

Mental Health Awareness in Action

Youth Documentary Academy

If a dear young friend of yours had killed himself, and you wanted to memorialize him to show the world how special he was, how loveable he was, how would you do that?

Recently, KVCR-TV showed two short films that teen-age girls created to honor their friends, both boys who died by suicide. The girls were helped in their creations by something called the Youth Documentary Academy that brings professional filmmakers to work with budding filmmakers.

One, Kalia Hunter, was honoring her friend, Dom. She saw him as a creative, energetic, loving natural leader who had many devoted friends, but who suffered terribly when his mother suddenly died and his father was away in Afghanistan in the U.S. military. Dom changed radically and before very long, he took his own life.

Another, Kallista Palapas, lost her friend, Ricky when he was 16 years old. He always appeared to be happy. He was social and generous, but no one could see inside his heart. He had sought therapy years ago, but none of his friends knew his inner sufferings. Until one day he shot himself and died. Kallista saw Ricky's refusal to show his heart to even his best friends as the central reason he ended his life. If only.....

If only we all could be more open with our difficulties.... If only we could admit we need support and help....If only we could admit we need a good friend to confide in....Wouldn't we all be better off, more comfortable with the world and with ourselves?

Over and over we have said "Talk about it," whatever the "it" is – anxiety, depression, emotional pain, thoughts about suicide. Could Ricky be looking down from wherever he has gone and wondering how things might have been different if he had talked to Kallista about his despair? She had her ears open and ready. He had a life ahead of him. Kallista's film, "I'll Be There," begs us all to be there for each other and to talk about our inner hearts.

A new year is here. Let's make it one where we talk about it and where we listen with our open hearts. When two hearts join in mutual acceptance and trust, the world and life start glowing.



Rabbi Michael Lotker is a second career rabbi having been ordained at age 55 from the Hebrew Union College-Jewish Institute of Religion in 2003. He is a physicist who spent his first career in Alternative Energy focusing on wind, solar and geothermal energy and is widely published in the alternative energy field. Rabbi Lotker started a number of alternative energy firms including a wind power development company that installed and operated wind farms in Hawaii and California. He is presently Rabbi Emeritus at Temple Ner Ami in Camarillo, California and the Community Rabbi for the Jewish Federation of Ventura County. He is the author of "A Christian's Guide to Judaism" which has become a classic work in the field of interfaith dialogue. He is a participant in numerous Jewish-Christian dialogues and is a member of the Priest-Rabbi Dialogue, a project of the Board of Rabbis of Southern California and the Roman Catholic Archdiocese of Los Angeles.

The Rabbi Norman F. Feldheym Memorial Lecture was established in 1985 at the time of his death by members of Congregation Emanu El as well as many friends in the wider community. Rabbi Feldheym served as rabbi of Congregation Emanu El in San Bernardino from 1937 to 1971 and as Rabbi Emeritus from 1971 until his death.
