8:15 And Mordecai went out from the presence of the king in royal apparel of blue and white, and with a great crown of gold, and with a garment of fine linen and purple: and the city of Shushan rejoiced and was glad.

9:21 To establish this among them, that they should keep the fourteenth day of the month Adar, and the fifteenth day of the same, yearly.

9:22 from sorrow to joy, and from mourning into a good day: that they should make them days of feasting and joy, and of sending portions one to another, and gifts to the poor.

Mental Health Awareness in Action

If we were to visit some jails in Japan, looking carefully, we might notice an unexpected number of elderly people, especially women. Japan is noted for being an orderly and non-violent society. How is it possible for so many old women to be in jail?

Recently CNN did a report on this strange reality. Japan is also known for its aging population. We in the U.S. experience that too, when people grow older and older but fewer children are born than in past times. We are relatively okay because of immigration that mostly brings in young people. But Japan has never been a very welcoming country, and their aging population is growing rapidly as a percentage of the total.

Most of the Japanese elder women commit crimes of stealing, some do drugs. Often the women steal from necessity – poverty in this wealthy country is relatively high in this group. They need food and medical care they can't afford. They even need warm places to live. But sometimes, too often, they steal hoping to get arrested and incarcerated because they are isolated and lonely. They are abandoned by their families, without support, love, or friendship. The guards who care for them in jail and the other inmates provide needed human interaction and help. And that also means prison guards have to do things they have never been trained to do – bathe prisoners, feed them, help them walk, even change their diapers.

Some years ago, the Japanese government recognized the society-wide problem of loneliness and created a Ministry of Loneliness. But clearly more is needed. There needs to be support out in society so that old women don't fill the women's prisons. The Ministry of Justice and other parts of government are beginning to address the lack. Japan needs not only funding for affordable apartments, food and medical care, and for organizations that help. It also it needs to encourage people from outside Japan to come and be care workers.

Here we have a difficult situation that arises from real practical needs and also from the mental and emotional suffering of isolation. It causes shame, a powerful negative in Japanese culture, and its solution, though not easy or cheap to remedy, is quite clear. Support and care, people to people. We all need that.

Gevurah: The philosophy or teaching which includes our inner and outer strength, our spiritual courage, and our willingness to take risks knowing there will be consequences.

Gevurah is our focus for March. Our students will learn that gevurah goes beyond physical strength and acts of bravery, because it incorporates the idea that we all can be heroic in our everyday lives by doing what is right and just. Purim is an example of sticking their neck out for others, withstanding peer pressure, and taking a leadership role when needed. In February the students decorated family Tzedakah boxes to harvest coins to donate to the Pasadena congregation, so they can replant trees. They practiced Tefilah and did an excellent job with it at the Tu B'Shevat Seder. Please "save the date" of Friday, March 14th and celebrate Purim with us. Our congregational spiel is based on the Wizard of Oz this year. Throughout March, students will compare the bravery of different characters in literature and discuss what can be learned from them. We will celebrate the joy of Purim and the bravery of Queen Esther (after all she did save the fate of our people). And, just like Esther, increasing Jewish pride "is a proven antidote to the destructive power of hate" (B. Freeman 2024) and will help our children feel secure in themselves.
