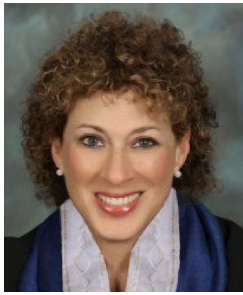

Rabbi Cantor's Comments

Annual Report



[For those of you who may be newer to this community, a quick overview: I've been with Congregation Emanu El since 2009, in the final months at E Street in San Bernardino. Together, we weathered that transition and then the transition from the temporary space at Little Ford to the dedication of our beautiful sanctuary in this building with a wonderful concert of my cantorial colleagues, including Cantor Gregory Yaraslow, z.l., in January 2013.]

Since 2009, I have served as Cantor with Rabbis Kohn, Cohn, Sherwood, Reznick, Crystal, and High Holy Day Rabbis Ofseyer, Birnham, Salkin, this year adding Rabbi Michael Lotkin to the list. Since Rabbi Reznick's departure in 2022, I have served as *kol bo*, meaning [covering everything], the main spiritual leader, and, officially, as Rabbi Cantor since 2025.

The current world stage presents difficult times for our congregations; as so many Jewish Americans who have a long connection and love for Israel, our identity, values and morals have been especially challenged. In this, my eighteenth year with Emanu El, I feel an even greater pride and responsibility to serve with all of you who are dedicated to keeping the light of our heritage and teachings burning even more brightly into the future.

And how are we doing that? I am proud of our vibrant and actively growing school under the loving guidance of **SJL Director Ilene Mino, assisted by wonderful teachers, Karyn Lehmann and Shaina Martinez.** I am grateful to work with our temple administrator, **Judy Filsinger, and extraordinary volunteers Julie Strain, Dr. Bradley Hyman, Kathy Trainor, and Niki Pancer,** who help keep everything functioning in the background so that the Temple can shine in the foreground! Not to mention, the diligent caretaking that beautifies our grounds by **Robert O'Rourke.**

My gratitude as well to **Ilene Mino,** who also chairs the Sisterhood and its dedicated members who help with the Seder and other holiday dinners and countless events throughout the year. **Lisa Wise-Wolk** maintains the Judaica shop with creativity and flair. Our security chair, **Seth Poulin, Kenny White, and now, Ellie Vogel,** under their tutelage, are helping to keep us safe and informed. I'm grateful to **Greg Weismann** for his devotion, integrity, and presence throughout the year, as well as **Julie Strain,** for her patience and diligence in navigating some tricky financial waters at times this year. Our tech wiz, **Myong Kurily,** is always on target with her articulate and sensitive reporting, and has truly put us on the cyber map. Did you know that our incoming President, **Scott Wilkie,** also has thespian roots and performed a great Haman this year? An earlier presidential predecessor, **Paul Z** seems to be type-cast as Mordechai so their contracts have already been signed!

We just concluded the season with two beautiful concerts co-sponsored by Spinet Organization featuring Symphony Jeunesse under Michele and Michael Tacchia and our own Abe Fabella at a Seniors for Seniors luncheon.

I continue to teach a bi-monthly **Introduction to Judaism** class for those interested in furthering their Jewish education, as well as prospective individuals planning to convert; I also started a **Mussar** class this season. The day after Yom Kippur, last year, I spoke on "Leadership in Changing and Shifting Times" for the clergy recognition lunch at Redlands Community Hospital. Our Congregation Emanu El speakers this year have included **Julie Kohner, Rabbis Doug Kohn and Michael Lotker, who was our Feldheim scholar;** in honor of Pride Month, we hosted the **Together4Redlands panel following the One Act play, Mother/Son, with actor/playwright, Jeffrey Solomon.**

Together with my husband, **Ira, and Captain Debra Duncan,** we facilitated the acquisition of a **Holocaust Torah scroll,** which we will officially dedicate in a large community ceremony this coming November, the weekend of Kristallnacht. **Seth Poulin** was a great help [and his Dad, too!] in hoisting the display case off the truck into the building. We are hoping that Jeffrey Ohrenstein of the **Memorial Scroll Trust** from London will be present at the dedication in November.

I officiate 3-4 Shabbat services each month, two monthly Shabbat morning services, lead Torah study, three Festival **Yizkor** services, the **Community Seder,** organized our first **Interfaith MLK Shabbat** with five different churches, provided an **LDS Church Torah Tour, Choir Shabbat Shirah, Hanukkah "Light up the Night,"** organized our **Purimspiel celebration, Reading of the Names for Yom Hashoah,** prepared two students, also officiating at their **Bat mitzvah** ceremonies this year and **edited the B'nai Mitzvah Handbook.**

I regularly coordinate our service accompanists who have included **Michael Tacchia** and **Ken Corona** in addition to our now regular pianist, **Abe Fabella.** Our High Holy Day choir rehearsal schedules begin in July, and I am already having planning meetings with Rabbi Michael Lotker for High Holy Day services.

And finally, after many, many months of negotiation, travel, correspondence, discussions, and revisions with artist, **Rhonda Kap,** together with our tireless **Margie Orland,** and the generosity and support of many of our members, we rejoice in the creation of our new **Ner Tamid** in honor of **Paul and Michele Zipperstein;** a metal construction of dancing flames reaching heavenward that cast dramatic shadows above the ark that we pray will be an **eternal light** of hope and inspiration for generations to come.

While I am usually on vacation in July, this year, with the early start of the High Holy Days, I will be away in June and back in full force in July! Thank you to our **Emeritus, Rabbi Hillel Cohn,** for filling in during my absence. Looking forward to seeing you in July and in the meantime, wishing you a safe and pleasant start to summer!

Chief Financial Officer's Annual Report



The approved budget was published in the April and May Bulletins. The approved budget was created using information from this year's income and expenses and what we realistically anticipate to receive and spend next year. Unfortunately, it is a very unbalanced budget.

I'll highlight a few significant areas of the budget:

Income:

- We have not implemented an across-the-board dues increase as in years past; in the hope that all members will review their current dues pledge and will increase their contribution at a financially critical time for this congregation.

- We will continue fees for **non-members** wishing to attend High Holy Days; and for various lifecycle events.

Expenses:

We expect our expenses to be slightly higher than this past year, as our synagogue faces the same increases that are impacting everyone at this time.

As of April 30th, we have received income just under \$270,000. Our income includes, all dues, donations and school tuition. For the same time period, our expenses were a little over \$400,000.

I will highlight what impacted our Income and Expenses this year:

On the Expense side:

- We have worked hard to keep our building, utilities and maintenance expenses low, wherever and whenever possible. We are changing our copier contract and HVAC contracts to lower costs.
- Our major expenses are Clergy, Utilities and Building Operations. We have had some major repairs this past year, including parking repaving; HVAC and plumbing repairs.
- Recent solar panel installation will help to reduce our electrical costs.
- We continue to monitor and reduce our expenses wherever possible.

On the Income side:

- We had very generous member donations.
- Our SJL enrollment increased which raised our tuition income.

At this point, you may asking, "so how have we been paying our bills"?

As announced previously, the Congregation was the beneficiary of funds from the Stanley Roshwald estate. Roshwald funds have been funding our cash flow shortfall. In addition to providing funds to meet our cash flow needs throughout the year, The Roshwald funds paid off our mortgage and will be supporting several major capital improvement projects for our synagogue. Those include the much-needed re-upholstering of the sanctuary chairs, installation of the rooftop solar to help reduce our utility costs, and the construction of a playground for our SJL students. We are extremely grateful that those funds have been available, but they will not last forever. To be very blunt, if it wasn't for the Roshwald funds, we would have had to close our doors.

We **HAVE** to increase our income. The Board continues to explore ways we can increase revenue; that includes increasing the number of members from our current 100 families. We have been fortunate to gain new young families this year; which has also increased our SJL enrollment! We will continue to look for fundraising opportunities that focus on the greater community.

Our fiscal stability will still rely heavily on our member support. This is your synagogue; we need you to support and participate in our programs, activities and services. We need you to help us grow and thrive. Every member is a stakeholder in our success; we need you now more than ever.

I look forward to Congregation Emanu El's future; and will continue to do my best to increase our fiscal stability.

From Our School for Jewish Living

This year, School for Jewish Living's central theme was **Tikkun Olam** and the importance of *hakarot hatov* (recognizing the good) in our surroundings. In a world that often moves too quickly, it can be increasingly challenging for people, especially our children, to pause and appreciate all that they have. Our children are truly fortunate to be surrounded by loving families, caring friends, and a supportive community. Yet as their lives grow busier, the opportunity for reflection becomes scarcer. The message from Psalm 118 serves as a reminder to give thanks to God for the blessings we receive. During this year, our students made a conscious effort to acknowledge the people and places that have supported them. They reflected on ways to give back, not only to their families and friends, but also in their communities. Their journey began with simple brainstorming about how they could make a positive impact. From ideas to action, they collaborated on meaningful projects. For example, they supported their Bat Mitzvah classmate Emerson in her book drive, which collected over 1,700 books and \$250 in gift cards. Their efforts reached two Title IX schools, Redlands Family Services, Micah House, and five teachers in low-income schools. Emerson's Book Drive made it possible for every student at one school's literacy picnic to receive a book for summer reading. While the students gave away many tangible items, our greatest hope is that they gained a deeper "awareness" of the world around them. We encourage them to continue considering the essential question: *How do I appreciate all that I have and how does that inspire me to do good in the world?*

In SJL, we strive to inspire our students to recognize the good in their lives and to make a difference wherever possible. The principle that **ALL** of Israel is responsible for one another is closely linked to social justice and our Jewish obligation to address the moral shortcomings we see in the world. Appreciating that the good we have is a gift from others and from God enables us to identify and value the good we can contribute to the world.

Our first year of a full K'tainim class was roaring fun. The Lion's Den had a truly wonderful school year. They were so fortunate to explore our Judaism and traditions through play, music, art, and hands-on discovery. As the year comes to a close, we are filled with "lion pride" as two of our lion cubs prepare to move into Miss Ilene's class, carrying with them a strong and joyful foundation for their continued Jewish education. Ms. Shaina would like to extend a heartfelt thank you to the incredible Abbas and Imas who have supported our classroom throughout the year. We would also like to express our gratitude to the amazing Ms. Karen for all she does to make our classroom such a special place. Shalom, chaverim!

As this year's journey at our School for Jewish Learning comes to a close, we hope our students carry this newfound awareness with them like an internal compass. May they never stop looking for the 'hundred blessings' that surround them each day and continue to find the strength to be a blessing to others. By recognizing the good (*hakarot hatov*), they hold the power to repair the world (*tikkun olam*)—one book, one project, and one act of kindness at a time.
