From last Elul to our upcoming Festival of Shavuot, we have celebrated and mourned, studied, sung and worshiped together and also made time for fun and entertainment. These months of May and June include some exciting musical offerings which our congregation is blessed to host and present; please mark your calendars for: **Tuesday, May 16th at 7:30 p.m., Dr. Lois Musmann** is bringing her **MUSICA VIVA choir and chamber orchestra** back for a stunning program of music called “On Wings of Love”. If you attended last year’s Yom Hashoah commemoration concert, you may remember the breathtaking performance of the ‘Nimrod movement’ from Elgar’s Enigma Variations; it can be heard here - <https://youtu.be/sUgoBb8m1eE>. It is undoubtedly one of the most gorgeous pieces of music you will have ever heard and it will be offered in Jerry Ripley’s memory.. MUSICA VIVA is sponsored by the Spinet Organization together with Congregation Emanu El.

For over two years, Jerry Ripley, of blessed memory, and I were planning a ‘revival’ of the Sephardic concert program we presented several years ago. We had finally secured a post-Covid date for June 4th and then... in January, tragedy struck and we lost our long-time friend and Congregation Emanu El accompanist. I was determined to hold on to the date and present the program in Jerry’s memory. Thanks to several generous Temple sponsors, we have been able to secure three amazing musicians – **percussionist Noam Israeli; Oud player [and master of other mid-eastern instruments] Miles Jay; and the wonderful pianist, Leeav Sofer, whose band, Mostly Kosher,** wowed us at our last Cantor’s Concert in February 2020. Presidential Perspectives



In my January article I spoke of our intent to hire a new Rabbi. The Executive Committee and Board of Directors consider this a high priority. We do not go into this process without much deliberation and consideration of our financial situation, both past and present. Our 2023-24 budget was published in last month's *Bulletin* and if you read it you know that we have a balanced budget (as we should) and funds are included for a full-time Rabbi. You will also note that the salary amount is considerably lower than before. We also plan to continue working with Cantor Bern-Vogel and Eric Beasley in their current roles.

The fact that we have a full-time Rabbi in the budget does NOT mean that we will find someone we like and hire them. It is there so we can pay someone to fill that role. Will we hire a Rabbi? Yes, when we find someone who meets our needs. Will that Rabbi be full-time? Yes, when we find someone who meets our needs. We have other options such as continuing what we are currently doing or looking at someone to fill the role on a part-time basis.

As a leadership team, we are not going to stand idly by and do nothing. We were elected to take action, to anticipate issues, or to correct problems that arise. We are not afraid of taking actions that we feel will benefit the Temple just because we have had some financial difficulties. To be a successful Temple requires a clergy leader who is invested in our community. Not having that leaves us vulnerable to others in the community to speak FOR us. This is currently happening.

A Rabbi's work is not just on the bema. They must also provide leadership and take positive, proactive actions to help us be successful. Those are not qualities that can always be seen from the bema. When we interview candidates we learn more about their 'other' qualities that are equally important to their work on the bema. We have stabilized the budget issues. We can afford a Rabbi, whether full-time or part-time.

You have had a chance to see two Rabbi's perform services for us, one in person and the other via Zoom. You will have another opportunity on May 5th at 6:30 p.m. to hear a 3rd candidate in person. Please add the date to your calendar and be in attendance to greet Rabbi Len Muroff.

Treasurer's Report



Our Congregation Annual Meeting is May 18th. Mark your calendar now and plan on being here, in person, to hear what has been happening in the congregation and what is coming up! It is important that our members are informed and have an opportunity to share their thoughts on THEIR congregation. We will be electing new officers, reviewing the 23-24 Budget, reporting on plans for the upcoming year, and much more. PLEASE, BE HERE. Come at 6:00 for the BBQ dinner provided and prepared by your Board of Directors.

The Proposed Budget for our Congregation was approved by the Board of Directors. The Approved Budget is included in the *Bulletin* in preparation for its formal presentation at the Congregational Annual Meeting. **(Please see the following page)**

The budget will be presented in more detail at the Annual Meeting. Remember that a budget is a guideline, it is our best *estimate* of what we anticipate to receive in income and what we expect our expenses to be. As always, we do our best to limit our expenses wherever possible, while trying to increase revenues.

Below are a few key points about the Approved Budget:

INCOME:

- **Dues Income** - One on one conversations with members regarding dues commitment.
- **High Holy Days** - Plan on charging for High Holy Day Services for non-members (this has not been done for many years).
- **Temple Building Use** - Promoting and leasing our facility for events by non members for a fee. Budgeted \$25,000, anticipating 5 events at \$5000 each.

- **Fundraisers** - Budgeted \$50,000 for one large fundraiser

EXPENSES:

- **Clerical Costs** - Have included salary costs for a possible full-time Rabbi (No contracts are pending and will not be negotiated without secure funding)
- **Accounting/Payroll** - Continue to retain the services of outside accounting and bookkeeping at \$12,000 per year.

Mental Health Awareness in Action

Every year the warmth of May brings us to Mental Health Awareness Month. The trees bring their green leaves to fullness, we put on sandals and shorts, the sun stays with us increasing hours every day. And around our temple we see people wearing little green ribbons and we put them on, too. All to reach out and spread the word about the reality of mental illness and our refusal to let stigma harm us.

In 1949 a group called Mental Health America started this annual teaching. And each year they have a new theme highlighting some aspect of mental health. This year it's "Look around, look within." The idea is that our surroundings affect our emotional and mental state, and we can make them healthier by noticing what is around us and how that affects us inside ourselves.

For example, it's clear that stable and safe housing is important to our well-being, as are also healthy home environments. Even our neighborhoods and towns can support our mental health, as well as the great (or small) outdoors and Mother Nature. So, this year's theme is urging us to look around us and to ask what could we change inside to make us feel better, healthier.

We might clean up a trashy vacant lot in the neighborhood. We might more consciously work for a peaceful and loving home life. We might focus on getting stable housing for someone who is struggling. And we might ditch the phones for a while and walk around among trees or local gardens, or in a forest, or on the beach. Any time we can spend in Nature is healing.

So, we hope you still have your little green ribbons to wear. We hope to see them around town and at temple. And let's spend May talking about it, about mental illness, and create a healthier, more supportive world for us all to live in.

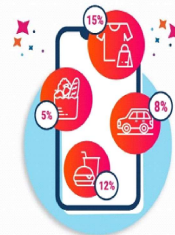
