Mental Health Awareness in Action "Facing Suicide" 1 Courage to Ask the Question

The prospect of someone we love dying by suicide carries a special terror. Their dying by some accident is horrible enough, but that clearly would be out of our control, and probably out of their control, too. But suicide? Someone in dark despair decides to end their life. And if they are skillful enough, it may be done.

And don't we all know people in our lives who have experienced depression and sometimes felt hopeless? The professionals have been telling us that asking the all-important question can be the key to getting help for them before they make any attempt. Yet the question – Have you been thinking about suicide? Do you have thoughts of taking your own life? – is downright scary. We don't want to suggest anything drastic like that. We are panicked at the thought of even allowing that possibility to enter our minds. It is just too hard to face.

And yet, it is the all-important question. It is the essential door towards help and change for someone who feels hopeless, unworthy, alone, and in pain. The honest response of the person you ask is already a breath of fresh air coming through the door. And some essential conversation may come in its wake, and your own instincts will help you know what to do next.

You might ask if they have spoken with anyone else about this. Or 'Have you sought help?' Or 'Can I come over and we can talk more about this?' Or you might rush over to them without asking, or call 911. Or persuade them to call the new national lifeline, 988. There are many ways to save a life.

It all begins with the question, 'Are you thinking of ending your life?' or 'Have you been thinking that life isn't worth living?' or 'Do you want to die?' And where do we get the courage to ask it? From knowing that it works most of the time.

The door opens, the fresh air enters, the darkest of moods pass, and we are there to help and support and love.

In September PBS aired a wonderful program called "Facing Suicide," full of stories and advice and science and love. We'll hear more from it in the coming months.

But here's one quote from a young Montana Native American who came close to trying to die by his own hand: "Today might be hard, but tomorrow is a new day." A new day, a new year, a new life. Please ask the all-important question if you are worried.

The Rabbi Norman F. Feldheym Memorial Lecture was established in 1985 at the time of his death by members of Congregation Emanu El as well as many friends in the wider community. Rabbi Feldheym served as rabbi of Congregation Emanu El in San Bernardino from 1937 to 1971 and as Rabbi Emeritus from 1971 until his death. Over the years the annual lecture has dealt with some of Rabbi Feldheym's major interests. Rabbi Feldheym was a devoted student of Freudian and Jungian psychology and in his retirement he taught at the world renowned Jung Institut on Switzerland. Over the years Rabbi Feldheym led various groups in the congregation and community focusing on the interpretation of dreams

He is the author of "The Interwoven Lives of Sigmund, Anna, and W. Ernest Freud: Three Generations of Psychoanalysis" (2015) and his most recent book "Libido, Culture, and Consciousness - Revisiting Freud's Totem and Taboo" (2022) Dr. Benefited earned his BA and MS in clinical psychology at San Francisco State University and his PhD at the California School of



Professional Psychology in Berkeley/Atameda and was in supervision with Dr. Nathan Adler for five years. From 1999 to 2010 he lived and worked in Venezuela where he maintained a private practice and taught at Central University of Venezuela and Catholic University Andes Bellow. He was named an Honorary Member of the American Psychoanalytic Association in recognition of his clinical work and his dedication to Psychoanalytic deviation.
