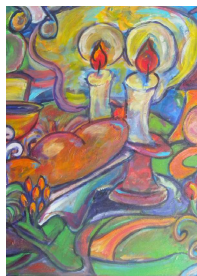

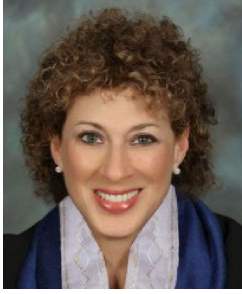

Mental Health Awareness in Action

Historical Trauma

One night on the PBS Newshour, toward the beginning of the Israel/Hamas war, Jonathan Capehart, an African American journalist (The Washington Post, MSNBC) said: "As an African American, I understand the ancestral pain and terror felt by my Jewish friends and Jews around the world." These words on paper cannot express the emotional depth of his voice as he spoke.

Yes. In our country we have this trauma in common with not only the descendants of enslaved people, but also with Native Americans who were slaughtered starting 500 years ago, evicted from their ancestral homelands, and suffered mass deaths by European diseases, and then active attempts to make them forget their cultures that had lasted 10,000 years and yet still survive. And among Jews, our trauma goes back thousands of years because of repeated attempts to expel and slaughter Jews in Europe and the Middle East.

But we don't talk much about such trauma, and the scientists are only beginning to inquire, mostly with survivors of the Shoah (Holocaust) and their children. And more recently also with African Americans, survivors of the Khmer Rouge killings in Cambodia, the Rwandan genocide, as well as among Native people now in societies dominated by European descendants. But already they are looking at what such trauma means, what effect it has on our lives, and even on our genetics.

With collective, historical trauma, the situation is compounded by on-going prejudice. It's not like trauma from one earthquake or personal attack. Coping mechanisms for survivors and for their descendants become part of a particular culture. So, the anxiety, depression, PTSD that anyone might feel after trauma is woven into unconscious strategies of coping. They include hyperarousal, compulsion to control and protect, defensiveness and suspicion, drugs and alcohol, denial, and more. It seems to us that many of these attempts are overlaying fear and a sense of helplessness. And how could we cope more successfully with all the emotions and fears? Talking together. Listening together. Making space and celebration for our

own particular cultures – Jewish, African American, Native American.

Just last month, California created a statewide phone number to anonymously report hate crimes that we might see or might be the victim of. As Assemblyman James Ramos said: "Our diversity has made California the Golden State. The introduction of the **CAvsHate Resource Line and Network** creates another tool to protect that great diversity and ensures the safety of all communities."

At this time of special danger for Jews and Muslims/Arabs, this could not be more timely.

Hanukkah Blessings

Candles are added to the *hanukkiyah* (menorah) from right to left but are kindled from left to right. The newest candle is lit first. On the Shabbat of Hanukkah, kindle the Hanukkah lights first and then the Shabbat candles.

Light the *shamash* (the helper candle) first, using it to kindle the rest of the Hanukkah lights. As you do, say or sing:

ברוך אתה יי אלהינו מלך העולם, אשר קדשנו במצותיו,
וצונו להדליק נר של חנוכה.

Baruch atah, Adonai Eloheinu, Melech haolam, asher kid'shanu b'mitzvotav v'tsivanu l'hadlik ner shel Hanukkah.

Blessed are You, Adonai our God, Sovereign of all, who hallows us with mitzvot, commanding us to kindle the Hanukkah lights.

ברוך אתה יי אלהינו מלך העולם, שעשה נסים לאבותינו
ואמותינו בימים ההם בזמן הזה.

Baruch atah, Adonai Eloheinu, Melech haolam, she-asah nisim laavoteinu v'imoteinu bayamim hahaeim baz'man hazeh.

Blessed are You, Adonai our God, Sovereign of all, who performed wondrous deeds for our ancestors in days of old at this season.

For first night only:

ברוך אתה יי אלהינו מלך העולם, שהחיינו וקיימנו
והגיענו לזמן הזה.

Baruch atah, Adonai Eloheinu, Melech haolam, shehecheyanu v'kiy'manu v'higiyanu laz'man hazeh.

Blessed are You, Adonai our God, Sovereign of all, who has kept us alive, sustained us, and brought us to this season.
