## Rabbinic Reflections



Dear Emanu El,

Yesterday's hostage situation in Colleyville Texas was a traumatic wake up call to the world about the continuing rise in Anti-Semitism in our country. It hit very close to home, as my colleague Rabbi Charlie Cryton-Walker was held for 11 hours inside his Reform synagogue. I received news of this event shortly after the end of our online Shabbat morning services. We are so grateful this event ended peacefully with the release of all hostages alive.

This morning I find myself thankful for the law enforcement and military professionals that came to support Rabbi Cryton-Walker and his captives. I am grateful for my colleagues who held one another close as we waited and watched these events unfold. None of us signed up for a career that we thought would be putting ourselves or our families at major risk.

As we gathered online last night in community with our Congregation Emanu El family and with our interfaith partners, I was filled with comfort. I am so grateful to our interfaith partners, those from the Muslim, Mormon, Christian, Catholic, and other faith communities. Thank you members of Redlands Area Interfaith Council, and others who joined us. We gathered and offered prayers of strength shared in times of trouble. Today we pray for healing for our Jewish family in Colleyville, Texas and all over the world. These are trying times Emanu El. The ongoing pandemic, the recent surge of Omicron, this most recent act of Anti-Semitism, can leave us feeling uneasy. Know that you are not alone. Your Rabbi and Jewish community are here to support you. We will be gathering on Tuesdays at noon online for support and connection. Please join us when you are able. Please reach out if you are in need of support or community.

In Judaism we have a prayer for escaping death, for all too near near misses. This prayer is said in challenging times, and during and after traumatic moments. This prayer is not recited lightly. For the past two years we have said this prayer together as a community at the high holidays, grateful for coming through this pandemic, illness, and these very trying times. Rav Judah teaches us there are four categories of people who should offer this prayer: they who go down to the sea, those who journey in the desert, they who recover from consumptive convalescence, and the prisoner who is set free (Berachot 54b). This prayer is an offering of gratitude for life, ever changing and moving forward. Traditionally this prayer is recited in a minyan, a sacred gathering of ten Jews. I invite you to reflect on this prayer and it's meaning in the coming days. I guarantee it is on the lips of most Jews this month.

*Baruch ata Adonai, Eloheinu melech ha-olam, ha-gomel l'chayavim tovot she-g'malani kol tov.*

Blessed are You, God, spirit of the universe, who rewards the undeserving with goodness, and who has rewarded me with goodness.

After the recitation of this blessing, the congregation responds:

*Mi she-g'malcha kol tov, hu yi-g'malcha kol tov selah.*

May he/she/they who rewarded you with all goodness reward you with all goodness for ever.

May our month be filled with Shalom!

Things are stabilizing.  
The financial committee is  
working early on the next  
budget for 2022-2023,  
initially, we need to find  
around \$57,000 in cuts or  
new money, so expect next  
year to be lean as well.

Meanwhile, with a combination of money  
raised in December and expected tax refunds, we  
need approximately another \$40,000 to cover  
this year's payroll/expenses through June 30,  
2022.

The nominating committee is preparing the  
proposed slate of officers for the annual meeting  
in May.

We continue to put out fires, sometimes even  
actual fires. There was a fire late last year in the  
Home of Eternity Cemetery causing a lot of  
damage. We need some help on our landscaping  
as we no longer have the services of our previous  
landscaper. Our automatic watering needs fixing.  
We have a lot of needs. If you can help, log into  
ShulCloud and donate. If your donation involves  
labor, call me at (909) 708-6055, and you will be  
put to work.

Remember, you have to wear a non-cloth  
mask, be fully vaccinated and boosted, and  
socially-distanced to be in our building. This is  
an OSHA issue and a workers' compensation  
issue.

Due to the success of the Morton Aronoff Endowment Fund Trust and matching challenge, we are able to pay off our Line of Credit with Banner Bank. We can now borrow up to \$25,000 from the Morton Aronoff Endowment Fund Trust at no interest.

I continue to assist Marcela Lavi and Julie Strain as our outside bookkeepers take over the financial duties previously performed by Judy Filsinger. Please be patient with us as we put accounting policies and procedures in place to make the process easier for the CEE staff and the bookkeepers

I will remain in this position until the middle of May 2022 when the next CFO will be voted in. ## Mental Health Awareness in Action Suicide

U.S. Representative from Maryland, Jamie Raskin, published a memoir and account of the attack on the U.S. Capitol of January 6, 2021. *Unthinkable* came out last month. Congressman Raskin's personal life and the national crisis merged together. One of his daughters and the husband of his other daughter had accompanied him to the Capitol that day, and not just by chance. A few days earlier his only son, 25 years old Tom, had died by suicide. They knew their father needed moral support. No one imagined their own lives would be in danger during the certification of the 2020 election that day. Trauma upon trauma.

As the pandemic continues, more and more professionals and others worry openly about the emotional stability of our young people. Depression and suicide seem to be increasing, especially among the young. And all of us are the ones in a position to see and help. Do you know the signs to watch for?

First thing to know is that if you suspect suicidal thoughts in family or friends close to you, do not hesitate to ask directly – Have you had thoughts of taking your own life? Or, Do you ever think about suicide?

Here's a list of warning signs from the National Suicide Prevention Lifeline:

- Talking about wanting to die or to kill themselves
- Looking for a way to kill themselves, like searching online or buying a gun
- Talking about feeling hopeless or having no reason to live
- Talking about feeling trapped or in unbearable pain
- Talking about being a burden to others
- Increasing use of alcohol or drugs
- Acting anxious or agitated; behaving recklessly
- Sleeping too little or too much
- Withdrawing or isolating themselves
- Showing rage or talking about seeking revenge
- Extreme mood swings

We would add, a sudden, unexplained lift of mood, as if everything is all planned and soon the suffering will be over. This may have been an unrecognized sign for the Raskin's.

And if it is you who is having suicidal thoughts, do not hesitate to call the Lifeline:

Or leave the number in a frequented place, like on the fridge, or give it to a friend as a sign you care. Representative Raskin was not able to save his son. He is now trying, with all his might, to help save democracy in America.

What we do and say to others, is what we do and say to ourselves.

In terms of leaving my post, I do not need to tell you that you are in excellent and capable hands. Our Sisterhood Board supports and loves this Temple. They have guided and supported me, and they are here to serve you during and after my transition as your Sisterhood President.

Daveed and I thank you for all of the ways that you have supported our family. We will miss you Rabbi Reznick, Cantor Bern-Vogel, and this beautiful community we so dearly love.

Professor Robert H. Freilich founded the Judaic Sacred Music Foundation in 2014 and merged his love of Jewish and classical music. The Foundation commissioned Dr. Steven P. Rothstein, a composer with a Ph.D. in Classical Music Composition from UCLA, to compose the Judaic Symphony. Together they identified synagogue melodies and motifs of the 18th-20th centuries to be included in the piece.

Join Steve Rothstein as he takes you through the journey to bring your favorite High Holy Days memories from the synagogue to the concert hall via a multi-media presentation.

The Rabbi Norman F. Feldheim Lecture series honors Congregation Emanu El's rabbi who served from 1937-1971. Rabbi Feldheim was a decorated chaplain in World War II and presided over Congregation Emanu El's dramatic expansion in the San Bernardino area in the mid-20th century. The Feldheim Central Library in San Bernardino bears his name and recently, Google has popularized the name "Feldheim" for the neighborhood near the library.

The lecture series was established in 1985 at the time of Rabbi Feldheim's passing.

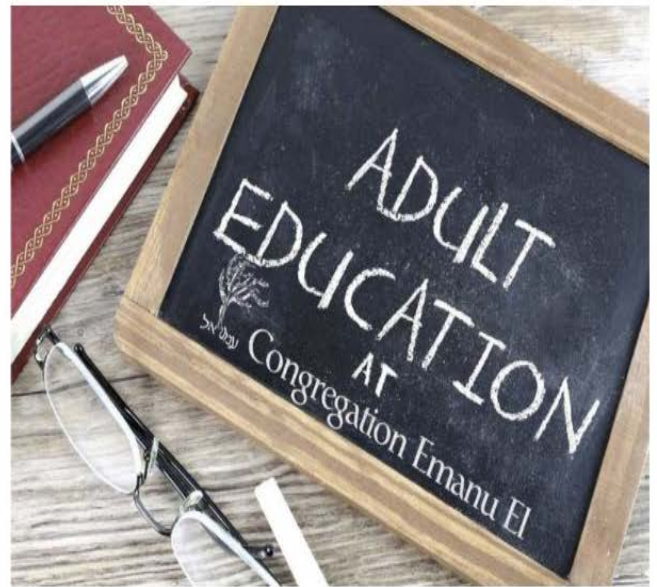
