Rabbinic Reflections



Dear Emanu El,

Who is your favorite female in the Purim story? As a child I was always in awe of Esther, maybe because of the crown, and the ball gowns that went along with playing the queen in any Purim play. As I got older I learned of the rebellious heroine Vashti, who spoke truth to power, and even put everything at risk including her role as queen, to stand up for what was right. Then I enjoyed dressing as the villain turned heroine, complete with her dark side and rebellious nature.

This year more than any other year, following two disturbing studies of horrible #metoo discoveries in our Jewish institutions of sacred scholarship, I echo the wisdom of my colleague Rabbi Tamara Cohen. She reminds us in the early days of feminism Esther was silenced and Vashti celebrated as the heroine of Purim due to her open defiance of the king and her defense of her body and sexuality. Vashti's popularity grew and Esther grew out of favor. Esther became a less desirable model because of her willingness to marry into power, and she used her beauty as manipulation. This minimized her role as a Jewish innovator and when she called for a new Jewish ritual, a public fast, in order to support a woman. Perhaps there is room for both women to be celebrated in our story, but for different reasons. After all as women we are each unique and offer different models of leadership.

Rabbi Cohen suggests that it is time for us to uplift both sources of feminine power in this month's Purim story. She argues not only is there space for two different models of female leadership, but two strong unique models of how women can use their political power and voice to uplift one another and create change in our community. As we go into Purim 2022 I pray that all the silenced voices, the women, the marginalized, those whose stories and names we are yet to know are uplifted to help us increase our joy and create a more equal Jewish community. May we take off our masks, and be seen as our true selves. May we embrace those who are willing to do so, and invite others to feel safe enough to let their masks down. Purim Sameach, Happy Purim!

Mental Health Awareness in Action

If our nearly inexhaustible coronavirus gives us a break this spring, more of us may be going back to work. Surely it will feel strange. Some colleagues may have changed. Oh, they might be the same people, but maybe altered by the pandemic. As we all have been. Who are they now? Who are we now?

Or maybe you are a member of an organization, and just now or soon, you'll be meeting with the other members again. Most of us, in one way or another, will be re-entering the world of in-person life. Or perhaps gatherings without masks, as faces may reappear.

And it's also possible that even before March 2020, we didn't know our colleagues very well anyway. Too much to do in too little time. And we may have always felt distant and estranged from those we work with.

It's time for our stories. Stories tell us who we are, who our workmates are, who our bosses are. But how can we fit that in the busy day? First, by understanding how important our relationships are, even at work, and by deciding to make time for what happens among people.

Dr. Vivek Murthy, our nation's Surgeon General, did make time. This was way before the pandemic, but he knew "we need meaningful connections at work to sustain us." So, he created what he called "Inside Scoop" at the U.S. Department of the Surgeon General. As he described it: "At each weekly staff meeting, one team member was asked to share something about themselves through pictures for five minutes. Presenting was an opportunity to share more of our lives, and listening was an opportunity to recognize our colleagues in the way they wished to be seen." How personal, how deeply a person wanted to go was up to them. "Inside Scoop" quickly became the team's favorite time of the week. Everyone felt more valued after seeing their colleagues' genuine reactions to their stories."

And then Dr. Murthy noticed less stress in the air. Quiet staff members spoke up more. People reported feeling more connected and truly part of a team with a common mission.

We all have our stories to tell, with or without pictures. We have stories of what made us who we are. We all have pandemic stories. This is a perfect time to be more together, listening to and discovering each other. Connecting.
