Cantorial Comments

Erev Shavuot – June 5th



The three Pilgrim Festivals, or *Shalosh Regalim*, are the three occasions when the [male] Israelites were required to go to Jerusalem to offer sacrifice at the Temple and bring offerings of the produce from their fields. Special Psalms (called collectively Hallel) are read and prayers are recited that vary with the nature of the festival. Additionally, at all of these festivals, Yizkor memorial prayers are recited.

QUIZ QUESTION: If we read and chant the Song of Solomon [*Shir haShirim*] on Passover and Ecclesiastes [*Kohelet*] on Sukkoth, what do we read on Shavuot? If you answered *The Book of Ruth*, you would be correct! In addition to being a beautiful story, the story of Ruth and Naomi also marks the very first known conversion in Jewish biblical history.

Also on Shavuot, The Ten Commandments are read from the Torah, we will offer *Yizkor* memorial prayers, Jerry Ripley and I will present some special musical arrangements and there will be delicious dairy specialties, courtesy of our Sisterhood! Presidential Perspectives



One of my favorite music artists, John Fogarty, once said 'it's déjà vu all over again'. Seems I remember about 10 years ago at little Ford being elected and serving three years as president. I guess I'm just a glutton for punishment.

Congregation Emanu El is at a crossroads. Either we will forge a way to keep our historic temple alive and vital to this Jewish community, or we will close our doors, sell our building, and disperse all of our assets to other Jewish organizations. I for one want us to remain alive and vital and I believe our executive committee and board of directors do as well.

I'm not here to point fingers and will not allow you to either. Over the last 20 plus years we have been watching our membership drop to the point where it is now only about 100 members. Our expenses, as tightly as they are controlled, exceed our revenue. Each of the previous boards did the best they could to make the right changes. We have sought council from the Union for Reform Judaism, from an interim rabbi, from our temple business leaders, and from our membership, to no avail. Significant changes are on the horizon. There is no time left for further delay. You will be hearing more from us regarding changes and programs in July.

The definition of 'congregation' is "a gathering of people" or, in our case, "a group of people assembled for religious worship". We are down to this: we need you to congregate, be present in our building in as many activities as possible. We will try to offer many options, but you need to be here. If you have ideas, email them to me or speak to any board member.

If you have not finished paying your dues for this past year please do so in the next four weeks. In June, you will receive a letter and billing in the mail outlining your dues for the 2022-23 fiscal year. Please consider giving more, as much as you can. We will also greatly appreciate any of you who can pay in-full in the month of July. I am increasing my dues pledge by 30% and will be paying it in July, I challenge you to do the same and help get us off to a good start in the new year. Let's congregate together again.

Our congregation's finances are complicated and over those years, Kathy faced many challenges in keeping our congregation solvent and the bills paid. Kathy, thank you for all you did, your commitment to our congregation and your financial expertise! You have laid a wonderful foundation for me to work with and serve our congregation.

The 2021/22 fiscal year is coming to an end June 30th. Please pay your 2021/22 dues and pledge outstanding balances to CEE as soon as possible. If you are not sure what the balance due on your account is, please contact Eric Beasley at the Temple Office and he can give you that information. The number is 909-307-0400. Our cash flow is always tight this time of year and we would appreciate having all accounts settled before the 2022/23 Fiscal Year begins.

In June we will be sending your 2022/2023 dues statements. Please be on the lookout! The budget approved by the Board and by the members at our annual meeting in May includes a 3% dues increase. The new dues statement amount reflects that increase. The statement will also include an ACH/Credit Card form; complete this form and return to the temple office if you would like to pay your dues from your bank account or use a credit card. A new form must be completed each fiscal year for those members wishing to pay their dues in this manner.

As always, I encourage, any member to reach out to me to discuss any concerns they may have regarding their dues obligations. We NEVER deny membership based on dues. We trust that everyone realizes the importance of paying their fair share to maintain our Congregation, Jewish life, and traditions in our community. Mental Health Awareness in Action
A Special Music Center

Ah, music! Do you love music? Some of us say we love music more than almost anything in the world. It's like oxygen. That's what a young musician named Nuci used to say. He played, he wrote songs, and he lived near Athens, Georgia. Now his Mother has created a special place in Athens for musicians and music of every genre. Come on in, she says, make music, and also get counseling, if you want, sit and talk in a support group, get a referral for a mental health professional, and here's a phone number you can call if things get really bad and you're scared you might take your own life. Here people understand, there is no stigma, you can be yourself.

The BBC World Service did an Outlook report on Nuci's Space and its creator, Linda Phillips. She's a nurse, and she and her physician husband lost their son to suicide in 1996. Only after long mourning, after she finally, as she put it, "got my joy back," was she able to honor him with a place helping musicians who struggle with depression and any mental illness. The center "changed my life and probably saved me," she said, and continues to save and help many others as well.

Linda Phillips has advice for parents of kids who seem to change in puberty or young adulthood, or at any time. When the change involves wholesale withdrawal, and he or she seems like a wholly different person, pay attention and seek help. She says to remember "it's not your fault, it has nothing to do with the love you're giving your child." It's a disease and needs to be treated. Help them to live and make whatever kind of music their life calls them to make.
