Rabbinic Reflections



With Passover quickly upon us, I am thinking about memories of seder's past in my family and with all the communities I have served. Passover is a holiday that most Jews have experienced, and even some non-Jews. It has so many nostalgic scents, sounds,

and sights, like the mess after the seder that's left for the host to clean up. My children's old nanny used to call passover the festival of the crumbs. That sounds about right.

"Remember the days of old; consider the years of many generations" (Deuteronomy 32:7). Our Torah compels us to remember the generations that came before us, to remember our ancestors, our history, and our struggles. These memories some believed are hardwired into our DNA. Every year, hundreds of giant green sea turtles swim from their natural habitat on the Brazilian coast to any Ascension Island in the Atlantic Ocean in order to mate. A researcher and conservation biologist Archie Carr spent many investigative hours trying to understand how these turtles found their way from such an immense distance; even planes were unable to locate the island. He asserted that the turtles navigate using genetic memory. According to this scientist, millions of year ago, when a strip of land bisected the Atlantic, the journey from Brazil to the closest stretch of the eastern shore was only a short swim. Millions of years later that land is not submerged in water. But the turtles, driven by their genetic memory, still search and find the last remaining remnant of the world that disappeared into the ocean-Ascension Island. Every year these turtles return to perpetuate the species and the memory.

As a Jewish people who is diverse, and accompanied by non-Jews as well, what is in our genetic memory? What did our grandparents leave for us? What genetic memory will we embed for our children's children's generation who are yet to be born. Being a 21st century Jew means that we think about laying a foundation for the future Jewish community. The past two years during the Pandemic has brought great change to the religious life landscape. In order to continue to exist as a home for Jews in the Inland Empire we must re-invent based on the current landscape of religious life in 2022. Join us at Congregation Emanu El, and help us lay a new foundation that will exist for decades to come. Do this for your children's children, so someday in the future our people will continue to migrate using genetic memory back to their Jewish home in the Inland empire.

We celebrate Spring and renewal with our beloved **Festival of Pesach or Chag HaMatzot**. It is soon followed by the observance of **YOM HASHOAH**, the 27th of Nisan, established in 1959 by the State of Israel to commemorate the Warsaw Ghetto Uprising.

After a disappointing two-year postponement, Congregation Emanu El is looking forward to hosting a concert to commemorate *Yom Hashoah* in collaboration with Spinet, the Redlands chamber music society and oldest such in California, for their April offering to the community on April 26th. Benjamin and Miriam Kovitz, of blessed memory] lyrically and sensitively put the poem to music with voice, flute and piano. Please make plans to join us on this auspicious date to welcome our musical guests as well.

Mental Health Awareness in Action One Man's Story

Hardly any of us are unaware that many people living on our streets suffer from mental illness, often severe mental illness. We may think, surely someone should be caring for these people. Surely they would be better off with shelter and food and treatment.

We may know that our police departments and citizen organizations are helping the homeless. Yet the number of people who live on the streets does not seem to diminish. And we also may have heard that our jails, even prisons, have an alarming number of inmates with mental illness. We may think their problem is more ill health than criminality. But nothing seems to change.

In November, the LA Times published a very long article titled "Falling through a tattered safety net" about one man in his 40's who like many started out life well and developed schizophrenia in his 20's. From then until now, he lives a life no one would choose; in and out of jail, on and off drugs and alcohol, in and quickly out of mental health facilities, on the streets and back alleys. This man has devoted siblings with knowledge and connections. One brother is an administrator at Patton State Hospital. One sister oversees the homeless for LA County. Even they cannot get needed help for their brother.

Laws prevent them from learning about their brother's condition, or even when he's admitted to psychiatric hospitals. The arrest records are more available to them; they know how to find out when he's in jail. Often. The story told in this LA Times article is tortuous, deeply painful to read. Yet it is just one man's story, spanning LA, Riverside, San Bernardino Counties, and detailing decades of neglect, in spite of the constant work of sister and brother.

There are not nearly enough places that care for serious mental health patients. Even when everyone, the courts, the doctors, the family agree that long term placement is necessary, the wait can be interminable.

We have to look at ourselves. We have to have the conversation about how, as a society, we can do the best for people who are seriously ill, and make the laws and regulations that are sensible, humane, effective. If you read this one story from the LA Times edition of November 28, 2021, we think you will emerge wiser, and alarmed, and eager to do what we can to collectively change this horrid reality for too many people struggling beyond coping with severe mental illness.
