

Cantorial Comments



In Memoriam, Jerry Ripley z.l.

This is the month that we celebrate *Shabbat Shirah* – the Shabbat in Song – in connection with *Parashat B'shalach* which contains the 'Song of the Sea' in Exodus 15. When you look inside the scroll, you see a completely different layout compared to the usual columns of text. Some suggest they resemble the bricks the Israelite slaves were forced to build under Egyptian rule. I am always reminded of the waves of the sea. For Cantors, synagogue musicians and choirs, this is always one of highlights of the calendar year. Our

beloved Jerry Ripley, of blessed memory, who died unexpectedly on January 11, and I had enjoyed planning special music together for this occasion for the past thirteen years. What a significant season for Jerry's passing to the heavenly hosts.

This is the section of the Torah that includes the *Mi Chamocha* prayer. Can you find it? We are reminded in a rabbinic *midrash* or interpretation that when Egyptian hosts were drowning in the Red Sea, and 'the angels in heaven were about to break forth into songs of jubilation, the Holy One, blessed be He, silenced them with the words, "My creatures are perishing, and you are ready to sing!" Their deaths marred the completeness of Israel's victory.

While Jerry would insist that we sing and rejoice with all of our hearts - we will - while at the same time knowing that his passing forever mars the fullness of our celebration. *Zichrono Liv'racha*. Your gentle soul will forever be a blessing.

Mental Health Awareness in Action "Facing Suicide" 2

We don't know what is happening to cause a frightening increase in suicide in our country. And it's not only here. For example, many American farmers are dying by suicide. So are many farmers in India. In recent years the U.K. has created a new position called the Minister of Loneliness. And the entire country of Denmark has made psychiatric care free to all citizens, strictly controlled fire arms, and created programs and outreach to help people get the care they need.

We look at American demographics. We have a big increase since 1999. Most successful suicides are among white, middle-aged or older men. This is also true among Native Americans, youth, LGTBQ youth, and those whose families have a history of suicide.

Dr. Thomas Joiner says in the PBS program "Facing Suicide" that there are 3 things that can combine to push a person to suicide:

- 1. Perceived burdensomeness
- 2. Thwarted belongingness
- 3. And critically, the means to do it

In a depressed state someone may think everyone in their lives will be better off without them. This is almost never the reality, but it is a kind of despairing, tunnel vision perception. Someone may feel rejected or ostracized by family or friends. That lonely feeling leads to more withdrawal, which makes the feeling worse. The best reaction if someone close to you is feeling that way is to connect with them, ask if they are thinking of ending their lives, and talk about it.

And, as you might guess, the availability of firearms in our country is often the third truly deadly element in this troika. Twice as many firearms kill people by suicide than by homicide. Our gun population is much larger than our human population. Action No. 1 might be to lock up, or temporarily give a gun to a good friend, with ammunition removed, locked up, and put elsewhere.

And if you are thinking of ending your life, connecting to someone who can help – a friend, a family member – or calling 988, the national lifeline, can halt the impulse to kill yourself and start the process toward healing. So, if you, or someone close to you, stops laughing, can't find pleasure in usually pleasurable things, feels useless, lonely, and isolated, the remedy is to reach out, to connect with others, to do the heart talking. To call 988.

Let's all be there for each other. Let's breathe deeply and step back from the darkest hole, and call each other, meet with each other, and talk. Spring is around the corner.

Rabbi Feldheym served as rabbi of Congregation Emanu El in San Bernardino from 1937 to 1971 and as Rabbi Emeritus from 1971 until his death. Over the years the annual lecture has dealt with some of Rabbi Feldheym's major interests. Rabbi Feldheym was a devoted student of Freudian and Jungian psychology and in his retirement he taught at the world renowned Jung Institut on Switzerland. Over the years Rabbi Feldheym led various groups in the congregation and community focusing on the interpretation of dreams.


Dr. Daniel S. Benveniste grew up in San Bernardino where he and his family were members of Congregation Emanu El. He is also Visiting Professor of Clinical Psychology in Wuhan, China. He is the author of "The Interwoven Lives of Sigmund, Anna, and W. Ernest Freud: Three Generations of Psychoanalysis" (2015) and his most recent book "Libido, Culture, and Consciousness - Revisiting Freud's Totem and Taboo" (2022). Dr. Benefited earned his BA and MS in clinical psychology at San Francisco State University and his PhD at the California School of Professional Psychology in Berkeley/Alameda and was in supervision with Dr. Nathan Adler for five years. From 1999 to 2010 he lived and worked in Venezuela where he maintained a private practice and taught at Central University of Venezuela and Catholic University Andes Bellow. He was named an Honorary Member of the American Psychoanalytic Association in recognition of his clinical work and his dedication to psychoanalytic education.


