## **Rabbinic Reflections**

Emanu El,



These are challenging times that we are living in. In times of great uncertainty, we stand at a crossroads. Some people when faced with a challenge will focus on the hard pieces of the challenge, the pain and the suffering of these times. Others will look at a challenge as a period of re-invention, or a time which invites great creativity and possibility. When we are faced with moments of challenge we are presented with an exciting opportunity. Here we are Emanu El at a crossroads again. We are still managing a pandemic, yet many are vaccinated.

We have been apart out of an abundance of caution and safety for all of us. Yet we long for community and for one another. We are in need of capital so we can continue to fund all that we offer you and our community as a whole. Emanu El we want to invite you back to help us rebuild community, and our congregation. We are working to offer many ways for you to engage, so you can choose what you feel is safe during this time. Be a part of the re-creation of Emanu El.

The Jewish people have re-created their homeland, their faith and even their language many times in our long history. Lest you think we are the first to experience this, let me remind you of a famous innovator, Eliezer Ben Yehuda, who had the vision of reviving the Hebrew language from a dead language, used only for prayer, into a spoken living language. He began by raising his son with the language at a time that it was considered sacrilege to speak Hebrew. Now he is known as the father of Modern Hebrew, applauded for his efforts. As a result of his vision, hard work and courage to re-invent and persevere, Ben Yehuda re-invent-ed Hebrew. He renewed a "dead" language and now whole communities of Jews all over the world speak this language.

Emanu El, come and re-build with us. Together we will create a 21st century synagogue. We will re-engage with our age old traditions and our Emanu El core values and programs. From there we can begin to ensure that a Jewish community will be here in the Inland Empire for decades to come, for all who need. We invite you to join with us for our Chanukah Grand Re-Opening, Friday December 3rd at Emanu El. We will pray, celebrate Channukah, light channukiahs, and celebrate our history inside and outside our beautiful building. Join us, invite friends, Jews and other Community members. Come and be with us together. We need your help in getting the word out and celebrating together the Festival of Lights. Join us again on Sunday December 5th for our fourth annual Light up the Night in Ed Hales park. Bring a Chanukiah and candles, as we gather downtown to spread light.

Many of you have heard we are currently facing a huge financial crisis at Emanu El. We are looking to fill a budgetary hole of over \$100,000 and yes, there are many ways to help us. I want to share one opportunity with you. We invite you to donate to the Aronoff Matching Challenge. Leona Aronoff has invited us to raise \$25,000. The trustees of the Morton Aronoff Endowment Fund Trust, which was established to aid the congregation, have offered to loan the congregation \$25,000 if we raise this same amount ourselves. It's like doubling our money. We have already raised

\$7,000 in one week. Help us get to \$25,000 and maybe even beyond this figure. We are looking for 100% participation from our members in this fundraising effort. It will feel incredible to know that together everyone in our community cares enough about our survival to donate something, even if you can only donate a small amount. You can give what you are able. This is just the beginning of our investment in the future of Jewish community in the IE, and the legacy of Congregation Emanu El.

Emanu El together we can do wonderful things, re-invent a community, a people, a synagogue and our proud presence of Jewish expression that will be here for decades to come to serve Jews in the Inland Empire. Join us and let us walk forward into the future together, Kadima!

#### **Presidential Perspectives**



I'm the new president, and the honeymoon is over.

We have real work to do in our congregation to restore it to fiscal health. I promise you transparency; I will share the good, the bad, and the ugly.

We are beginning to heal as a community. We have to confront the injustices of the past and acknowledge them. We have to move forward together.

As we discussed at the question and answer session held on Veterans Day, we have made cuts that were drastic. We will probably need more cuts. We have raised some of the money to meet the Morton Aronoff Endowment Fund Trust Challenge to raise \$25,000 so that we do not run out of money in December. We need to raise another \$150,000 on top of that so that we do not run out of money in July, and also begin to build back better.

Please contact Margie Orland if you want to volunteer. We need help cleaning our synagogue and helping with repairs as needed. We need people to provide vocational service where they help our community in the same areas they have professional like accountants and lawyers. skills. Thank you to our existing volunteers, and please think of joining those volunteers.

What's most important to remember are some of the reasons our congregation formed in the 1850s. We were Jews in a new State, bringing the Torah with us. No matter what happens, we will still be together, so let's work together.

## **Treasurer's Report**



I have been asked to explain our current financial position and how we got here. I have been the Treasurer/CFO for the past 5 years and therefore will state financial facts for this time period. I will try to do so without boring you with numbers and statistics. I will also give you the facts – as painful as they may be.

#### We are on the verge of insolvency.

Our expenses are greater than our income by over \$164,000 for this fiscal year (July 1, 2021 to June 30, 2022). And yes, this reflects reducing our URJ dues from \$9,000 per year to \$1,980 per year and decreasing our payroll expenses by \$85,000 for the remainder of the year. In addition, we have cash on hand to pay bills until mid-January if no major building maintenance or financial issue arise during this time period.

How did we get here?

- 1. Membership has been decreasing over the past 5 years.
  - a. We have approximately 110 paying family units.
  - b. Our member units are the following age distribution:
    - i. 80 and older: 21%
    - ii. 70-80: 23%
    - iii. 60-70: 24%
    - iv. 50-60: 14%
    - v. 40-50: 7%
    - vi. 40 and younger: 10%
- 2. Full dues paying members have been decreasing over the past 5 years.
- **3.** We have not had a major Congregational Fund Raiser in over 3 years. The Gala honoring Paul Shimoff was our last big fundraiser. To make our budget balance, we have plugged a fundraising line item of \$100,000 or greater for the last 3 years. This line item has been explained to the Board and Congregation and the Budget has passed every year with this line item.
- 4. The number of students in the Religious School has been decreasing over the past 5 years. Our current enrollment is 11 students.
- 5. The number of students paying full tuition in the Religious School has been decreasing over the past 5 years.
- 6. The cost of utilities and personal have increased over the past 5 years.

What have we done so far:

For the past 5 years we have made the budget, or suffered a small loss, due to bequeaths and the Paycheck Protection Program.

- a. A donation of \$800,000 was restricted to reducing our mortgage. The good news is we only owe \$443,000 on the note. There are approximately \$16,000 of restricted dollars remaining to pay our mortgage obligation. This should provide 5 months of mortgage payments.
- b. A donation of \$120,000 was given to us and used as follows: \$60,000 used to reduce the mortgage,

\$60,000 to be used as needed by the Temple. We have \$40,000 remaining from this donation that will be used for operating costs over the next 2 months.

c. Two Payment Protection Program loans were granted, used and forgiven in the sum of approximately \$100,000. The purpose of the loans was to continue paying salaries during the pandemic. We used the monies for salaries.

A breakdown of income:

- 1. Dues: \$219,500
- 2. Donations: I am using the current year to date amount which is primarily from the High Holidays appeal: \$16,400
- 3. High Holiday Days: \$27,976
- 4. Building Fund: \$9,000
- 5. School for Jewish Living: \$4,600
- 6. Mortgage Relief Funds which will cover our mortgage Principle & Interest: 15,984
- Other monies which include temple use fees collected for future use, purchase of space on the perpetual wall, bar/bat mitzvah fees, credit card fee reimbursements: \$10,975
- 8. Total Income: \$304,435

A breakdown of expenses:


- 1. Clergy Expenses: \$223,303
- 2. Building Operations: \$35,866
- 3. Temple Utilities: \$33,100
- 4. Temple Insurance: \$22,400
- 5. Administration: \$65,755
- 6. School for Jewish Living: \$17,525
- 7. Music: \$29,131
- 8. Ritual: \$6,400
- 9. URJ Dues: \$1,980
- 10. Interest Expense: \$27,568
- 11. Other expenses including memorial wall, community programs, Seniors, and pay pal fees: \$5,700
- 12. Total expenses: \$468,728

Net Loss: \$164,293

What can "I" do?

We are at a crossroad for this Congregation. We need to ask ourselves what is most important to the Congregation: how do we do maintain our community and strengthen the bonds between us, where and what do we sacrifice. This is the most important topic this evening. Once we know that answer we make further budget cuts and sacrifices to meet that goal. But first we need to pull together as a Congregation. The "Blame Game" has to stop. Give us suggestions. Volunteer your time, expertise, and ideas. Our budget relied on fund raisers that unfortunately did not occur and dues that were not paid. If we don't have the income, we cannot pay our expenses and programs, people, and assets are lost.

I am the "newest" member on our executive board. I am willing to work hard to ensure our congregation continues but it has to be a community effort. We all need to work together, make tough choices, and stretch financially to make this work.





Mental Health Awareness in Action

In these Mental health Awareness In Action articles for our temple bulletin, we have always presented our own words. This month it's different. The following are words of our U.S. Surgeon General, Vice Admiral and Doctor Vivek H. Murthy. We have been struck by his wisdom and encouraged by his dedication to the physical and mental well-being of all Americans. Here he is speaking to host of "Science Friday," Ira Glass, that aired on KVCR-FM on July 23, 2021:

DR. VIVEK MURTHY: The issue that worries me the most apart from COVID is what's happening to our mental health. As a country overall, but particularly to our kids. Before COVID, we were already struggling with high levels of depression and anxiety. We were also struggling with high levels of loneliness, it turns out, which have marked impacts on the mental and physical health of individuals. But during COVID, what we saw is actually an increase in depression and anxiety. And particularly in certain populations, including health care workers and public health workers, including parents and caregivers, we saw a real increase in mental health stress and strain. And I worry about this, Ira, because I don't think that we were doing an amazing job before the pandemic in caring for the mental health and well-being of people in our country. We have significantly underinvested in prevention programs, even though we know what works. We still have a fragmented and underfunded treatment system. And we have this terrible stigma still, which makes people afraid to admit that they're struggling and that they need help.

It is heartening that we have a Surgeon General who takes mental health seriously, who talks about it, and encourages all of us to pay attention and make changes. He is like a light for our society, a candle in this dark time of year, as we light our own Chanukah candles, celebrating re-sanctification of our temple. Look for more in coming months from Dr. Murthy's book *Together: The Healing Power of Human Connection in a Sometimes Lonely World*.
