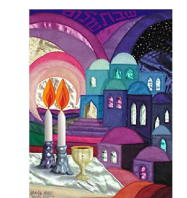

Cantorial Comments



[Excerpted from my Annual Report:] I am privileged and honored [and quite frankly, amazed] to be entering my fifteenth year with Congregation Emanu El after having served my previous congregation in Norfolk, Va for thirteen years before my family's move to California.

Beginning in 2009, with the final four months of services on E. Street in San Bernardino to the offices of 'Little Ford' just down the hill, we watched this building and beautiful sanctuary come to life. During these past fourteen years, I have bridged and participated in these many changes and transitions with six different rabbis and six presidents. Through all this time, I was blessed to have as friend, colleague and confidant, Jerry Ripley, of blessed memory, who sadly passed this year on January 11th after forty years of devoted service to Congregation Emanu El.

The last concert of this season in memory of Jerry on Sunday, June 4, is a Sephardic Concert that Jerry and I had been planning for two years. With this event, we are initiating **THE JERRY RIPLEY MEMORIAL - CONGREGATION EMANU EL CONCERT SERIES**, which will include a Cantor's Concert next spring.

It is a relief to be approaching the beginning of summer, and then things will only be winding down for a brief time! We will be starting **High Holy Day preparations** this month, and are fortunate to have **Dr. Lois Musmann** with us this year conducting the choir. She was a colleague, good friend and highly respected by Jerry as well.

A sample of some of the educational offerings in the coming year include a new **Conversion class**, an **Adult Hebrew class taught by a new Israeli member**, and a **6-part Comparative Siddur Class**, looking at the evolution of the Reform Prayer book [with a nod to the traditional Prayer book] over the past 75 years.

Please mark your calendars for **PRIDE SHABBAT** on June 23, with guest speaker, **Neil Spears**, The Inaugural Executive Director of the Jewish LGBTQ Donor Network. Currently residing in Los Angeles, Neil grew up at Congregation Emanu El and is the son of Heidi Nimmo and Jeff Spears.

We had a nice turnout for the Annual Meeting but many of you did not attend. The barbeque provided by the Board of Directors was well received. I will not do a recap of the entire meeting in this article; however, I invite you to contact me if you would like a copy of my President's report. One item of note is that the Board of Directors decided not to hire any of the three Rabbinic candidates we saw. We will continue looking for the 'right' Rabbi for our congregation. There is money in next year's budget for that position. The reason we did not recommend a hire was not a financial decision.

We are preparing for the new fiscal year. If you still owe on your current dues, please make sure you complete your payments by June 30. The 2023-24 dues letter will go out shortly. There will be no increase from last year, however, we encourage all of you to try to increase your dues obligation to help us to continue and improve our programming. We will finish this year on budget. We have written the new budget to be budget neutral as well. This is only possible if our dues projections are accurate.

Cantor Bern-Vogel will be on vacation for the entire month of July. Rabbi Emeritus Hillel Cohn has agreed to lead all Shabbat services in that month. We are currently looking for a High Holy Day Rabbi to join Cantor Bern-Vogel on the Bema. We are also looking for some Cantorial Soloists or other soloists to join us next year during our lay-led services.

Please join us for Shabbat services over the summer and also join us for other activities being planned. We would like to have one or two 'Shul by the Pool' services over the summer. If you have a pool and a large enough area to handle 40 or so congregants, please let the office know so we can plan and schedule. Hope you have a great summer!

The Proposed Budget for our Congregation was approved by the Board of Directors and presented at the Annual Meeting. Remember that a budget is a guideline, it is our best *estimate* of what we anticipate to receive in income and what we expect our expenses to be. As always, we do our best to limit our expenses wherever possible, while trying to increase revenues. The budget includes many revenue generating ideas, including renting out our building for non-member events, having a major fundraising event and asking our members to do their best to pay their fair share in dues. We did not implement an across-the-board dues increase, but ask each member to review their dues contribution, and, where possible increase their dues.

Dues letters for the Fiscal Year 23-24 will be going out soon. I encourage members to contact me if there are any concerns about their dues.

At the Annual Meeting, Paul Zipperstein presented two President Awards; one to Heidi Nimmo and the other to myself. Heidi has given countless hours of her time to her weekly Sacred Stories on Zoom. Her Sacred Stories began during the pandemic and has continued; offering our congregants a connection to our stories and time to connect with each other. Thank you, Heidi!

I was humbled and honored to be recognized for my volunteer work on behalf of our Congregation. The many hours of my volunteer time truly come from my heart. I grew up in this Congregation and will do whatever I can to see it grow and succeed.

We have many volunteers throughout our Congregation. Most noticeable is our Sisterhood; providing programs, oneg shabbats, fundraising to support our Congregation and so much more. I want to thank them for their support and their most generous donation of \$10,000, presented at the annual meeting.

Mental Health Awareness in Action

Pets

Who among us has not found our heart melting a little while watching a puppy play? OK, maybe puppies don't do it for you. Maybe kittens. But don't we all know something is going on in our feeling center when holding and petting a little fluffy creature?

But we're not so aware of what is going on in our brains and bodies. Scientists are studying that. The Human Animal Bond Research Institute in Washington, D.C. is one such group actively doing research and promoting pets in our homes. It's good for growing children, good for those with various problems, such as autism or mental health issues, and good for people as they age. In fact, the article that led us to focus on pets this month was in last month's Kiplinger's Retirement Report, an article called "Lonely? Depressed? Not Feeling Great? Maybe You Need a Puppy."

Many of us have been aware that over the years groups of therapy dog owners are called to disaster sites more frequently. And we may know that therapy dogs visit patients in hospitals and in facilities for ill, old, and people with dementia. The animals, whether they are trained or just good dogs, bring joy, relaxation, and provide all-important touch as the residents pet them.

You may not be surprised to hear that the scientists record reduced anxiety, less loneliness, increased sense of well-being, and more positive mental health among those who have developed bonds with their pets. You may not know about decreased blood pressure, the reduced arterial pressure and cardiorespiratory rates, or the increased oxytocin (that love hormone) in people who bond with their pets.

In sum, bonding with our pets, dogs or cats, birds, horses, or some other furry, is good for us. Our bodies and brains work better. We feel better. If we are children, they help us gain confidence, feel less lonely, develop compassion and self-control. If we are elders, they keep us active, help us feel less lonely, we live longer, and they provide frequent opportunities for touch, and touch is essential for all of us.

Only one of us has a pet (Heidi), but the other one (Nancy) is quite envious...And you? There are always dogs and cats looking for new homes.

60th Anniversary of Rabbi Cohn's Ordination



On June 8, 1963 Rabbi Hillel Cohn was ordained as a rabbi by the Hebrew Union College-Jewish Institute of Religion in Cincinnati, Ohio. He was one of 27 ordinees at the service held at the historic Isaac M. Wise Plum Street Temple in Cincinnati. The world-famous biblical archeologist and president of the Hebrew Union College, Dr. Nelson Glueck, ordained Rabbi Cohn. Following his ordination, Rabbi Cohn and his wife Rita made their way to San Bernardino where he began serving as the Assistant Rabbi of Congregation Emanu El with Rabbi Norman F. Feldheim. His duties included directing the religious school which at the time had 425 students. A year later, in 1964, Rabbi Cohn became co-rabbi with Rabbi

Feldheim and upon Rabbi Feldheim's retirement in 1971 Rabbi Cohn became the rabbi of our congregation and served in that capacity until his retirement in 2001 when he was named Rabbi Emeritus..

To mark the 60th anniversary of his rabbinic ordination, Rabbi Cohn will deliver the sermon at our Erev Shabbat Service on Friday, June 2, 2023. He will speak on "What The Years Have Taught Me". We look forward to celebrating this milestone.
