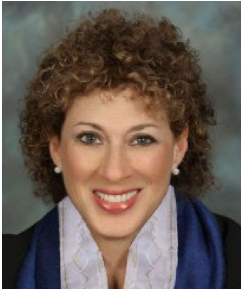

Cantorial Comments

The Days in-Between and Beyond...time for your 'Soulfie'!



When you receive this October bulletin, we will be in the middle of *Aseret Yamei Teshuvah* – the Ten Days of Repentance that began at the end of September with Rosh Hashanah and conclude with Yom Kippur. There is another lesser-known name for the 40 days of Elul, this season of *Teshuvah*- leading up to and including Yom Kippur, which are called the *Yamei Ratzon* – the “Days of Favor”. Some have likened these forty days to the number of weeks it takes for the human fetus to be formed within the womb. *Teshuvah* is a sort of death and rebirth: a death of the past life and the birth of a new one. What an opportune gift our spiritual new year gives us!

We are still in the season of closely examining our souls and practicing how expansively our hearts can open. Did you know that ‘the gates’ that spiritually seal us all in the Book of Life until next year do not actually close until after Sukkot? We fervently sing in our Ne’ilah liturgy: “open the gates” *p’tach lanu sha’ar!!!* How about adding another layer of understanding to our prayers this year: praying to open the *she’arim de liba* - the gates of our own hearts for mercy, compassion and righteousness towards ourselves and others?

Is it possible to look at ourselves in the mirror and acknowledge what is truly there? Not just the façade, but behind the appearance? We take a lot of ‘selfies’ these days – shouldn’t that enlighten us as to ‘what is there?’ While we may come up with some great shots, we know they are only surface images – what sort of honest inner accounting can this be versus ‘*where am I needed?*’ ‘*have I strayed from the path of my life?*’ ‘*have I stopped learning and growing and changing?*’ Maybe it’s time, as Rabbi Naomi Levy suggests in her book *Einstein and the Rabbi*, to take a **SOUL-FIE!** We are taught, Rabbi Levy explains, that ‘the soul is a mirror of God within us....the souls sees but is not seen, just as God sees but is not seen....the soul is the god of the body, God is the Soul of the world.’

According to Rabbi Levy, here are four questions for you to meditate on that can help you in taking your own **SOUL-FIE**.

- 1) What has my soul been trying to say to me that I’ve been ignoring?
- 2) What activities and experiences nourish my soul that I don’t do enough of?
- 3) What does my soul want to repair that my ego is too stubborn or too fearful to repair?
- 4) What does my soul want me to reach for?

Kotvenu b'sefer he-Chayyim!! [Avinu Malkeinu prayer]
May we all be inscribed in the *Book of Life* for 5783!!

Mental Health Awareness in Action

Now in its ninth year, Mental Health Awareness In Action has focused its efforts on ending the stigma. In doing this we have promoted the value of sharing mental health stories and are not alone in our efforts. The personal stories of celebrities and non-celebrities who have faced mental health crises regularly appear these days in every form of media.

Frequently, these stories do not reveal in depth the dark parts of coming to manage a mental illness. Former Congressman and mental health advocate Patrick Kennedy has been public about his own struggles with bipolar disorder and addiction and shares, "In all my decades advocating for mental health, I realized one fundamental premise: You must talk about the bad first. Because if you talk about the good first, nobody's going to listen."

Bucking the trend to avoid the dark parts, the 2022 PBS documentary presented by Ken Burns' *Hiding in Plain Sight* offers an unvarnished window into daily life with mental health challenges, from seemingly insurmountable obstacles to stories of hope and resilience

The film uniquely features first-person accounts from more than 20 young people, ranging in age from 11 to 27, who live with mental health conditions and courageously tell their stories.

The directors of the series, Erik and Chris Ewers, note that our culture tends to whitewash things, especially when it comes to kids. Many times, they were told when making this film, **it's too dark or you're making a big mistake**. They acknowledge it can be a very dark topic, and it involves children, and it's a difficult film. They say, however, it is intended for families of teens and young adults—to watch together to foster understanding and initiate vital conversations.

As we move through our High Holy Days, our self-examinations and also our rejoicing for a New Year and renewal, we can let the pain of our struggling young people enter into our awareness and perhaps find a companion inside us, one that understands and stands with them. Maybe we can help make this 5783 a year that lifts us all.

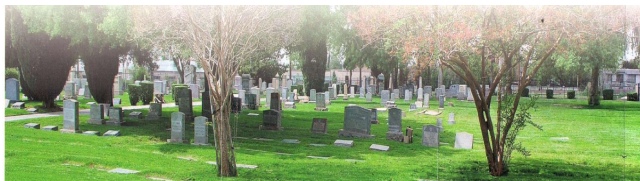

Kever Avot V'Imahot Service At Our Cemetery During the High Holy Days



It is a long-standing cherished tradition to visit the graves of loved ones during the High Holy Day period. This is known as *Kever Avot V'Imahot* (literally, the graves of the ancestors). At this service special memorial prayers are recited and the rabbi delivers a brief message that stresses the importance of honoring the memories of loved ones

Kever Avot will be held on Sunday, October 2nd at 1:00 pm at our Home of Eternity Cemetery, 8th and Sierra Way, San Bernardino. While this service memorializes those buried or entombed at our historic cemetery, it is certainly appropriate for all to attend, even if their loved ones are buried elsewhere. At the end of the service those attending can go to the graves or crypts of loved ones for individual memorial prayers. Rabbi Cohn will be there to share those prayers with you.

Yom Kippur Mincha-Afternoon Speakers

A long-standing practice of our congregation is to have three congregants speak as part of the Mincha-Afternoon service on Yom Kippur. This year the speakers will be Dr. Beverly Dolberg, Dr. Philip Gold and Kat Grossman. The theme of their presentations is taken from a key phrase in the biblical book of Jonah that is the Haftarah (Prophetic reading) for Yom Kippur afternoon. "Jonah is asked, 'where have you come from? What is your country, and of what people are you?' Jonah replied 'I am a Hebrew.'" (Jonah 1:8-9). In keeping with that statement, the speakers on Yom Kippur afternoon will speak on "I am a Jew - What That Means to Me." We look forward to their presentations.

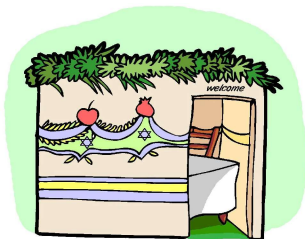
