For, lo, the winter is past; The rain is over and gone;

Song of Songs, 2:11

These words from Song of Songs could hardly ring truer this year! Not only has Spring finally arrived in Southern California, but we are hopefully past the deluge of torrential rains that pummeled the countryside, rivers and cities over the past couple of months. This month, we will be celebrating the beautiful Spring

festival of Pesach; our Amidah prayer reflects the season in that, instead of praying for rain, we now add *'morid ha-Tal*', the prayer for dew!

We will be devoting this month to the retelling and re-enactment of the story from the **Haggadah** of our Exodus from Egypt. It is a time of renewal and celebration, but we will also be looking closely at how it impacts us in our lives and the world today.

At our Seder tables with families, friends, and community, we chant the Four Questions every year that begin: *Ma Nishtana haLaila haZeh?* What is different about this Night? Our SJL students will help us with singing these age-old questions. We will also quiz them with other questions about Passover and the Seder! Start gathering your questions today!

In addition to our community Seder on Tuesday, April 23rd, we will be honoring couples who are celebrating their **quinquennial wedding vows** [5, 10, 15, 20 ... - 65!] at Shabbat Passover services on Friday, April 26th. The Song of Songs obviously has an important place in the service! Your presence as witnesses is a mitzvah and helps to make the occasion even more sacred.

Four times of the year, we have the opportunity to offer prayers of remembrance - at YIZKOR - for our loved ones: of course at Yom Kippur but also at the conclusion of our three Festivals; Passover, Shavuot and Sukkot. I invite you to join me at 10 a.m. Tuesday morning, April 30th on our regular website zoom channel for a Festival morning service and Yizkor.

Treasurer's Report



Welcome to April! This month is filled with lots of activity around the synagogue as we prepare to celebrate Passover.

April is also the time we prepare the proposed budget for our Congregation. The proposed budget is published in

our *Bulletin* in preparation for its formal presentation at the Congregational Annual Meeting in May. (Please see the following page)

The budget committee, along with input from our Board of Directors, have crunched the numbers while looking at previous years income and expenses to prepare a budget for Fiscal Year 24-25.

Remember that a budget is a guideline, it is our best *estimate* of what we anticipate to receive in income and what we expect our expenses to be. As always, we do our best to limit our expenses wherever possible, while trying to increase revenues.

Below are a few key points about the Proposed Budget:

INCOME:

- **Dues Income** We were successful in realizing the budgeted dues income for 23-24. We are projecting the same for 24-25.
- **High Holy Days** We will continue to charge for non-members atteding High Holy Day Services.

EXPENSES:

- Clergy Costs Total Clergy Costs include Cantor's contract and expense for a High Holy Day Rabbi.
- Accounting/Payroll Continue to retain the services of outside accounting and bookkeeping at \$12,000 per year.
- Security Our security costs have increased due to the need for additional security at all events.
- Utilities and Insurance Anticipate increases in our liability insurance and our utilities.

A full budget presentation will be made at our Annual Meeting on May 16th at 7:00 p.m. I look forward to seeing you there!

Mental Health Awareness in Action Loneliness, We Have to Pay Attention! Suddenly everyone's sitting up straight with attentive ears, as if no one had heard of loneliness before. All around the world public health

professionals are getting ready to take action. Over the decades it has dawned more clearly on medical workers that thoughts, feelings, and social situations are completely entwined with physical health. And now the World Health Organization is ringing the alarm bells about loneliness. It's growing everywhere in the world, among people of all ages and genders, and it is contributing to many serious physical ailments like cardiovascular disease, stroke, dementia, as well as depression, anxiety, suicide. The **WHO** has created a world **Commission on Social Connection** for 2024 to 2026 to get people and governments mobilized to place loneliness as the "global public health priority" that it needs to be.

Of course, our own US Surgeon General, Dr. Vivek Murthy has been out front on this call, and he is now the Co-Chair of the WHO Commission along with Chido Mpemba of Zimbabwe. She is an African Union Youth Commissioner with experience in many diverse fields. Other Commissioners are from Sweden, Japan, Pakistan, Kenya, Vanuatu, Chile, and Morocco. It's Global.

Dr. Murthy came out with his own Advisory on **Our Epidemic of Loneliness and Isolation** in May 2023. He called for 6 actions:

- 1. Strengthen Social Infrastructure encourage more gathering places like parks and libraries, and special programs
- 2. Pro-Connection Public Policies for example, encouraging public transportation and paid family leave
- 3. Mobilize Health Sector get health professionals to watch for loneliness in their clients and encourage intervention to promote connection
- 4. Reform Digital Environments build awareness of ourselves and others if tech becomes a barrier to "meaningful" connection with others
- 5. Deepen Our Knowledge more research into causes and consequences of social disconnection, into vulnerable populations, and into successful interventions
- 6. Cultivate a Culture of Connection examine our society and its practices and attitudes to discover

what helps and what hinders connection – then promote what helps

We will all find out what the WHO comes up with in their Commission report in 2026. But why wait? We are learning about the urgency of this problem of loneliness, and we know what eases it. Connect, not superficially but meaningfully. Make the effort.

Dr. Murthy says this about loneliness: "It's a feeling the body sends us when something we need for survival is missing." For our survival. Our life, our health, our well-being. Let's connect, face to face.
