### TEACH US TO USE ALL OF OUR DAYS, THAT WE MAY ATTAIN A HEART of WISDOM Psalm 90:12

And poof - just like that, it's 2025! In our Jewish tradition, the High Holy Day season marks the spiritual ending and beginning of our new year but we also live by the secular calendar.

In my 30 years of clergy and pastoral/chaplaincy, I have frequently observed the seasonal changes as a common transition in people's lives, a time of letting go at the

end of life or following an illness, despite their age. Each new year has the opportunity for a fresh start but is also a reminder of the passing of time and how important it is to make our days count. The more we learn and prepare for death, the more we can live our lives with purpose, without fear.

Beginning Sunday, January 12th, at 10:30 a.m. we will be launching our **Adult Ed END OF LIFE SERIES - Where there's Will....there's a Way.** 

<u>The January session</u> will be led by Elder and Estate Lawyer, **Esther Wong**, who will also discuss affordable Wills and Trusts.

<u>In February</u>, Past President and Cemetery Chair, **Paul Zipperstein**, will discuss and answer any and all questions related to cemetery planning and arrangements.

<u>In March</u>, we will have the long-awaited and promised *Death Cafe* which I will be co-leading with **Nancy Sidhu.** At a Death Cafe people drink tea, eat cake and discuss death, with the aim of increasing awareness of death without any objectives, themes or agenda.

Mental Health Awareness in Action Dorot ("Generations" in Hebrew)

The idea is rather simple and not revolutionary – young people helping their elders. Yet what Dorot has done with it left us dizzy with their offerings and scope of work.

It all started in 1976 when some graduates of Columbia University's social work program wanted to help older adults in New York City. This was before most of the studies had been done on how damaging social isolation is for people. But they began visiting seniors in New York City's Upper West Side. As the name implies – Dorot means "Generations" in Hebrew - it was a Jewish thing. Those personal visits were the center of its power - we all need personal embodied connection. But Dorot grew in scope – creating small community gatherings often with an educational element to them or healthy activity. It also hired a professional staff, and by our times, it was helping thousands of Jews and non-Jews, and had thousands of volunteers.

As we well remember, things had to alter as COVID landed in our 2020's. More of Dorot's offerings were on Zoom and by phone. They also expanded their reach to involve the larger New York City area and even into Westchester County, and then even to Washington, D.C., and beyond to Canada, England, and Israel. They began working more closely with other groups like the Interagency Council on Aging, Generations United, and Coalition to End Social Isolation.

Since 1976, "social isolation" has been mentioned and studied and it's not something only single seniors are troubled by. We see terrible loneliness even in young people now. So, it occurs to us that Dorot is living up to its name – it is helping all the generations. Not only do old people need those personal friendships regular visits can offer, but screen dominated young people also need face to face, caring,

compassionate, regular time with others. We'd bet the first volunteers never thought of that.

Nor would they have imagined that in December 2024, they would be offering nearly a dozen different programs on a given day, some in person, most on Zoom. Let's take Dec. 9, for example — chair yoga, French conversation, Chasidic Williamsburg, Qigong, chess, issues in the news, brain games, mindfulness, story circles, and the poetry of song lyrics. (Nancy is particularly sorry to have missed this last one on Zoom). And that's just one day in the month!

Not very long ago, our Surgeon General Dr. Vivek Murthy and the World Health Organization urged all of us to create activities to bring us together to help lessen loneliness, to allow more joy and satisfaction into our lives. Dorot is one magnificent example of how to do it. But we know there are Chatty Benches, community centers, all kinds of programs. And this is something we can all participate in. Let's get out, be local, and mingle together. That's how we're meant to be – together.



Bishop Dr. Jackie L. Green is a native of Oklahoma City, Oklahoma. She is a reformer and the Founder/Presiding Prelate of JGM International Prayer Life Institute and RDU-West Coast, and Founder of Watchdogs in the Kingdom National Prayer Conferences. She serves as the new Lead Pastor of The Village at SBC in the City of Redlands, historically the first woman licensed, ordained, consecrated to the Bishopric and first female Lead Pastor after 33 male pastors in a 132 year old church. She is called to raise up a 24 hour prayer army and a righteous remnant against systemic racism in the region. She continues to oversee over 30 ministries in the US and Africa under the NTCCM- New Testament Council of Churches and Ministries.

Dr. Green's serves in Redlands as Chairperson for Unity in the Community and has been instrumental in overseeing eight Juneteenth citywide events and ten Dr. MLK Youth Camps

for ages K-12 sponsored by The Village SBC in Redlands. Her vision is to open a Redlands Racial Harmony Youth Center to bring healing in Redlands city and the region of racial division.

Dr. Green received her B.A. Degree from the State University of New York, her Master of Arts Degree from Fuller Theological Seminary of Pasadena, and her Doctor of Practical Ministry Degree from Wagner Leadership Institute of Colorado Springs, CO. She was accepted at Regents University, Virginia Beach, Virginia, working toward her Ph.D. in Christian Curriculum design.

## Our Rabbi Emeritus Hillel Cohn in the Community

November-December 2024

Continuing the long and notable tradition of the leaders of our congregation promoting positive interfaith relationships, supporting worthy community endeavors, and being prominent regionally and nationally, in addition to serving the needs of our own members, our Rabbi Emeritus Hillel Cohn has been in involved in numerous activities over the last two months (November-December 2024), bringing honor and recognition to to Congregation Emanu El. Among them are:

- Attended and participated in the Installation of Rabbi Guershon Kwasniewski as the rabbi of or neighboring congregation, Temple Beth-El in Riverside.
- Taught two classes of high school seniors on "Basic Judaism" at Redlands Adventist Academy.
- Attended the dedication of a Chalice furnishing for the Chapel of the Jerry Pettis Veterans Administration Hospital in Loma Linda. The Chalice art work was presented by the local Unitarian-Universalist church.
- Attended and participated in the Shabbat Morning Service of Temple Emanuel in Beverly Hills at which Dr. Bernie Goler observed his second Bar Mitzvah on the occasion of his 83rd birthday. Dr. Goler is a past-president of our congregation (1988-1990) and was a recipient of the Rabbi Norman F. Feldheym Award (1994).
- As a regular participant in the Priest-Rabbi Dialogue, a monthly meeting of the Archdiocese of Los Angeles and the Board of Rabbis of Southern California, Rabbi Cohn presented Jewish Views on Alcoholism and Drug Addiction.
- Rabbi Cohn is part of a group of rabbis from around the country who are working on the creation of a new prayer book incorporating a "naturalist" theology. He meets with this group regularly.
- Attended meetings of the Development Committee of Planned Parenthood of Orange and San Bernardino Counties as well as the Board of Directors of PPOSBC of which he is a member.
- Part of the "trialogue" panel on "A Menu for Thanksliving" at the Interfaith Thanksgiving Service of the Redlands Area Interfaith hosted by Congregation Emanu El.
- Was interviewed by Professor Cornelia Wilhelm of Munich, Germany as part of her new research on "The Last Generation of the German Rabbinate German Refugee Rabbis in the United States, 1933-2010".
- Attended meeting of the Diocesan Health Care Committee of the Catholic Diocese of San Bernardino-Riverside,
- Attended event honoring Dr. Mustafa Kuko on the occasion of his 50 years of service as an Imam of the Islamic commity of the Inland Empire.
- Delivered invocation at the meeting of the City Council of the City of Beaumont.
