult conversations on mental health topics that are still taboo."

"Through storytelling and community, we help members to navigate the challenges of creating mentally and emotionally healthy workplaces."

Do we in North America have an organization like that? We need it. Recently we heard a report on National Public Radio about the prevalence of suicide in the U.S. construction industry. Surely storytelling and building community would help there and in many other workplaces.

And kudos to both BBC World Service and NPR for all their reporting, helping us to hear the stories and lessen the stigma.

## THE RABBI NORMAN F. FELDHEYM MEMORIAL LECTURE

# DR. MARK BIEDERMAN speaks on "SCHINDLER'S LISTED: THE SEARCH FOR MY FATHER'S LOST GOLD"



## **February 21, 2020 • 7:00pm** with book signing before the event at 6:30pm

Mark and Randi Biederman are authors and researchers based in southern California. Their first book, Schindler's Listed: The Search for My Father and His Lost Gold, was released in 2019. The book tells a story of the very dark days of the Holocaust and their impact upon two teenagers, who, against all odds, survived, met and fell in love and somehow found the strength to emigrate and thrive in their new American life.

Dr. Mark Biederman was born in Detroit, Michigan in 1961, the son of two Holocaust survivors both of whom lost their entire families.

After graduating from veterinary school (specializing in horse medicine and surgery) in 1988, he located my practice in Windsor, Ontario due to the success of the horse industry in that province. He spent 15 years in Canada living on a farm in Maidstone, Ontario where he raised Standardbred racehorses and practiced veterinary medicine. He met his wife, Randi, a native Torontonian, in 1996 and married in 1997 and have one daughter.

## This event is free and open to the public.



The Rabbi Norman F. Feldheym Lecture series honors Congregation Emanu El's rabbi who served from 1937-1971. Rabbi Feldheym was a decorated chaplain in World War II and presided over Congregation Emanu El's dramatic expansion in the San Bernardino area in the mid-20th century. The Feldheym Central Library in San Bernardino bears his name and recently, Google has popularized the name "Feldheym" for the neighborhood near the library.

The lecture series was established in 1985 at the time of Rabbi Feldheym's passing.
