

Our celebration of Shabbat in Song came ‘early’ this year; normally the Torah portion ‘Beshalach’ falls in February. I am pleased to announce that we have another special music Shabbat this month on February 16th - Shabbat Terumah, from which our prayer book, **Mishkan Tefilah**, takes its name. **Shabbat services on February 9th will have a guest speaker, Rachel Shapira from SHARSHERET, speaking about Breast and Ovarian Cancer.**

I am looking forward to sharing the bima with my colleague and friend, **Cantor Jan Mahler**, from Chicago, Illinois. We have been Torah study partners since we met through the Institute of Jewish Spirituality in 2006. Cantor Jan Mahler is a Board Certified Chaplain, now retired. She previously served the community in Chicago, Illinois at Rush University Medical Center as the Jewish Chaplain for many years. Cantor Mahler received a Bachelor of Music degree from the University of Wisconsin and was ordained as a cantor from the Hebrew Union College-Jewish Institute of Religion (HUC-JIR) located in New York. In 2008 she received an Honorary Doctorate from HUC-JIR after having served the Jewish community and congregations in the Chicago area, New York, and Albuquerque for 40+ years. She is a member of the American Conference of Cantors (ACC), the Reform Cantors of Chicago (RCC), Midwest Jewish Chaplains, and the Association of Professional Chaplains (APC).

We are so proud of our young violinist, Aleah Lang, daughter of University of Redlands Professor Sharon Lang. Aleah writes: “I am fourteen years old and a freshman at Redlands East Valley High School and play violin with the Chamber Orchestra under Mr. Brian Holliet. Last year I played with Symphonie Jeunesse under Ms. Michele Tacchia. For years, I have been studying with Ms. Laura Evans, a third generation violinist who plays with the Pacific Symphony.”

Mental Health Awareness in Action

Rosalynn Carter Mental Health Advocate

Ninety-six years is a long time to live. And some humans have a dedication to helping others that lasts almost as long and hardly seems to diminish over the years. Rosalynn Carter was such a person. She died in her hometown of Plains, Georgia on November 19, 2023.

Her most enduring passion was helping those with mental illness and those who care for them. We don't know what inspired her skillful and effective effort to draw attention to the problem, while going against stigma, while prodding into existence thoughtful and kind government policy, while being personal and caring in all her relations, while insisting that help must be forthcoming. Some of the answers may lie in books she co-authored and some written about her.

But whatever it was, Mrs. Carter worked locally, nationally, and internationally, and in multiple various ways. She started in Georgia in 1971. When she went to the White House, she became honorary chair of the President's Commission on Mental Health, and soon a comprehensive Mental Health Systems Act passed (repealed by the Reagan administration). Back in Georgia she focused on her state and the nation as the Carter Center hosted and funded programs, fellowships, and annual symposia on mental health. She even thought of promoting mental health issues in the media with the Rosalynn Carter Fellowships for Mental Health Journalism starting in 1996. She won national and World Health Organization awards. She wrote books, especially about caregiving. She thought about every aspect of the difficulties of mental illness for those living with it and for their family and friends. Here's a short list of her symposium topics:

- Mental illness and the elderly
- Child and adolescent mental illnesses
- Family coping
- Financing mental health services and research
- Treating mental illness in the primary care setting
- Dealing with stigma

She insisted that we all think carefully and thoroughly about our mental well-being. As individuals and as a society. And never get tired, never grow indifferent, never stop supporting and loving each other.

She went about her business decade after decade. We fear we didn't pay enough attention, didn't appreciate her enough. And we cannot know how much the general decrease in stigma over recent decades had her mark on it. Certainly, she was a major figure in our collective movement away from shame and denial toward acceptance and solutions.

And there is so much more to be done. Even after she is gone, her example is calling on us to do all we can to speak up for ourselves, to care for others, to create an intelligent, kind world. It's 2024. Let's get to it.






A Message from Rabbi Hillel Cohn

In 2022 the book “A God We Can Believe In” (edited by Rabbi Richard Agler and Rabbi Rifat Sonsino) was published. I had been invited to contribute a chapter to that book. The chapter that I wrote, entitled “Reverent Agnosticism: What to Believe and What Not to Believe About God”, is included in the book and I am especially delighted that the book has received many fine reviews and is being widely used around the country by adult education groups.

As a result of the widespread interest in the book, a group of rabbis began to meet a few months ago to begin the process of creating a prayerbook (Siddur) that will reflect a “naturalist” perspective. I have been part of that group since its inception and find the project to be extremely meaningful. As part of the process I have created a complete prayerbook for Erev Shabbat that I have been sharing with my colleagues.

A rather simple explanation of the difference between “naturalism” and “supernaturalism” is:

“A naturalist is someone who believes that everything in the world can be explained by natural causes and laws... Naturalists believe in the scientific method as the best way to understand the world around us. They rely on empirical evidence and observable facts to support their beliefs.”

“A supernaturalist is someone who believes that there are forces or entities that exist beyond the natural world. They believe that supernatural explanations are necessary to understand certain events or phenomena that cannot be explained by natural causes or laws. Supernaturalists often rely on religious or spiritual beliefs to explain the world around them. They may believe in gods, angels, demons, or other supernatural beings. They may also believe in miracles or other events that cannot be explained by science.”

Traditional Jewish prayer or liturgy as well as contemporary liberal Jewish prayer or liturgy has been and continues to be primarily “supernaturalist.”

The prayer book that I have created (experimental, to be sure) maintains the traditional structure but supplements the traditional prayers with reflections that are “naturalist.”

On Friday evening, February 23rd we will use the prayerbook that I have been creating. It is definitely “a work in progress.” Rather than a sermon, there will be an open discussion. I look forward to hearing your responses to this “naturalist Siddur.” Your perspectives will be helpful to me as I continue to work on this project and, more importantly, hopefully, provide you with an alternative to the traditional Siddur that you will find meaningful.
