Cantorial Comments



FELDHEYM LECTURE – February 19,2021 at 6:30 p.m. Dr. Sarah Bunin Benor

We are so excited, at long last, to bring to our congregation, one of the foremost Yiddish linguists in our country today, Dr. Sarah Bunin Benor, Professor of Contemporary Jewish Studies at Hebrew Union College – Jewish Institute of Religion in Los Angeles. Dr. Benor will enlighten and entertain us with her knowledge, engaging wit and humor. She will be joining us for Shabbat services on February 19th and of course, Yiddish Shabbat music will be included!

Please read below for a more detailed description of her upcoming lecture and professional vitae.

The Rabbi Norman F. Feldheym Memorial Lecture was established in 1985, at the time of Rabbi Feldheym's death.

Rabbi Feldheym served Temple Emanu El at its original location in San Bernardino from 1937 to 1967. The Norman F. Feldheym Central Library opened to the public on September 30, 1985. The library was named in honor of the late Rabbi Norman F. Feldheym who was a board member and prominent citizen. During his more than three decades at Emanu El, Feldheym left twice to serve as a chaplain in the Army. The first time in 1942-1946, during World War II, and the second term, during the Korea War, 1950-1952. His military commendations include a BRONZE STAR AND SIX BATTLE STARS. The Congregation Emanu El wing comprising the Sanctuary, Memorial Room and Social Hall, dedicated in 2013, is named in honor of Rabbi Norman F. Feldheym.

<u>Feldheym Lecture with Dr. Sarah Bunin Benor – February 19, 2021</u> <u>Jewish Languages Today: Endangered, Surviving, and Thriving</u>

Over the past two centuries, migrations and other historical events have led to major changes in the linguistic profile of Jewish communities around the world. Yiddish is thriving in Hasidic communities, even as its use is diminishing elsewhere, but the same time, Jews are engaging with these languages in creating new Jewish varieties through venues such as song and food, due to major global migrations. This talk explains these developments and makes the case for the urgent need for documentation and reclamation.

Sarah Bunin Benor is Professor of Contemporary Jewish Studies at Hebrew Union College – Jewish Institute of Religion (Los Angeles campus) and Adjunct Professor (by courtesy) in the University of Southern California Linguistics Department. She received her Ph.D. from Stanford University in Linguistics in 2004. She has published and lectured widely about Jewish languages, linguistics, Yiddish, American Jews, and Orthodox Jews.

Let's all look at February as an opportunity to support equality for all. For, if one of us is downtrodden, if one person's rights are violated, then all of humanity is diminished. This month let's all take the opportunity to acknowledge our own roles, our own mistakes in the past, and commit to working harder to see true equality in our lifetimes.

Dear CEE Congregants,

Happy New Year!

Attached is the December 2020 Budget to Actual report for Congregation Emanu El. December represents the half way point for the Temple since our year end is June 30, 2021.

Please note the following key points for income and expenses:

Congregation Emanu El Income Statement for the Period Ending December 31, 2020

- 1. There is a decrease of \$8,900 for dues and High Holiday contributions compared to the same time period last year. We cannot do much to recover the High Holiday donations, but if you haven't done so, please pay your dues as soon as possible.
- 2. Our fund-raising receipts are much lower than we budgeted for the fiscal year. We are still collecting contributions for the "No Ball Ball", so hopefully the gap between budget and actual will shrink in the category in our January 2021 statements.
- 3. The Board and our employees have kept our expenses to a minimum. There has been an increase from prior year due to the addition of the rabbi's assistant to our staff.

Mental Health Awareness in Action
Wintering

It's winter. And for many it's also a time of "wintering." That's a word that British writer Katherine May uses for some of the most difficult times in life. It's what may happen to us when a death devastates us, or we have a job loss, a divorce, an illness. A shock shatters our lives into a million pieces.

Or when the world is gripped by a virulent pandemic and all our lives are radically altered – like now.

And we go down into a dark place and we lose a sense of time, feel cast out of the world, and our brains fog over or even enter a prolonged suspension. Wintering. We have an urge to fight it – because maybe we don't have it so bad. Maybe in this pandemic we didn't lose any loved one or get sick ourselves or even lose our job or business. But pep-talking ourselves doesn't necessarily work. Sometimes we just have to accept. "We have seasons when we flourish and seasons when the leaves fall from us, revealing our bare bones," she says in her book Wintering: The Power of Rest and Retreat in Difficult Times that she wrote before the pandemic. Ms. May suggests it might be better to let go of protest, to exercise patience, practice kindness, and allow our hearts to forgive. She believes that works better, because when we do emerge, as we will, if we follow the natural flow, we will find we've learned something. Wintering will come again, and we'll know how to do it a little better. And eventually we'll be able to help others with their wintering. So, wisdom grows inside us. Sometimes wisdom blossoms from rest and retreat and patience, a special kind of spring.



Sarah Bunin Benor is Professor of Contemporary Jewish Studies at Hebrew Union College—Jewish Institute of Religion, where she teaches mostly masters students in the Zelikow School of Jewish Nonprofit Management and undergraduates at the University of Southern California.

She received her Ph.D. from Stanford University in Linguistics in 2004. She is the author of Becoming Frum: How Newcomers Learn the Language and Culture of Orthodox Judaism and Hebrew Infusion: Language and Community at American Jewish Summer Camps, as well as many articles about Jewish languages, Yiddish, and American Jews.

Dr. Benor has received several fellowships and prizes, including the Dorot Fellowship in Israel, the Wexner Graduate Fellowship, the Sami Rohr Choice Award for Jewish Literature, and 2020 National Jewish Book Award in Education and Jewish Identity by the Jewish Book Council.

She lives in Los Angeles with her husband, Mark, and their daughters, Aliza, Dalia, and Ariella.

The Rabbi Norman F. Feldheym Lecture series honors Congregation Emanu El's rabbi who served from 1937-1971. Rabbi Feldheym was a decorated chaplain in World War II and presided over Congregation Emanu El's dramatic expansion in the San Bernardino area in the mid-20th century. The Feldheym Central Library in San Bernardino bears his name and recently, Google has popularized the name "Feldheym" for the neighborhood near the library.

The lecture series was established in 1985 at the time of Rabbi Feldheym's passing.
