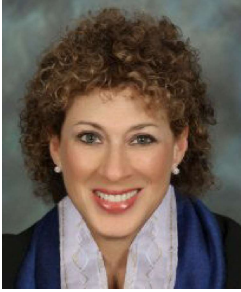

Cantorial Comments

SJL-Our KEYS to the future & historical KEYS to the past



We have arrived at the Hebrew month of *Cheshvan*! Along with lightning and thunder, at the conclusion of the High Holy Days, you probably also heard the collective clergy sigh from around the globe! Corresponding with the month of November, *Cheshvan* contains no Jewish holidays! We thank our dedicated and talented choir members this year: **Lisa Wise-Wolk, Sheri Maltzman, Chel Zipperstein, Barb Smith, Emily Croft and George Petit under Jerry Ripley's direction**; we had a joyful conclusion to our High Holy Day season with the Consecration of our new students at our Simchat Torah celebration. It has been a joy to be at Temple on these first opening Sunday mornings to witness all our new students enthusiastically following their dedicated **SJL teachers**,

Sheri Maltzman and Ilene Mino in learning and play. **Our children are the KEYS to the future!**

November is the month of several important civic holidays: Veteran's Day and Thanksgiving. I am excited about our *Veteran's Day Shabbat Service* on November 11th at which time we will honor several of our valued congregants. Every year in November, we also commemorate *Kristallnacht* – the infamous pogrom, *Night of Broken Glass*, that occurred during the night of November 9, 1938 which has great personal significance for my family. Synagogues throughout Germany and Austria were set ablaze, windows and contents of Jewish storefronts bashed in and destroyed and books by Jewish authors demonstratively burned in the streets. A few of you heard my mother, **Marianne Bern's [nee Katzenstein]** story; born in Germany, exactly 100 years ago this year, into an intellectual and musical family, she played piano and the organ. She was the last person present in their hometown synagogue of Bielefeld; after practicing the organ the evening of November 9, 1938, she dutifully locked the door with her key and went home. In the morning, their beautiful, historic synagogue was completely in flames. Nothing remained of the building... except the KEY, which remained with her until her death in 2017. We have it carefully stored away until we find the right museum for its safekeeping in perpetuity. **A KEY to the past...**

Last year, one of my British cousins discovered our **grandfather's [Lawyer and Notary, Willy Katzenstein, 1874-1951] historic autobiography and war journals** which are being translated from German into English and will be at the **Leo Baeck** archives in London. Rabbi Leo Baeck happened to be a good friend of my grandfather. My grandfather, like so many German Jews, was a patriotic German who fought proudly for Germany in WWI. Here are a couple of small excerpts which I find thought-provoking for us in our own synagogue communities today, even 120 years later...

"The first awakening of Jewish community feelings in me came as a consequence of my close personal relationship with my uncle Moritz Katzenstein in Bielefeld and my old teacher and friend, the Rabbi Dr. Coblenz. This was in 1902 when the leaders of the community were considering erecting a new temple..."

"In September 1905, I felt great joy when we were able to dedicate the new, very beautiful synagogue...with its proud dome and its magnificent organ, it was not just a beautiful synagogue for the community, but also a decoration and jewel for the city of Bielefeld. Who of the participants in the dedication ceremony could have suspected that 33 years later, the dark time of the Middle Ages would be revived for us Jews and the splendid temple would go up in flames at the command of another, godless German government."

Ironically, in 1905, the same year the Bielefeld synagogue was built, George Santayana, wrote his book The Life of Reason. **"Those who cannot remember the past are condemned to repeat it."**

Attention Members aged 72 with Required Minimum Distributions for 2022

**Please consider donating any portion of
your RMD to Congregation Emanu El.**

**Taxpayers aged 72 or older this year can
come out ahead at tax time by making
donations directly from an IRA.**

**The tax provision, called the qualified
charitable distribution, helps taxpayers,
especially those who don't itemize
deductions, get a tax break for donations
of as much as \$100,000 a year. The
charitable distribution counts toward the
RMD but doesn't count as income.**

**Consult with your tax advisor. Contact
the holder of IRA fund(s) to send
whatever portion of the RMD for the year
you wish. This will reduce the taxable
portion of your Required Minimum
Distribution, and ALSO, reduce the
income portion that affects the taxability
portion of any Social Security income
received.**



Mental Health Awareness in Action

Art Angel

Here's something simple: You sit before a blank piece of paper, and you want to draw or paint something. You have to decide what color pen or crayon to pick up, and then what form to make. Simple, right? In that instant, something in your brain has to imagine something. Color and form. And, if only vaguely, what you want it all to look like. And you have to care enough to choose.

Simple, right? And yet it can be liberating, even giving you the feeling of soaring. Because anything you can imagine you might be able to create.

In Scotland, there is a program called Art Angel. In a big room people who have mental health problems gather and create art. They are artists, learning as they create. They are imaging all kinds of beauty, and then teaching themselves how to bring that into the world. And no one is instructing them. They are learning by doing it, by making art. And just making a choice about what color to use can start people on a good path.

And they are not alone. They are among people whom they come to know. They take breaks together and chat about their art, drink tea (remember this is the UK). There are people there who encourage them and can give little tips. And everyone has suffered from some form of mental illness, so judgementalism doesn't exist. And as they make art, they grow in confidence, which tends to spill over into other aspects of their lives.

As one of the artists said: "Art Angel opens your mind up to a realm of possibilities. Nothing is impossible." Or another participant: "Recoveryis about developing a new life, and new things that are going to help you get well, stay well, and have an enhanced life.....be part of something, part of a community." And recovery can also be about seeing in a new way. Doing art, as one photographer learned, is very much about learning to see what is right around us. The world started to come alive for him. And so did he.

We learned about Art Angel from a book by Rob Hopkins called *From What Is to What If*. He could see there was something about "the combination of the safe and welcoming physical space, the egalitarianism, the sense of community, the honouring of personal stories, and the learning once again to use their hands and experience their imagination" that helped people see

themselves in new stories, better stories, and move toward health. He also notes, a similar program could provide space for gardening, baking, welding, playing music, dancing, and working with animals. Hands and imagination are a powerful, enlivening combination.

Imam Abdullah Antepli is a globally acknowledged leader in inter-religious dialogue. He directs (with Yossi Klein Halevi) the Shalom Hartman Institute's Muslim Leadership Initiative. Born in Turkey, he served as Duke University's first Muslim chaplain; its director of Center for Muslim Life, and teaches in the Duke Divinity School. The NonProfit Times recognized him as one of their Power & Influence Top 50 leaders of 2019, calling him one of the most prominent Muslim leaders in higher education today.



Rabbi Jeffrey K. Salkin is one of American Judaism's most prolific and most-quoted rabbis. His blog, "Martini Judaism: for those who want to be shaken and stirred," published by the Religion News Service, won a 2022 Wilbur Award for best religion blog of the year. His essays have appeared in the Washington Post, Tablet, Mosaic, Forward, and Commentary. He has written ten books on bar/bat mitzvah, Israel, masculinity, and Jewish culture, as well as three Torah commentaries. He serves as the rabbi of Temple Israel in West Palm Beach, Florida.

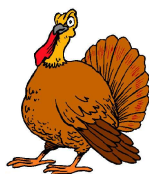

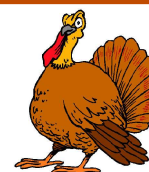
