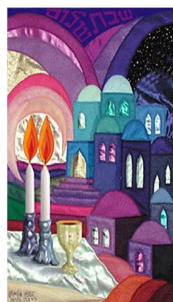

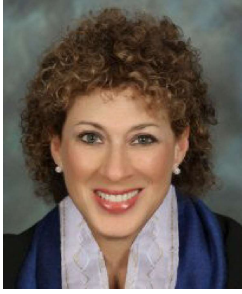

Z'man Simchateinu! A Time for Rejoicing



This has been another challenging year, beginning in January with the sudden and tragic passing of our dear friend, beloved Choir Director and Organist, Jerry Ripley. Jerry, who served Congregation Emanu El for 40 years as well as various churches in the Inland Empire, was a brilliant musician and a friend to many; we learned much from Jerry and in turn, he learned from his early Jewish teachers, Cantor Gregory Yaraslow z.l and Rabbi Hillel Cohn.

Four decades of experience are difficult shoes for anyone to fill. But I believe that no one would be more proud and pleased than Jerry himself, to have his highly respected and equally musical colleague and friend, Dr. Lois Musmann, lead the choir and accompany all of us with passion, commitment and joy through the High Holy Day season.



During the entire month of Elul preceding Rosh Hashanah, we were blessed to have Kerry Wolk blow the shofar prior to every Shabbat service. Last year, my colleague, Cantor Dan Pincus, conducted a zoom shofar training session from New York for Congregation Emanu El. Since then, Kerry's skills have grown by leaps and bounds.

As always, we are grateful to our long-time friend and exquisite cellist, Michele Tacchia, with her haunting and sublime Kol Nidre. In addition to our talented and dedicated choir members of many years, Sheri Maltzman, Barbara Smith, Lisa Wise-Wolk, Michele Zipperstein and George Petite, we were joined by seven members of Dr. Musmann's Musica Viva Choir: Kate Deen, Maurine Deen, Leigh Dudash, Antoinette Everts, Emily Harris, Nora Harris and Mark Miller. All seven of our Musica Viva choir members gave countless hours rehearsing with us for the High Holy Days simply out of their devotion to music and fellowship. Mental Health Awareness in Action

What inspires awe in you?

Our month of orange pumpkins is here, and soon leaves will be displaying yellows, reds, browns, and more oranges. We might say: But, of course, it happens every year, nothing special. Or we might stand in the autumn light and gaze in amazement at the spectacle. We are of the latter kind. We find late summer's leaves awe-inspiring.

And awe is good for us, as more and more researchers are finding. It has a special power to calm us, quiet us, humble us, to fill us with a sense of belonging to something greater and wiser than we are, to fill us with a sense of meaning for our lives. Feelings of depression and anxiety can also lessen as we slip out of our personal preoccupations, egos, and self-criticism.

What brings you to that high feeling of awe? We asked ourselves.

Heidi: I have become giddy drinking in an unexpected and glorious vista. I have stood transfixed peering into the intricate face of a random flower. I have given birth twice. I live with the gift of a transplanted kidney. I have been overwhelmed observing the day-by-day healing of a careless leg wound. Awareness of the awe ever around me brings joy and peace.

Nancy: Whenever I see the moon rise, watch magical clouds dancing in the sky, or hear leaves whispering in the afternoon breeze, whenever I catch a glimpse of a very young infant or hear gorgeous music, I fill with awe and feel grateful.

Many things evoke awe. People's courage and kindness. The birth of a baby. Exquisite art and music. Spiritual experiences. Dancing together. All the natural world, from the stars to the small creatures in the soil. And this is only the beginning of a list.

Dacher Keltner is a psychologist at UC Berkeley who has made happiness and other positive emotions his special study. In his new book, *Awe: The New Science of Everyday Wonder and How It Can Transform Your Life*, Dr. Keltner recommends taking an awe-walk – yes, right in our own neighborhoods. Experts agree that awareness of everyday awe can transform us inside by improving our mood and making us more open, kind and grateful.

An awe-walk improves the mental health of all of us. May the autumn leaves inspire!

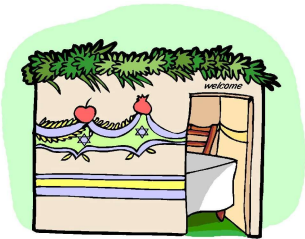
